Wayne Wallingford)The Honorable Mike Stephens, ChairmanAs President of the Missouri Dental Hygienists' Association representing over 3300 dental hygienists in our state, I want to express our strong support for water fluoridation by citing our fluoridation policy: "MDHA supports community water fluoridation as a safe and effective method for reducing the incidence of dental caries throughout the human lifespan." Thus, we speak in favor of HB 819. Fluoride in our drinking water has been one of the most effective ways to prevent tooth decay in both adults and children. Just by drinking fluoridated water, tooth decay is decreased by at least 25% over a person's lifetime. We are very fortunate in our state to have 76.46% of our population on community water systems, over 4.03 million residents, benefitting from community water fluoridation at a very low cost to consumers. This includes approximately 171 Missouri water systems that adjust their fluoride levels to ensure that the water is optimally fluoridated. http://health.mo.gov/living/families/oralhealth/pdf/fluoridationmap.pdfln addition, neither a person's age, income level, race, ethnicity, nor his/her ability to receive routine dental care is a barrier to receiving its health benefits. (2019 data-DHSS)Recently several local community leaders in Missouri have put the public's oral health at risk by threatening to remove fluoride from local community water supplies, which may, in fact, harm the community's oral and general health. MDHA supports having entities that are debating the addition or reduction of fluoride in their drinking water. have accurate, evidence-based, scientific information to guide their decisions around fluoridating public water systems. HB819 would guarantee that local decision-makers have this evidence-based, scientific
