As of right now, I have put the belief that my academic future and future career is more important than my current safety, and I believe that is not a decision anyone should have to make, especially in a free society such as ours.

I am bereft at the continued slaughter of children and adults in our city. You all have imposed so few restrictions on guns, our city is awash in them. And now you want to force us to accept more. Why would you want to do this to us? For those of you on this committee who are Christian, I have to ask, is this what Jesus wants you to do? I just can't believe it is. I have a feeling He thinks there are a lot better things you can be doing with the gifts He has given you and you could accomplish so much more. I oppose this bill in the strongest possible terms.

Due to the COVIDpandemic, there are not many events right now, however, it hosts events such as sports events ormusic performances where people would gather. UCM also hosts large educational events forelementary and secondary school students all over Missouri, and sometimes, Kansas, Iowa, orNebraska.My husband has been teaching at UCM for over 30 years. Two of our five children graduated from UCM 2 years ago and are still pursuing their education at graduate school, and one of themis a student at UCM. Many of my friends work at UCM, many of the children I have watchedgrowing up are now UCM students. And I am currently a full-time student for my second degreeand also an adjunct instructor. There are several reasons why I oppose HB 86, guns on campus, however, I would like to sharetwo of my concerns. My husband is a great educator, and so are other professors and instructors. They take pride intheir work assisting their students to be successful. Many college students including my childenjoy college life, not because they have freedom, it is because of the challenges that are makingthem better. Institutions of higher education are not always fun places to be. These are places tolearn how to be critical thinkers, which could cause great stress for students. As a psychiatrist, Idon't think having easy access to firearms for people who are under great pressure is a good idea. This is my first concern.Additionally, in a 2019 national survey, 62 percent of US college students reported drinkingalcohol in the past month and 35 percent reported getting drunk. Sadly some use alcohol as self-medication for relieving stress or depression. Alcohol can inhibit the brain's executive functions such as self-monitoring or regulation of emotion, which results in poor decision-making. Havingeasy access to a firearm while being intoxicated poses the greatest threat to self and others. Thisis my second concern.UCM is a small college. UCM families practically know each other. UCM administration and UCM campus police are doing amazing work to keep our campus safe. I cannot find any reasonswhy we need to have more concealed firearms on campus. The thought of having concealed guns on the UCM campus is upsetting me, I cannot imagine thefear and anxiety that people who are involved in bigger colleges or universities in the largercities are having. Please do not pass HB 86 that could place my family, friends, and all Missourians in a dangeroussituation. Thank you for your time.

Missouri State University contracts with the Springfield Police Department for an on-campus substation. In addition, we have non-sworn campus safety officers providing safety and security functions. The police officers assigned to our campus are armed. Our campus safety officers are generally not armed as we do not believe their duties make it necessary for them to carry a firearm. We have a unique policy on firearms at MSU. Our policies do not create a gun free zone on campus. In addition to the Springfield police officers on our campus, certain classes of people are authorized by our policies to bring firearms onto our campus without needing to request permission by the University. This list includes off-duty police officers, retired officers, civil process servers, and others. We also do not prohibit employees from having them concealed in their vehicle. We have also set up a process for anyone to request permission to conceal carry a firearm on campus, and I review those requests on a case-by-case basis. To start this process an individual submits an online application to me for review. We perform a background check and require anyone whose application is approved to sign a waiver and attend an educational session about our policies on weapons. We have an appeals process set up for individuals who believe their application was wrongly denied. I am opposed to this bill because I believe our board has created reasonable policies that allow us appropriate flexibility to manage firearms on our campus. I appreciate the language in this bill that would allow us to continue to have some policies governing firearms. However, I believe that this bill would still go too far in limiting our ability to properly manage firearms on our campus. For example, I had a student that decided to purchase a handgun. The student did not have any prior experience using a firearm, has not taken any type of training for its safe use and did not have any extenuating circumstances where there was an increased threat to his safety. I determined the risk to the campus was not acceptable so I denied the request. I contrast that request with one I had from an individual that has used a firearm throughout her life, has a conceal carry permit, has conceal carried for many years and travels to and from campus in the evening. In this instance, I approved her request to carry on campus.It is important that we continue to be able to make case-by-case decisions based on the specifics of a given situation, and this bill could limit our ability to do that. Flexibility in our decisions is particularly important on firearms because of the danger firearms can present in many spaces and situations on our campus. Examples include communal living situations in residence halls, student conduct hearings, recreational areas, laboratories, students dealing with mental health issues, and other situations where firearms could pose a unique risk.

I oppose HB 86 because it will make Missouri a more dangerous place to live, I'm a proud 4thgeneration Missourian, a Mizzou alum, and I reside in Representative Chris Brown's district in Kansas City's Northland. HB 86 would force public colleges and universities to allow hidden, loaded handguns on their campuses: allow civilians to carry concealed handguns in private elementary, middle, and high schools, bars, day cares, and other sensitive locations throughout the state; and encroach on Missourians' rights by allowing handguns on private property even if the owner has posted a "no guns allowed" sign. Forcing Missouri colleges and universities to allow concealed firearms on campus is dangerous. Campus life is rife with other risk factors, including heavy alcohol and drug use, mental health issues and suicide, and adding hidden, loaded firearms is potentially fatal. Missouri's firearm suicide rate for youth aged 10-24 has increased 105% in the last decade (https://everytownresearch.org/report/the-rise-of-firearm-suicide-among-young-americans/). Moreover, because Missouri does not require extensive safety training for concealed carry license holders, I'm concerned that students, faculty, or visitors will leave loaded guns unattended and unlocked. increasing the likelihood of unintentional shootings or theft. These laws result in new expenses to ensure campus safety, including additional police and security staff, metal detectors, cameras, and protective gear. I support the Second Amendment, and come from a family that owns firearms and passes them down through the family. However, it's important to note that James Madison, the author of the Second Amendment, and Thomas Jefferson, the author of the Declaration of Independence, believed guns had no place on college campuses. In 1824, at a University of Virginia Board of Visitors meeting, both Madison and Jefferson supported a rule prohibiting firearm possession and use by students at the university. https://www.theatlantic.com/politics/archive/2016/05/when-jefferson-andmadison-banned-guns-on-campus/481461/ I have a daughter and a son and their safety is my top priority. I cannot imagine sending my children to a campus where other students are armed. It will lead parents to look for out-of-state higher education options. I also oppose allowing concealed carry in other sensitive places like day cares, K-12 schools, and bars. I have the same concerns about people leaving loaded guns unattended in schools, where children may find them with fatal results. There are better ways to address school safety, including the development of threat assessment and identification plans. These plans help schools identify students who are at risk of committing violence and resolve these incidents by getting the students the help they need. Effective programs work to identify threats, determine if a student has access to guns, and ensure that there are enough professionals available to provide students with mental health services. Other ways to improve school safety are to enact stronger background check laws and safe firearm storage laws. Here in the Northland in 2019, the parent of a student at a private day care/elementary school was charged with making a terroristic threat. According to media reports and court records, a family member said the parent told her not to bring his son to school the next day because "a storm is coming." After the

threat was reported to the school, the school reviewed surveillance video of the parent accessing the school without using his parental code, wearing a backpack. He walked the halls and entered restrooms and private offices. Law enforcement officers found evidence in his home that he was interested in Sandy Hook and other school shootings. We don't know if he had a gun with him that day. but it is terrifying to think that under this bill, carrying would be legal in the school and not grounds for charging him. https://www.kctv5.com/news/local news/man-charged-with-making-terrorist-threattowards-galdstone-school/article 140c2732-0a86-11ea-8f95-efe817028620.htmll also oppose HB 86 because it infringes on personal property rights of business owners and individuals. I am particularly concerned that people who visit businesses where alcohol is served may drink and get into an altercation inside the business, then access their personal firearms. While the bill grants property owners liability protections for such an incident, it does nothing to protect the people who are victims. which is reprehensible. As an attorney who advised clients on employment and workplace safety issues, business owners and their employees and patrons should be concerned about the risk of guns in parking lots in workplaces It's too easy for a terminated employee to easily access that gun to fire on the human resources manager who delivered the bad news. More people carrying more guns in more places is not going to make us safer, and private property owners should be able to completely restrict firearms on their property. Dear Committee Chair and Committee Members, My name is Laura Burkhardt and I am a volunteer with Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, I am a group lead for Moms Demand Action in West St. Louis County, and I am a gun violence survivor. I am a mother of 3 and a resident of Ballwin. I am submitting this testimony on behalf of Moms Demand Action and urging you to oppose HB 86. HB 86 or "quns everywhere" would further weaken Missouri's gun laws and in turn, add to our rapidly increasing rate of gun violence. Missouri currently has the 5th-highest rate of gun homicides in the US. We are trending in the wrong direction. HB 86 would force public colleges and universities to allow people-including students, staff, and visitors-to carry hidden, loaded handguns on campus. Under current law, typically only trained security officers or law enforcement can carry concealed handguns in college and university facilities. HB 86 would also allow civilians to carry hidden, loaded handguns in private elementary, middle, high schools, and childcare facilities. When firearms are allowed into schools, there is a greater risk of children accessing them. Along with college and university campuses, elementary, middle, and high school, early childcare facilities, and certain other sensitive places, this bill would allow people to carry hidden, loaded handguns into bars. The public strongly opposes this. We all know that alcohol is associated with aggression and increases the likelihood of violent behavior. This would be a dangerous and deadly combination. I have been sexually assaulted at gunpoint and I have been on the other end of the phone as a close friend died by gun suicide. As a gun violence survivor, I know firsthand the trauma that comes with surviving gun violence. I have three school-aged children, and we take full advantage of everything St. Louis County and Missouri as a whole have to offer. We attend church together, go out to eat at local restaurants, and visit the many attractions our community has to offer, including the zoo and Six-Flags. I bring my children to the polls with me every single election day. Before Covid, we would go as a family to volunteer at a local hospital. The trauma that comes with constantly wondering if the person next to me is carrying a hidden firearm is indescribable. If "guns everywhere" becomes law, I and many others will relive that trauma every time we are put in this position, especially in the densely populated community that I live in. I feel safe in my community. I feel safe sending my children to school. I feel safe in my church. I support the Second Amendment. I also support the right of Missouri residents and visitors to enjoy everything Missouri has to offer without the constant wondering and worrying of who may be carrying a gun everywhere they go. More guns in public spaces do not make us safer.. I'm asking you to put the safety of your constituents first. I am asking you to keep our community a place where families choose to congregate. Chairman Trent and Members of the Committee: I am a retired faculty member and former Director of the School of Social Work at the University of Missouri in Columbia. As an educator with 25 years of experience at the University, I am particularly concerned about allowing concealed firearms in schools and on college campuses. Our students are wonderful people with an eagerness for learning. But every once in a while there is a student with a troubled background, or who has displayed violent tendencies. We once had a student in our program who had problems with emotional regulation and temper. This student sent threatening letters and emails to faculty and we became concerned for our safety. Because of this student, we developed a safety plan for notifying someone if he was in our office and we felt threatened, but I'm not sure how well it would have worked if he had had a concealed weapon. This student was an exception, of course, and he was eventually counseled out of the program. Still, all it takes is one person to have a tragic incident. There are students who become angry and upset either because of something that has occurred in their personal lives, or because of a bad grade, or other issues. They sometimes act impulsively. The thought that some of these students could be allowed to bring a firearm on campus is a frightening one. Another reason that I am concerned about firearms on campus is my concern about students not being in control when they are drinking alcohol. Like it or not, alcohol is a perpetual problem on campus. There have been many incidents reported in the news about the inappropriate and impulsive behavior of students on campus when they are drinking, and even more situations that go unreported. Otherwise upstanding young people are not themselves and often act impulsively when they are drinking, and I worry about what could happen should students who are inebriated have legal and ready access to guns on campus in their dorms or fraternity houses. My concern about the availability of firearms to people who are drinking alcohol is that it increases the potential for suicide. Suicide completion is greatly increased when using guns (as opposed to overdosing on pills). The suicide rate has increased greatly (by over 105% in the last decade) for young people ages 10-24, which includes college-aged students, and the easy availability of gun possession would increase the potential for students to use firearms for suicide. I urge you to vote against HB 86. Thank you for your consideration.

I believe that our churches, college campuses and ANY place where there are children, especially schools and daycares, should be free of firearms. Among my concerns are these: Accidents and momentary distractions happen. The very thought of my grandchildren attending a daycare or school where employees or visitors may be permitted to carry a concealed firearm, no matter how well intentioned, is horrifying. Guns on campuses, even those kept in automobiles, are too easy to access. Higher education may include significant stress among faculty as well as students, and the danger of suicide by gun increases when a firearm is easily accessible. In addition, parties that include alcohol consumption may lead to heightened emotions and/or reckless behaviors. I have a right to feel safe in a church and the establishments I visit. I should not have to worry that the man or woman in the pew behind me during church services, or a person in the next isle of a store, may be carrying a loaded gun in their pocket or pocketbook. Allowing firearms at voting precincts is intimidating to voters, at best.. It appears that the legislation allows the property owner or a school district or church pastor to post signs prohibiting firearms in the establishment or on the property, but that begs the question of who is then responsible for enforcement. From what I can see in the legislation, the property or business owner or employee will have to initially enforce the prohibition themselves. Whether the person carrying a concealed weapon has a permit or not, challenging their admittance could be a difficult if not potentially dangerous task for any individual, and they should not be expected to have to deal with that. Thank you for your time. As a mother whose child is going off to college in the fall I amdeeply concerned about legislation that would force public Missouri colleges to allow guns oncampus. Under current law, generally only trained law enforcement or security officers can carryconcealed handguns in public college and university facilities. HB 86 would gut this common sense public safety law and force these institutions to let civilians -- including students, staff, and visitors -- carry handguns in college and university facilities. However, campus safety officers, campus administrators, presidents, staff, faculty, students andresident life directors are the ones who know the campus environment the best - and theyknow what works best for those environments. They oppose this kind of legislation and they have for years. We should listen to their expertise, first-hand knowledge and insight. States that have recently passed legislation similar to HB 86 are struggling with theconsequences, one of which is accidental discharges: In Texas, just weeks after a gun oncampus law went into effect, a permit-holding student unintentionally discharged his gun in hisdorm room. In Utah, another permit-holding student discharged his gun in a crowded cafeteria Fortunately, the bullet hit only a light fixture and a table. If the Missouri Legislature is truly concerned about stopping mass shootings, they should startby taking action to keep guns out of the hands of domestic abusers. A report on mass shootings(from 2009-2017) shows that in at least 54% of mass shootings, the perpetrator shot an intimatepartner or family member.When this legislative body passed Permitless Carry (SB656) in 2016, you promised to fix theproblems that very legislation created - which our law enforcement officers were clear made itharder for them to keep guns out of the hands of domestic abusers. It's been over 4 years. Lawenforcement officers, prosecutors are waiting. People in domestic violence situations arewaiting. To be honest, they are not only waiting – they are dying. Dying at the hands ofdomestic abusers who easily get their hands on guns. According to the FBI's SupplementaryHomicide Reports from 2013-2017, at least 183 Missourians were killed in intimate partnerhomicide and 64% of them were killed with a firearm.Loosening Missouri's gun laws has resulted in a significant public safety risk. After the repeal ofMissouri's purchase permit law requiring background checks, the state experienced a 25%increase in the firearm homicide rate and a 16% increase in the firearm suicide rate. Let'splease stop going in this direction. Real lives are at stake. My father was shot and killed in Missouri by someone who never should have been able to get hands on a gun. However, this prohibited purchaser was able to get hands on a gun a couple different way - and then hold agun to my father's head and pull the trigger two times. How easy would it be for that person to get guns againsince Missouri does not require background checks on private sales, or require permits? Tooeasy. Too easy for a convicted felon and a convicted murderer to get hands on a gun in Missouri. Research shows that criminals know that the internet is the place to go to get armedwith no questions asked. In fact, in 2018 alone, there were 54,195 ads for firearm sales in Missouri that had no legal requirement for a background check. Please stand up for people likeme and take common sense steps that would help keep guns out of the hands

of dangerous people in the first place.

General Laws Committee Members: I write today in opposition of HB86. I want to first say that our family owns guns, we are hunters and occasionally my husband likes to go to the range with his handgun. We support the second Amendment and we understand the utilization of these tools for sport. However, there is a limitation that should be placed on where concealed carry weapons are allowed. I am the parent of a child in pre-K and I do not want concealed carry weapons in a childcare facility. I am the parent of a child in Elementary school and I do not want concealed carry weapons in our classrooms- either in the hands of a teacher, staff member, volunteer security guard or guest. work on the MU campus and I do not want concealed carry weapons on campuses of higher learning. in our parking garages or in our buildings. I work in the School of Medicine, our building is accessible to the hospital, and I do not want concealed carry in our hospitals where patients in crisis could obtain access to firearms. We have laws in place to keep weapons out of facilities like schools, childcare centers, hospitals and bars because it increases public safety. More access to firearms leads to more firearm related deaths. Medical students are three times likelier to die of suicide than their counterparts in the general population, according to data cited in an AMA Council on Medical Education report presented at the 2019 AMA Annual Meeting. In my position, I see the stress and strain both pre-med and medical students suffer from. I think it would be detrimental to increase the availability of firearms on campus for these students. I have been through two lockdowns in my time on the MU campus. The first was because victims of an attempted murder were brought to University Hospital and police were concerned that the suspect, who evaded police for nearly 24 hrs, would enter the hospital to persue the victims. Having the law in place that weapons could not be brought into the hospital made anyone that might carry a weapon an obvious person to alert security to. It made the environment more safe. The second was when a female student was seen carrying a weapon across campus. Campus police were notified and able to find the girl before she committed to her plan for self harm. Someone noticing a weapon and calling campus police saved her life. This may not happen again if concealed carry is a common thing on campus. On average, roughly 40 percent of inmates who are incarcerated for violent offenses were under the influence of alcohol during the time of their crime. If we allow firearms to be added to the mix in bars, we should expect an increase in deadly assaults, intimate partner violence and homicide. Teachers, law enforcement, bar owners, school and hospital administrators have all stated their opposition to what you propose today. We should listen to the people in charge of our safety, our classrooms and our facilities.

Dear Committee Chair and Committee Members. My name is Sara Ennis and I am a volunteer with Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America. I am writing in opposition to HB 86. I am the mom of two girls, aged 6 and 8, who attend Oakhill Day School, a private school in Gladstone, Missouri. On Wednesday, November 13, 2019, there was a serious, credible threat of violence made against our school by a parent of a fellow student. The family of the suspect was aware of the threat, so their children were kept home the day the attack was to occur, while the rest of us unknowingly dropped our children off as usual. It was only due to an early morning welfare check by police that the suspect was arrested and his plans were diverted, just hours before they were set to take place. The suspect is currently out on bail in Clay County, pending trial. The details of the police report are chilling. Our school has 300 children enrolled from ages 18 months through 8th grade. While I do not know every family, there is a strong feeling of community, a feeling that we look out not just for our own children, but for each other's. While my sense of security was shaken, I do feel relief in knowing that this particular threat was identified and contained without anyone getting hurt. We now know the threat can exist among us, and we appreciate that our school has addressed this appropriately. However, if this bill allowing concealed handguns in private schools were to pass, my husband and I would not feel comfortable sending our children to school. Students should not be put in an environment where their only protection against school shootings is trusting that the parent attending the school holiday program with a concealed handgun is in fact a "good guy with a gun." Firearms simply have no place in our schools. Missouri children deserve the freedom to focus on their education without having guns brought into their classroom. I strongly oppose HB 86. I am a middle aged middle class educated white woman living and should be insulated from the impacts of gun violence, but I am not. This bill will make my life wrecked and miserable and may lead to me moving my family out of Missouri. I have already sent a child to college in a state that has stricter our laws which expressly forbids the carrying of weapons on campus. He received extensive scholarships based on his test scores and grades and essay. He got into every college he applied to. If this goes thru, I would not recommend to any student or interviewee that they be part of any institute of higher learning here. ?I am a graduate of VA Tech, the most horrific college shooting in the US. I knew Liviu Librescu, as a coreligionist and as the major professor of my house mate and friend. He was brilliant and brave, a survivor of the Holocaust who was shot while saving all the students in his class. A gun at hand would have done nothing to prevent his death and would have made it more difficult for law enforcement to tell who the shooter was. It would not have made the door more secure or the glass thicker. The shooter in VA Tech never entered Dr. Librescue's room What would have protected Dr. Librescu and the other victims would have been stronger laws forbidding the sale of powerful weapons with large magazines, stronger and universal background checks, the ability to sequester guns from dangerous people, better and more available mental health, and not the carrying guns in university classrooms. Rest assured that the students in the graduate level engineering course in solid mechanics where one is focused on the mathematical modeling and observed deformation of materials due to external and often repeated forces and stresses and would not have been easily able to refocus on shooting an intruder especially the shooter is out side the room and the professor is locking the door. It would have just meant that rather than spending time escaping the students, would have been rummaging thru backpacks, laptops, notebooks and the the like, they might have shot their beloved teacher who was locking the door or been shot thru the door. ? ?I can also tell you as scientist and member in the academic world carrying a weapon will not make you safer. In the lab, your gun is likely to be far away from where you are working. You might even risk having it stolen since you aren't with it all the time. You have neither the room to carry the weapon with you nor the clothing suited for it. You are most often concentrating on things which require your entire attention, often using equipment far from where your handbags, backpacks, messenger bags etc. are stored (frequently a locker, office, desk, some other lockable area) and wearing PPE which are not designed with guns in mind and would make it infeasible to carry a weapon. In addition, the idea of firing a gun in while surrounded by flammable materials and dangerous machinery would be tantamount to setting the entire building on fire, release toxic chemicals or radiation. I am also a former member of the Tree of Life Synagog in Pittsburgh, PA. I have a friend who's cousin was injured in that shooting. The shooting in a sanctuary is anathema to our spiritual life. Carrying a gun on Shabbos is not allowed and bring a gun into our sanctuary is forbidden. We are not even allowed to touch the Torah with a material that could be easily made into a weapon. In this age of rampant hate crimes, and

with the rise of neo-nazis (which is what the Tree of Life shooter was) HB86 would directly risk the lives of those in prayer. Such hate crimes have already happened here, recall the shooting by at the Kansas City JCC which took place in the parking lot a few years back. HB86 would allow for exactly this scenario to be repeated. The threat of hate killings is real and present for us in this community. I attend a synagog where my rabbis repeatedly receive death threats and where our building has received hate mail and vandalism. We also house a preschool/daycare facility. We strictly forbid weapons on our sanctuary. We have fortified our building with crash barriers and coded doors, alarm systems and video cameras. We have hired off-duty police officers to conduct bag checks and to protect us as we pray, so that we may focus on our religion and spiritual life and not be afraid. HB86 means that we would no longer be able to protect ourselves with these measures and would make us much more vulnerable.?? Most problematically this bill sets up a legal quagmire that will embroil the state in endless costly court cases. It sets up a head to head challenge between the Castle Doctrine (as most recently cited in the Amicus Brief by Attorney General Schmitt in Case No. 2022-CR01300) and Stand Your Ground. This will be costly and nightmarish for every municipality and stakeholder in the state. If HB86 is passed, for example a demanding property owner is potentially confronted by an aggressive gun carrier who is on the property in a car or parking lot. HB86 means both people would be in the right and it is easy to see the problematic outcome that the state and local government would be required to litigate and taxpayers foot the bill. ?HB86 would also feed into exponential rise of guns stolen from cars. Guns left in cars is now the primary sources for stolen guns in Missouri and has risen dramatically since the passage of Concealed Carry legislation. ?Stronger sensible gun legislation like registration of lost and stolen weapons, universal background checks, re-initiation of concealed carry permits as we previously had in this state would be more protective. Jewish law forbids the sale of arms to people who are suspect of criminal intentions. We now have gun sales (private and gun show sales) where there is no check on the criminal record or ownership of the gun and in Missouri we allow almost everyone to buy a gun with very little to no scrutiny of the transaction or those involved, either buyer or seller. This paragraph took 15 seconds to read and based to the Bushmaster AR-15 manual vou have sent out between 10 and 15 rounds.

My personal safety, and that of my family, friends, and neighbors, will be placed at risk if many of the bills pending in the Missouri General Assembly that relax or remove current restrictions on firearms become law. I am a gun owner, husband, father and grandfather who moved to Jefferson City several vears ago to be close to family. I believe, as many do, that individual gun rights under the Second Amendment can peacefully coexist with public safety rights. However, legislation such as HB86, in addition to bills addressing guns in churches, colleges, on public transportation, and prohibiting Missouri law enforcement from enforcing federal gun safety laws, disrupts this balance, and dismisses my right to live in a community in which I feel safe. My son-in-law is a Sargent with a local county sheriff's department, and I know from him, and many other officers which I have spoken, that more weapons in the hands of more people in more public places, does not make our community safer, and dangerously increases the risk to our law enforcement officers. Restricting him from attempting to enforce gun anti-trafficking laws, prohibitions on illegal weapons, domestic violence laws, and gun purchasing laws that keep guns out of the hands of dangerous criminals, puts his life in greater danger. I feel for his safety as well as my daughter and grandchildren if HB 86 is passed. I don't drink alcohol and frequent bars but do play guitar and enjoy live music. I belong to the Mid-MO Blues Society that holds frequent jam sessions in local establishment such as The Mission or Spectators. Two years ago, a Chief of Staff to a Missouri Senator, dropped a loaded gun during a fight onto the floor of Spectators while inebriated. Innocent people could have been killed or seriously injured. I feel for my safety as well as fellow music lovers if HB 86 is passed. My grandsons attended a local day care facility here in Jefferson City and my wife and I enjoyed attending special events and holiday presentations by the children, often in packed school rooms with other parents. I feel for the safety of innocent children, teachers, and parents if people were allowed to attend those events with guns strapped to their hip at eye-level to a 5-year-old. I enjoy visiting and attending events at Lincoln University as well other local colleges such as Westminster, William Woods and MU and Stephens in Columbia. But I can't imagine feeling comfortable on a college campus thinking I'm surrounded by 18and 19-year-old teenagers with loaded guns hidden in their coats and backpacks. Consistently, college administrators, teachers, students and campus police have opposed allowing guns on campus. Most notably. Lincoln University Police Chief Gary Hill, who was recently credited by Goy. Parson as establishing the first law enforcement training academy in a historically Black college or university in the nation. https://www.newstribune.com/news/news/story/2019/mar/07/lincoln-university-police-chiefopposes-proposed-firearms-bill/768782/ Advocates for bills such as HB86 claim that they have an "inalienable right" to possess and carry any weapon they chose and that any laws restricting firearms violate that "right." But that is not how our Constitution and democratic system operates. Ultimately, it is the Supreme Court which makes this judgement. In the Court's pivotal Heller Decision, Justice Scalia wrote "like most rights, the right secured by the Second Amendment is not unlimited" and that it is "not a right to keep and carry any weapon whatsoever in any manner whatsoever and for whatever purpose." Further, "Nothing in our opinion should be taken to cast doubt on longstanding prohibitions on the possession of firearms by felons and the mentally ill, or laws forbidding the carrying of firearms in sensitive places such as schools and government buildings, or laws imposing conditions and qualifications on the commercial sale of arms."As a representative of the people in this state, I expect you to uphold the state's motto, "Let the welfare of the people be the supreme law" and respect the rights of all citizens who want to live without fear in their communities. HB86 tips the balance between 2nd Amendment Rights and public safety too far away from people like myself, who simply do not feel safe surrounded in public areas by persons (often untrained) with loaded guns. Please vote NO on HB86.

Dear Committee Chair and Committee Members. My name is Taggart, and I am currently a junior in high school. I am writing as a member of Students Demand Action for Gun Sense in America in opposition to HB 86 because having guns in schools outside of those possessed by law enforcement officials is not conducive to learning. I often think about how as a child, my elementary school had intruder drills once a year. Our teacher would turn off the lights and my classmates and I would all sit quietly in a dark corner of the classroom for about ten minutes while staff did a sweep of the school, jiggling all the handles to make sure doors were locked and peering in the window to make sure that we weren't in view from the hallway. These drills weren't only a distraction from schoolwork, but an introduction to a legitimate fear of harm which students across the USA experience in what is supposed to be a safe place for learning. These drills have become so common that from the 2005-2006 school year to the 2015-2016 school year, the number of American public schools performing these drills had an increase from 40% to 95%. This fear of harm is also present in middle schools, where my teachers would remind us that should an intruder ever enter the classroom, especially with a weapon, we'd have to use school supplies like scissors, pencils, textbooks, or chairs, to defend ourselves. If we allow for people to carry concealed handguns on school campuses, the danger to our children will only grow. Missouri is especially dangerous for kids when it comes to gun violence already, with the leading cause of death for children in teens being by a firearm. This bill will drastically hurt Missouri's children, introducing threats that could walk in the door armed without being able to be stopped. I fear that allowing concealed handguns in schools will not promote the safe use of firearms.HB 86 would lead to even more guns being carried in our communities. I, for one, know that if a person walked into my high school right now with a gun of any sort, I would immediately feel uncomfortable and be distracted from my work. My school, like most schools I've been to, appreciates this fact and doesn't allow weapons to be carried on the property because they know that guns on campuses don't only put students in harm's way, but offer no tangible benefit to the students or staff of the school. I taught for 30 years at Missouri State University until my retirement in 2019. I urge you not to support any proposed bills that would allow people to carry a gun into buildings on campus. School security officers already may carry sidearms, and I feel that they provide adequate security. In my classes, I always encouraged students to respectfully debate all sides of social issues and public policies. The classroom is a place where students can feel safe when they disagree with me or with other students. Knowing that some people in the room may be armed would greatly undermine students' sense of mutual trust and the feeling of security that are the foundations of effective discussions and debates. Open, honest discussions are essential to the learning process. From time to time I had to tell students in my office that they were failing my classes, and I had to admonish them for poor attendance, tardiness, missed assignments, and the like. Most students took my words well, but some reacted very angrily to my explanation for their poor grade. Frankly, I am glad that I never had to worry that a disgruntled student might pull a gun on me during those instances. While school shootings get a lot of media attention, they are a very small part of the youth homicide problem. The Department of Justice in coordination with the Department of Education has been running the School-Associated Violence Study since 1992. The S-AVS data show that 1.5% of murders of children happen in school buildings or near school grounds. The other 98.5% of child homicides occur at home, on the street, or in other places. Having students armed on campuses will not help make schools safer. Instead, armed students will undermine the mutual trust and sense of security that are essential to an open and effective learning environment. Therefore, I ask you not to support any bill that would allow people other than security personnel to carry guns into campus buildings. Thank you for considering my views.

The Missouri Catholic Conference (MCC) respectfully opposes HB 86. Under current Missouri law, gun owners are prohibited from carrying a weapon into a church, or a private elementary or secondary school. Missouri properly recognizes that churches and schools are spaces in which guns have no place as a matter of public policy. They are appropriately considered gun-free zones, because they are spaces where we educate our children and in which we meet for worship. HB 86 changes this paradigm. It makes churches and schools places gun owners can lawfully carry, rather than recognizing them in law as gun free spaces. Churches and private schools wishing to remain gun-free would be required to post signage in a conspicuous place. In the case of churches, this signage would likely have to be posted near the sacred space of worship. The MCC views this as an inappropriate and unnecessary intrusion upon religious freedom, which is guaranteed under the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. The MCC recognizes that we now live in a society where legally recognized gun-free zones will not always protect innocent people from gun violence. Churches and schools are free under current law, however, to address these situations by establishing security protocols tailored to meet their situation. The MCC believes this is a more appropriate way to address the current proliferation of gun violence than removing churches and schools from the list of places guns are not permitted. The Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution ensures the right to bear arms, but it should not be used to justify infringing upon the Constitutional rights of others. The Missouri Catholic Conference urges you to vote HB 86 "DO NOT PASS."

Missouri's gun homicide rate is worse than all but two other states and is more than twice as high as the national average. • With a rate of 6.63-gun deaths for every 100,000 people among people under the age of 21, the state ranks third in the nation. • In Missouri, shootings are the leading cause of death for young people. Colleges and universities, which have traditionally prohibited guns on campus, have been relatively safe from gun violence. But campus life is rife with other risk factors that make the presence of guns dangerous - including heavy alcohol and drug use, mental health issues and Suicidal thought. Allowing civilians to carry concealed handguns in private elementary, middle, and high schools, increases the risks of unintentional or intentional shootings impacting our children. More access to firearms is strongly correlated with additional risk of gun violence. When more guns are placed into schools, children will be more likely to access them. I do not want to see Missouri rank even higher in oun deaths then it already is because we have increased access to guns. Prior research shows that ninety-three percent of Americans think people should not be allowed to bring guns into bars. Alcohol is associated with increased aggression, and people under the influence of alcohol are both more likely to be shot and more likely to kill someone else. Another father, mother, brother, sister or cousin lost. Every death impacts a child in this state.
