Please do whatever is necessary to stop the efforts to recoup unemployment benefits paid out to these people months after they actually received the payments. Again, to sum up the situation; many of our fellow citizens made legitimate application for unemployeent benefits. That the State of Missouri was not able to correct accept, process, and pay these applications according to their rules, should not now be held against those who are among our

most vulnerable citizens. Thank you for your public service to our state.

The Missouri House must movee to waive these repayments for the welfare of MO families--It is the right thing to do.
