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Written Testimony of William B. Bates on behalf of LeadingAge Missouri in support of SS#2 SCS SBs 51 & 42 before the Special Committee on Litigation ReformLeadingAge Missouri is an association of 130 mostly non-profit senior living and healthcare communities throughout Missouri that deliver the full continuum of senior care services in different settings. LeadingAge Missouri and its members need and strongly support legislation in Missouri that provides balanced, reasonable, limited, civil liability protection for COVID-based lawsuits. In doing so, we are advocating for civil jurisprudence in Missouri similar to what is already in place in many other states and for certain federal actions. Importantly, Leading Age Missouri and its members do not support barring Missourians from bringing COVID-19 lawsuits based on egregious actions. We do not support legal immunity. Rather, we support a reasonable and fair balancing of the competing interests of aggrieved individuals and healthcare providers in civil (not criminal) legal proceedings based on the unusual circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic. We advocate raising the bar for recovery in a COVID-19 civil liability lawsuit from a simple negligence standard to one of gross negligence or malicious or intentional misconduct. This is what has been done partially at the federal level and in many states. Moreover, Missouri already embraces this standard for recovery in actions brought against healthcare providers deployed by the State in an emergency. Missouri should extend that same approach to healthcare providers for the COVID pandemic. There are two compelling reasons why Missouri should raise the bar for recovery for COVID-based lawsuits: It is a reasonable response based on the facts and circumstances surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic AND it is in the States' economic interest.Reasonable Response to Unusual CircumstancesSB 51 is a reasonable, fair response because, as indicated, it does not bar lawsuits - it only imposes a higher level of proof for lawsuit recovery. Facts that support malicious misconduct, gross negligence or intentional conduct causing injury will remain actionable. Accordingly, LeadingAge Missouri believes SB 51 fairly balances society's interest in protecting healthcare providers and allowing for citizen redress for injuries sustained. Further bolstering SB 51's reasonableness are the time limits during which the higher standard of proof applies. That said, LeadingAge Missouri strongly supports addition of an emergency clause to SB 51. Its absence will seriously jeopardize much of the value of providing limited civil liability protection to Missouri healthcare providers. SB 51 is also a reasonable response because the novel coronavirus has proven to be unusually contagious and insidious. Today's Missouri healthcare providers have never witnessed anything like it. COVID-19 can be transmitted by asymptomatic people and there is still much unknow about how it is transmitted. And science is yet to concretely establish that vaccinated people cannot carry and transmit the virus. What is known, however, is that congregate care settings like long-term care communities - are seriously challenged by transmissibility. Communities that went months with perfect government inspections for infection control - an absence of demerits or even

suggestions for improvement - can suddenly find themselves in an outbreak. It is reasonable to adjust the standard of recovery to account for the nature of the coronavirus. Further, and in part because of what we do not know about COVID-19, providers have been asked to deal with changing care protocols and guidance throughout the pandemic. COVID care procedures and guidance one day have been different the next. It is tough to train and manage people in that type of fluid environment. Without bad behavior (gross negligence or intentional or malicious misconduct), we think it is unreasonable to allow lawsuit recovery for doing what was thought correct care, protocol, or procedure at the time. Third, even today, the pandemic has exposed shortages of personal protective equipment (PPE), health care professionals and testing capacity. The supply chain for PPE has improved, but there are still challenges (both availability and expense), and early on PPE was a huge problem. Many communities had to improvise or simply go without. It is unfair to hold healthcare workers to ordinary standards of action or protection through no fault of their own. There needs to be a higher standard of proof to hold a healthcare provider responsible. Moreover, always a challenge in senior care, staff availability has been extraordinarily challenging during COVID. There are simply not enough professionals willing to undertake the hard and dangerous work of senior care in ordinary times. With school closures stealing parent workers and staff quarantines of workers owing to COVID exposure during the pandemic, longterm care facilities have been forced to rely on expensive alternative staff and to integrate new staff as best they can. In some places, nursing homes resorted to using COVID + asymptomatic nurses for COVID+ patients - because there was simply no one else available to feed, bath, toilet, transfer and otherwise care for elderly patients. The impact of PPE shortages, uncertainty surrounding virus transmission, changing treatments and protocols, staff unavailability and limitations on testing have all combined to create an unprecedented healthcare situation – one that demands a reasonable approach to liability - like that found in legislation before this committee. State's Economic InterestMost senior care providers in Missouri serve Medicaid populations (the average nursing home has 65% Medicaid occupancy) and the Medicaid program currently fails to reimburse providers for the cost of care (on average, the State reimburses \$20 below the cost of care). This fact, coupled with extraordinary expenses providers are absorbing to care for people during the pandemic while they are unable to attract new profitable private pay or Medicare residents (because of government restrictions), has put many providers in financial peril. Many will fail regardless of what the State does on civil liability protection. But some that might otherwise fail, might survive if they do not have to shoulder the expenses unreasonable lawsuits that last for years. This is a reasonable policy decision for the State senior care facilities are significant employers in most communities (often the largest employer in many rural communities), and senior care facilities care for a community's frail and elderly populations. Where will those residents go if the senior care facility fails? Where will the jobs go? What will the State do when there are too few providers for older Missourians?LeadingAge Missouri senior care provider members are struggling financially. Some facilities have closed their doors; others have sold out. Some have downsized unprofitable Medicaid beds, and some have quit our association because they cannot afford dues. Senior healthcare providers need State help. If the State wants senior care providers to survive to serve the growing senior population in the state, the State must consider reasonable civil liability protection as one way to help them. SB 51 is a reasonable, fair, balanced approach to helping healthcare facilities survive during unusual times. LeadingAge Missouri urges swift passage with an emergency clause.
