1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Substitute for Senate Bill No. 690, Pages 25-26,
2 Section 194.297, Lines 1-32, by deleting all of said section and lines and inserting in lieu thereof the
3 following:

5 "194.297. 1. There is established in the state treasury the "Organ Donor Program Fund"[,
6 which shall consist of all moneys deposited by the director of revenue pursuant to subsection 2 of
7 section 302.171 and any other moneys donated or appropriated to the fund]. The director of revenue
8 shall credit to and deposit in the organ donor program fund all amounts received under sections
9 301.020, 301.3125, and subsection 2 of section 302.171, and any other amounts which may be
10 received from grants, gifts, bequests, the federal government, or other sources granted or given.
11 Funds shall be used for implementing efforts that support or provide organ, eye, and tissue donation
12 education awareness, recognition, training, and registry efforts unless designated for a specific
13 purpose as outlined in subsection 4 of this section. Funds may be used to support expenses incurred
14 by organ donation advisory committee members pursuant to section 194.300.

15 2. The department of health and senior services may pursue funding to support
16 programmatic efforts and initiatives as outlined in subsection 1 of this section.

17 3. The state treasurer shall invest any funds in excess of five hundred thousand dollars in the
18 organ donor program fund not required for immediate disbursement or program allocation in the
19 same manner as surplus state funds are invested under section 30.260. All earnings resulting from
20 the investment of money in the organ donor program fund shall be credited to the organ donor
21 program fund.

22 4. The organ donor program fund can accept gifts, grants, appropriations, or contributions
23 from any source, public or private, including contributions from sections 301.020, 301.3125, and
24 302.171, and individuals, private organizations and foundations, and bequests. Private
25 contributions, grants, and federal funds may be used and expended by the department for such
26 purposes as may be specified in any requirements, terms, or conditions attached thereto or, in the
27 absence of any specific requirements, terms, or conditions, as the department may determine for
28 purposes outlined in subsection 1 of this section.

29 5. The acceptance and use of federal funds shall not commit any state funds, nor place any
30 obligation upon the general assembly to continue the programs or activities outlined in the federal

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1 fund award for which the federal funds are available.

2 6. The state treasurer shall administer the fund, and the moneys in the fund shall be used
 3 solely, upon appropriation, by the department [of health and senior services, in consultation]. The
 4 department may consult with the organ donation advisory committee[, for implementation of organ
 5 donation awareness programs in the manner prescribed in subsection 2 of section 194.300] about the
 6 implementation of programming and related expenditures.

7 7. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, moneys in the organ
 8 donor program fund at the end of any biennium shall not be transferred to the credit of the general
 9 revenue fund. There shall be no money appropriated from general revenue to administer the fund in
 10 the event the fund cannot sustain itself."; and

 12 Further amend said bill, Page 26, Section 194.299, Lines 1-19, by deleting all of said section and
 13 line and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
 14

15 "194.299. The moneys in the organ donor program fund shall be expended as follows:

16 (1) ~~[Grants by]~~ The department of health and senior services ~~[to]~~ may enter into contracts
 17 with certified organ procurement organizations, other organizations, individuals, and institutions for
 18 services furthering the development and implementation of organ donation awareness programs in
 19 this state;

20 (2) Education and awareness initiatives, donor family recognition efforts, training, strategic
 21 planning efforts, and registry initiatives;

22 (3) Publication of informational pamphlets or booklets by the department of health and
 23 senior services and the advisory committee regarding organ donations and donations to the organ
 24 donor program fund when obtaining or renewing a license to operate a motor vehicle pursuant to
 25 subsection 2 of section 302.171;

26 ~~[(3)]~~ (4) Maintenance of a central registry of potential organ, eye, and tissue donors
 27 pursuant to subsection 1 of section 194.304; and

28 (4) ~~(5)~~ Implementation of organ donation awareness programs in the secondary schools of
 29 this state by the department of elementary and secondary education; and

30 (6) Reimbursements for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred by advisory committee
 31 members pursuant to subsection 2 of section 194.300."; and

 33 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
 34 accordingly.
