1	4. Opon creation of the review committee, the department of corrections shan perform an initial	
2	assessment of the department and report such assessment to the review committee. During the assessment,	
3	the department shall also be required to do, at a minimum, the following:	
4	(1) Investigate complaints related to incarcerated persons' health, safety, welfare, and rights;	
5	(2) Identify issues within the department of corrections. Such issues may include, but are not limited	
6	to, the following:	
7	(a) Sanitation in prison facilities;	
8	(b) Access to proper nutrition and a clean and adequate water supply;	
9	(c) Livable temperatures in prison facilities;	
10	(d) Physical or sexual abuse from fellow inmates;
