"Section 1. A person commits the offense of tampering with a public official if, with the purpose to harass, intimidate, or influence a public official in the performance of such official's official duties, such person disseminates through any means, including by posting on the internet, the public official's family's personal information. For purposes of this section, "personal information" includes a home address, Social Security number, federal tax identification number, checking or savings account numbers, marital status, and identity of a child under eighteen years of age. For the purposes of this section, the term "public official" includes current or former members of the general assembly, statewide elected officials, first responders, children's division employees, and employees of the department of corrections. The offense of tampering with a public official shall be a class D felony. If a violation of this section results in death or bodily injury to a public official or a member of the public official's family, the offense shall be a class B felony. "; and
