1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for Senate Substitute for Senate Committee Substitute for
2 Senate Bill No. 834, Page 12, Section 217.947, Line 9, by inserting after said section and line the
3 following:
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5 "301.020. 1. Every owner of a motor vehicle or trailer, which shall be operated or driven
6 upon the highways of this state, except as herein otherwise expressly provided, shall annually file,
7 by mail or otherwise, in the office of the director of revenue, an application for registration on a
8 blank to be furnished by the director of revenue for that purpose containing:

9 (1) A brief description of the motor vehicle or trailer to be registered, including the name of
10 the manufacturer, the vehicle identification number, the amount of motive power of the motor
11 vehicle, stated in figures of horsepower and whether the motor vehicle is to be registered as a motor
12 vehicle primarily for business use as defined in section 301.010;

13 (2) The name, the applicant's identification number and address of the owner of such motor
14 vehicle or trailer;

15 (3) The gross weight of the vehicle and the desired load in pounds if the vehicle is a
16 commercial motor vehicle or trailer.

17 2. If the vehicle is a motor vehicle primarily for business use as defined in section 301.010
18 and if such vehicle ~~[is ten years of age or less and]~~ is model year 2012 or newer and has less than
19 one hundred fifty thousand miles on the odometer, the director of revenue shall retain the odometer
20 information provided in the vehicle inspection report, and provide for prompt access to such
21 information, together with the vehicle identification number for the motor vehicle to which such
22 information pertains, for a period of ten years after the receipt of such information. This section
23 shall not apply unless:

24 (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of ownership was submitted after July 1,
25 1989; and

26 (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a manufacturer's statement of origin.

27 3. If the vehicle is any motor vehicle other than a motor vehicle primarily for business use, a
28 recreational motor vehicle, motorcycle, motortricycle, autocycle, bus, or any commercial motor
29 vehicle licensed for over twelve thousand pounds and if such motor vehicle ~~[is ten years of age or~~
30 ~~less and]~~ is model year 2012 or newer and has less than one hundred fifty thousand miles on the

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1 odometer, the director of revenue shall retain the odometer information provided in the vehicle
2 inspection report, and provide for prompt access to such information, together with the vehicle
3 identification number for the motor vehicle to which such information pertains, for a period of ten
4 years after the receipt of such information. This subsection shall not apply unless:

5 (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of ownership was submitted after July 1,
6 1990; and

7 (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a manufacturer's statement of origin.

8 4. If the vehicle qualifies as a reconstructed motor vehicle, motor change vehicle, specially
9 constructed motor vehicle, non-USA-std motor vehicle, as defined in section 301.010, or prior
10 salvage as referenced in section 301.573, the owner or lienholder shall surrender the certificate of
11 ownership. The owner shall make an application for a new certificate of ownership, pay the
12 required title fee, and obtain the vehicle examination certificate required pursuant to subsection 9 of
13 section 301.190. If an insurance company pays a claim on a salvage vehicle as defined in section
14 301.010 and the owner retains the vehicle, as prior salvage, the vehicle shall only be required to
15 meet the examination requirements under subsection 10 of section 301.190. Notarized bills of sale
16 along with a copy of the front and back of the certificate of ownership for all major component parts
17 installed on the vehicle and invoices for all essential parts which are not defined as major
18 component parts shall accompany the application for a new certificate of ownership. If the vehicle
19 is a specially constructed motor vehicle, as defined in section 301.010, two pictures of the vehicle
20 shall be submitted with the application. If the vehicle is a kit vehicle, the applicant shall submit the
21 invoice and the manufacturer's statement of origin on the kit. If the vehicle requires the issuance of
22 a special number by the director of revenue or a replacement vehicle identification number, the
23 applicant shall submit the required application and application fee. All applications required under
24 this subsection shall be submitted with any applicable taxes which may be due on the purchase of
25 the vehicle or parts. The director of revenue shall appropriately designate "Reconstructed Motor
26 Vehicle", "Motor Change Vehicle", "Non-USA-Std Motor Vehicle", or "Specially Constructed
27 Motor Vehicle" on the current and all subsequent issues of the certificate of ownership of such
28 vehicle.

29 5. Every insurance company that pays a claim for repair of a motor vehicle which as the
30 result of such repairs becomes a reconstructed motor vehicle as defined in section 301.010 or that
31 pays a claim on a salvage vehicle as defined in section 301.010 and the owner is retaining the
32 vehicle shall in writing notify the owner of the vehicle, and in a first party claim, the lienholder if a
33 lien is in effect, that he is required to surrender the certificate of ownership, and the documents and
34 fees required pursuant to subsection 4 of this section to obtain a prior salvage motor vehicle
35 certificate of ownership or documents and fees as otherwise required by law to obtain a salvage
36 certificate of ownership, from the director of revenue. The insurance company shall within thirty
37 days of the payment of such claims report to the director of revenue the name and address of such
38 owner, the year, make, model, vehicle identification number, and license plate number of the
39 vehicle, and the date of loss and payment.

1 6. Anyone who fails to comply with the requirements of this section shall be guilty of a
2 class B misdemeanor.

3 7. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to promote a blindness
4 education, screening and treatment program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and
5 deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of the blindness education, screening and
6 treatment program fund established in section 209.015. Moneys in the blindness education,
7 screening and treatment program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established in section
8 209.015; except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one percent for its
9 administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be refused by
10 the applicant for registration at the time of issuance or renewal. The director shall inquire of each
11 applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed application to the director whether the
12 applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

13 8. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to promote an organ
14 donor program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such donations in
15 the state treasury to the credit of the organ donor program fund as established in sections 194.297 to
16 194.304. Moneys in the organ donor fund shall be used solely for the purposes established in
17 sections 194.297 to 194.304, except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one
18 percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may
19 be refused by the applicant for registration at the time of issuance or renewal. The director shall
20 inquire of each applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed application to the director
21 whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

22 9. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to the Missouri medal of
23 honor recipients fund. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such
24 donations in the state treasury to the credit of the Missouri medal of honor recipients fund as
25 established in section 226.925. Moneys in the medal of honor recipients fund shall be used solely
26 for the purposes established in section 226.925, except that the department of revenue shall retain no
27 more than one percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is
28 voluntary and may be refused by the applicant for registration at the time of issuance or renewal.
29 The director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed
30 application to the director whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation
31 prescribed in this subsection.

32 307.350. 1. The owner of every motor vehicle as defined in section 301.010 which is
33 required to be registered in this state, except:

34 (1) Motor vehicles having less than one hundred fifty thousand miles~~], for the ten-year~~
35 ~~period following their model year of manufacture]~~ and of model year 2012 or newer, excluding prior
36 salvage vehicles immediately following a rebuilding process and vehicles subject to the provisions
37 of section 307.380;

38 (2) Those motor vehicles which are engaged in interstate commerce and are proportionately
39 registered in this state with the Missouri highway reciprocity commission, although the owner may

1 request that such vehicle be inspected by an official inspection station, and a peace officer may stop
2 and inspect such vehicles to determine whether the mechanical condition is in compliance with the
3 safety regulations established by the United States Department of Transportation; and

4 (3) Historic motor vehicles registered pursuant to section 301.131;

5 (4) Vehicles registered in excess of twenty-four thousand pounds for a period of less than
6 twelve months;

8 shall submit such vehicles to a biennial inspection of their mechanism and equipment in accordance
9 with the provisions of sections 307.350 to 307.390 and obtain a certificate of inspection and
10 approval and a sticker, seal, or other device from a duly authorized official inspection station. The
11 inspection, except the inspection of school buses which shall be made at the time provided in section
12 307.375, shall be made at the time prescribed in the rules and regulations issued by the
13 superintendent of the Missouri state highway patrol; but the inspection of a vehicle shall not be
14 made more than sixty days prior to the date of application for registration or within sixty days of
15 when a vehicle's registration is transferred; however, if a vehicle was purchased from a motor
16 vehicle dealer and a valid inspection had been made within sixty days of the purchase date, the new
17 owner shall be able to utilize an inspection performed within ninety days prior to the application for
18 registration or transfer. Any vehicle manufactured as an even-numbered model year vehicle shall be
19 inspected and approved pursuant to the safety inspection program established pursuant to sections
20 307.350 to 307.390 in each even-numbered calendar year and any such vehicle manufactured as an
21 odd-numbered model year vehicle shall be inspected and approved pursuant to sections 307.350 to
22 307.390 in each odd-numbered year. The certificate of inspection and approval shall be a sticker,
23 seal, or other device or combination thereof, as the superintendent of the Missouri state highway
24 patrol prescribes by regulation and shall be displayed upon the motor vehicle or trailer as prescribed
25 by the regulations established by him. The replacement of certificates of inspection and approval
26 which are lost or destroyed shall be made by the superintendent of the Missouri state highway patrol
27 under regulations prescribed by him.

28 2. For the purpose of obtaining an inspection only, it shall be lawful to operate a vehicle
29 over the most direct route between the owner's usual place of residence and an inspection station of
30 such owner's choice, notwithstanding the fact that the vehicle does not have a current state
31 registration license. It shall also be lawful to operate such a vehicle from an inspection station to
32 another place where repairs may be made and to return the vehicle to the inspection station
33 notwithstanding the absence of a current state registration license.

34 3. No person whose motor vehicle was duly inspected and approved as provided in this
35 section shall be required to have the same motor vehicle again inspected and approved for the sole
36 reason that such person wishes to obtain a set of any special personalized license plates available
37 pursuant to section 301.144 or a set of any license plates available pursuant to section 301.142, prior
38 to the expiration date of such motor vehicle's current registration.

39 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 307.390, violation of this section shall be
