AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 2704, Page 38, Section 196.3021, Line 24, by deleting the word "and"; and
Further amend said bill, page, and section, Line 26, by inserting after the number "196.3047" the following:
"; and (6) Twenty percent of remaining funds shall be disbursed to cover the costs of expungement under section 610.135"; and
Further amend said bill, Pages 73-74, Section 610.135, Lines 1-37, by deleting said lines and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
"610.135. 1. Notwithstanding any provisions of law, the court in which a person was
convicted of an offense involving marijuana, marijuana products, or marijuana drug paraphernalia,
that was originally charged as such and not reduced by plea agreement, committed prior to the
enactment of sections 196.3000 to 196.3048, including any person currently in jail, on probation or
parole, or has been released from jail, probation, or parole, shall automatically expunge the record
for such offense if such offense occurred within the state of Missouri and was prosecuted under the
jurisdiction of a Missouri court.
2. For offenses under subsection 1 of this section that occurred:
(1) Before August 28, 2001, the record shall be expunged before August 28, 2024;
(2) After August 27, 2001, but before August 28, 2014, the record shall be expunged before
August 28, 2026; and
(3) After August 27, 2014, but before August 28, 2022, the record shall be expunged before
August 28, 2028.
3. Upon the court's granting the order of expungement under this section, the records and
files maintained in any court proceeding in an associate or a circuit division of the circuit court or in
a municipal court under this section shall be confidential and available only to the parties or by
order of the court for good cause shown. The effect of expungement under this section shall be to
restore such person to the status he or she occupied prior to such arrest, plea, or conviction and as if
such event had never taken place. If expungement under this section has been ordered, no such
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person shall be held thereafter under any provision of any law to be guilty of perjury or otherwise giving a false statement by reason of his or her failure to recite or acknowledge such arrest, plea, trial, conviction, or expungement in response to any inquiry made of him or her for any purpose, and no such inquiry shall be made for information relating to an expungement under this section.

4. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to authorize expungement of any conviction or plea of guilty for any offense committed by a commercial driver's license holder that shall result in a violation of 49 CFR 384.226, as amended, or an offense committed by a person while operating a commercial motor vehicle in violation of 49 CFR 391.15."; and

Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.
