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**AN ACT**

To repeal sections 37.020, 57.278, 143.121, 195.017, 195.815, 288.045, 362.105, 369.144, 370.070, 577.001, 579.015, 579.020, 579.030, 579.055, 579.065, 579.068, and 579.105, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof forty-eight new sections relating to marijuana, with penalty provisions.

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*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Sections 37.020, 57.278, 143.121, 195.017, 195.815, 288.045, 362.105, 2 369.144, 370.070, 577.001, 579.015, 579.020, 579.030, 579.055, 579.065, 579.068, and 3 579.105, RSMo, are repealed and forty-eight new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be 4 known as sections 37.020, 57.278, 143.121, 191.255, 195.006, 195.017, 195.815, 196.3000, 5 196.3003, 196.3006, 196.3009, 196.3012, 196.3015, 196.3018, 196.3021, 196.3024, 6 196.3026, 196.3027, 196.3028, 196.3029, 196.3031, 196.3032, 196.3036, 196.3042, 7 196.3045, 196.3047, 196.3048, 288.045, 362.033, 362.105, 369.144, 369.326, 370.064, 8 370.070, 557.059, 577.001, 579.015, 579.020, 579.030, 579.055, 579.065, 579.068, 579.105, 9 610.135, 1, 2, 3, and 4, to read as follows:

37.020. 1. As used in this section, the following words and phrases mean:

2 (1) "Certification", the determination, through whatever procedure is used by the 3 office of administration, that a legal entity is a socially and economically disadvantaged small 4 business concern for purposes of this section;

5 (2) "Department", the office of administration and any public institution of higher 6 learning in the state of Missouri;

7 (3) "Minority business enterprise", a business that is:

8 (a) A sole proprietorship owned and controlled by a minority;

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets **[thus]** in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

9 (b) A partnership or joint venture owned and controlled by minorities in which at  
10 least fifty-one percent of the ownership interest is held by minorities and the management and  
11 daily business operations of which are controlled by one or more of the minorities who own  
12 it; or

13 (c) A corporation or other entity whose management and daily business operations  
14 are controlled by one or more minorities who own it, and which is at least fifty-one percent  
15 owned by one or more minorities, or if stock is issued, at least fifty-one percent of the stock is  
16 owned by one or more minorities;

17 (4) "Socially and economically disadvantaged individuals", individuals, regardless of  
18 gender, who have been subjected to racial, ethnic, or sexual prejudice or cultural bias because  
19 of their identity as a member of a group without regard to their individual qualities and whose  
20 ability to compete in the free enterprise system has been impaired due to diminished capital  
21 and credit opportunities as compared to others in the same business area. In determining the  
22 degree of diminished credit and capital opportunities the office of administration shall  
23 consider, but not be limited to, the assets and net worth of such individual;

24 (5) "Socially and economically disadvantaged small business concern", any small  
25 business concern:

26 (a) Which is at least fifty-one percentum owned by one or more socially and  
27 economically disadvantaged individuals; or, in the case of any publicly owned business, at  
28 least fifty-one percentum of the stock of which is owned by one or more socially and  
29 economically disadvantaged individuals; and

30 (b) Whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more  
31 of such individuals;

32 (6) "Women's business enterprise", a business that is:

33 (a) A sole proprietorship owned and controlled by a woman;

34 (b) A partnership or joint venture owned and controlled by women in which at least  
35 fifty-one percent of the ownership interest is held by women and the management and daily  
36 business operations of which are controlled by one or more of the women who own it; or

37 (c) A corporation or other entity whose management and daily business operations  
38 are controlled by one or more women who own it, and which is at least fifty-one percent  
39 owned by women, or if stock is issued, at least fifty-one percent of the stock is owned by one  
40 or more women.

41

42 **For purposes of this section, "woman" refers to the female biological sex assigned at**  
43 **birth, the proof of which is identified by a birth certificate.**

44 2. The office of administration, in consultation with each department, shall establish  
45 and implement a plan to increase and maintain the participation of certified socially and

46 economically disadvantaged small business concerns or minority business enterprises,  
47 directly or indirectly, in contracts for supplies, services, and construction contracts, consistent  
48 with goals determined after an appropriate study conducted to determine the availability of  
49 socially and economically disadvantaged small business concerns and minority business  
50 enterprises in the marketplace. The commissioner of administration shall appoint an  
51 oversight review committee to oversee and review the results of such study. The committee  
52 shall be composed of nine members, four of whom shall be members of business, three of  
53 whom shall be from staff of selected departments, one of whom shall be a member of the  
54 house of representatives, and one of whom shall be a member of the senate.

55 3. The goals to be pursued by each department under the provisions of this section  
56 shall be construed to overlap with those imposed by federal law or regulation, if any, shall run  
57 concurrently therewith and shall be in addition to the amount required by federal law only to  
58 the extent the percentage set by this section exceeds those required by federal law or  
59 regulations.

60 4. The commissioner of administration may designate a nonprofit organization as a  
61 minority business enterprise or women's business enterprise for the exclusive purpose of  
62 competing in other states, provided that the organization is headquartered in Missouri and the  
63 collective majority of the organization's board of directors and executive management in  
64 charge of daily business operations are minorities or women.

57.278. 1. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Deputy Sheriff Salary  
2 Supplementation Fund", which shall consist of money collected from charges for service  
3 received by county sheriffs under subsection 4 of section 57.280 **and from disbursements of**  
4 **the cannabis freedom fund under subsection 3 of section 196.3021**. The money in the  
5 fund shall be used solely to supplement the salaries, and employee benefits resulting from  
6 such salary increases, of county deputy sheriffs. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the  
7 fund and may approve disbursements from the fund in accordance with sections 30.170 and  
8 30.180. The Missouri sheriff methamphetamine relief taskforce created under section  
9 650.350 shall administer the fund.

10 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys  
11 remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general  
12 revenue fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other  
13 funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to  
14 the fund.

143.121. 1. The Missouri adjusted gross income of a resident individual shall be the  
2 taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income subject to the modifications in this section.

3 2. There shall be added to the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income:

4 (1) The amount of any federal income tax refund received for a prior year which  
5 resulted in a Missouri income tax benefit. The amount added pursuant to this subdivision  
6 shall not include any amount of a federal income tax refund attributable to a tax credit  
7 reducing a taxpayer's federal tax liability pursuant to Public Law 116-136 or 116-260, enacted  
8 by the 116th United States Congress, for the tax year beginning on or after January 1, 2020,  
9 and ending on or before December 31, 2020, and deducted from Missouri adjusted gross  
10 income pursuant to section 143.171. The amount added under this subdivision shall also not  
11 include any amount of a federal income tax refund attributable to a tax credit reducing a  
12 taxpayer's federal tax liability under any other federal law that provides direct economic  
13 impact payments to taxpayers to mitigate financial challenges related to the COVID-19  
14 pandemic, and deducted from Missouri adjusted gross income under section 143.171;

15 (2) Interest on certain governmental obligations excluded from federal gross income  
16 by 26 U.S.C. Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended. The previous sentence  
17 shall not apply to interest on obligations of the state of Missouri or any of its political  
18 subdivisions or authorities and shall not apply to the interest described in subdivision (1) of  
19 subsection 3 of this section. The amount added pursuant to this subdivision shall be reduced  
20 by the amounts applicable to such interest that would have been deductible in computing the  
21 taxable income of the taxpayer except only for the application of 26 U.S.C. Section 265 of the  
22 Internal Revenue Code, as amended. The reduction shall only be made if it is at least five  
23 hundred dollars;

24 (3) The amount of any deduction that is included in the computation of federal  
25 taxable income pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Section 168 of the Internal Revenue Code as amended  
26 by the Job Creation and Worker Assistance Act of 2002 to the extent the amount deducted  
27 relates to property purchased on or after July 1, 2002, but before July 1, 2003, and to the  
28 extent the amount deducted exceeds the amount that would have been deductible pursuant to  
29 26 U.S.C. Section 168 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as in effect on January 1, 2002;

30 (4) The amount of any deduction that is included in the computation of federal  
31 taxable income for net operating loss allowed by 26 U.S.C. Section 172 of the Internal  
32 Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, other than the deduction allowed by 26 U.S.C. Section  
33 172(b)(1)(G) and 26 U.S.C. Section 172(i) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as  
34 amended, for a net operating loss the taxpayer claims in the tax year in which the net  
35 operating loss occurred or carries forward for a period of more than twenty years and carries  
36 backward for more than two years. Any amount of net operating loss taken against federal  
37 taxable income but disallowed for Missouri income tax purposes pursuant to this subdivision  
38 after June 18, 2002, may be carried forward and taken against any income on the Missouri  
39 income tax return for a period of not more than twenty years from the year of the initial loss;  
40 and

41 (5) For nonresident individuals in all taxable years ending on or after December 31,  
42 2006, the amount of any property taxes paid to another state or a political subdivision of  
43 another state for which a deduction was allowed on such nonresident's federal return in the  
44 taxable year unless such state, political subdivision of a state, or the District of Columbia  
45 allows a subtraction from income for property taxes paid to this state for purposes of  
46 calculating income for the income tax for such state, political subdivision of a state, or the  
47 District of Columbia;

48 (6) For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2018, any interest expense paid  
49 or accrued in a previous taxable year, but allowed as a deduction under 26 U.S.C. Section  
50 163, as amended, in the current taxable year by reason of the carryforward of disallowed  
51 business interest provisions of 26 U.S.C. Section 163(j), as amended. For the purposes of this  
52 subdivision, an interest expense is considered paid or accrued only in the first taxable year the  
53 deduction would have been allowable under 26 U.S.C. Section 163, as amended, if the  
54 limitation under 26 U.S.C. Section 163(j), as amended, did not exist.

55 3. There shall be subtracted from the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income the  
56 following amounts to the extent included in federal adjusted gross income:

57 (1) Interest received on deposits held at a federal reserve bank or interest or dividends  
58 on obligations of the United States and its territories and possessions or of any authority,  
59 commission or instrumentality of the United States to the extent exempt from Missouri  
60 income taxes pursuant to the laws of the United States. The amount subtracted pursuant to  
61 this subdivision shall be reduced by any interest on indebtedness incurred to carry the  
62 described obligations or securities and by any expenses incurred in the production of interest  
63 or dividend income described in this subdivision. The reduction in the previous sentence  
64 shall only apply to the extent that such expenses including amortizable bond premiums are  
65 deducted in determining the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income or included in the  
66 taxpayer's Missouri itemized deduction. The reduction shall only be made if the expenses  
67 total at least five hundred dollars;

68 (2) The portion of any gain, from the sale or other disposition of property having a  
69 higher adjusted basis to the taxpayer for Missouri income tax purposes than for federal  
70 income tax purposes on December 31, 1972, that does not exceed such difference in basis. If  
71 a gain is considered a long-term capital gain for federal income tax purposes, the modification  
72 shall be limited to one-half of such portion of the gain;

73 (3) The amount necessary to prevent the taxation pursuant to this chapter of any  
74 annuity or other amount of income or gain which was properly included in income or gain and  
75 was taxed pursuant to the laws of Missouri for a taxable year prior to January 1, 1973, to the  
76 taxpayer, or to a decedent by reason of whose death the taxpayer acquired the right to receive

77 the income or gain, or to a trust or estate from which the taxpayer received the income or  
78 gain;

79 (4) Accumulation distributions received by a taxpayer as a beneficiary of a trust to the  
80 extent that the same are included in federal adjusted gross income;

81 (5) The amount of any state income tax refund for a prior year which was included in  
82 the federal adjusted gross income;

83 (6) The portion of capital gain specified in section 135.357 that would otherwise be  
84 included in federal adjusted gross income;

85 (7) The amount that would have been deducted in the computation of federal taxable  
86 income pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Section 168 of the Internal Revenue Code as in effect on  
87 January 1, 2002, to the extent that amount relates to property purchased on or after July 1,  
88 2002, but before July 1, 2003, and to the extent that amount exceeds the amount actually  
89 deducted pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Section 168 of the Internal Revenue Code as amended by the  
90 Job Creation and Worker Assistance Act of 2002;

91 (8) For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2005, the amount of any income  
92 received for military service while the taxpayer serves in a combat zone which is included in  
93 federal adjusted gross income and not otherwise excluded therefrom. As used in this section,  
94 "combat zone" means any area which the President of the United States by Executive Order  
95 designates as an area in which Armed Forces of the United States are or have engaged in  
96 combat. Service is performed in a combat zone only if performed on or after the date  
97 designated by the President by Executive Order as the date of the commencing of combat  
98 activities in such zone, and on or before the date designated by the President by Executive  
99 Order as the date of the termination of combatant activities in such zone;

100 (9) For all tax years ending on or after July 1, 2002, with respect to qualified property  
101 that is sold or otherwise disposed of during a taxable year by a taxpayer and for which an  
102 additional modification was made under subdivision (3) of subsection 2 of this section, the  
103 amount by which additional modification made under subdivision (3) of subsection 2 of this  
104 section on qualified property has not been recovered through the additional subtractions  
105 provided in subdivision (7) of this subsection;

106 (10) For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2014, the amount of any  
107 income received as payment from any program which provides compensation to agricultural  
108 producers who have suffered a loss as the result of a disaster or emergency, including the:

109 (a) Livestock Forage Disaster Program;

110 (b) Livestock Indemnity Program;

111 (c) Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm-Raised Fish;

112 (d) Emergency Conservation Program;

113 (e) Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program;

114 (f) Pasture, Rangeland, Forage Pilot Insurance Program;

115 (g) Annual Forage Pilot Program;

116 (h) Livestock Risk Protection Insurance Plan;

117 (i) Livestock Gross Margin Insurance Plan;

118 (11) For all tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2018, any interest expense paid  
119 or accrued in the current taxable year, but not deducted as a result of the limitation imposed  
120 under 26 U.S.C. Section 163(j), as amended. For the purposes of this subdivision, an interest  
121 expense is considered paid or accrued only in the first taxable year the deduction would have  
122 been allowable under 26 U.S.C. Section 163, as amended, if the limitation under 26 U.S.C.  
123 Section 163(j), as amended, did not exist; ~~and~~

124 (12) One hundred percent of any retirement benefits received by any taxpayer as a  
125 result of the taxpayer's service in the Armed Forces of the United States, including reserve  
126 components and the National Guard of this state, as defined in 32 U.S.C. Sections 101(3) and  
127 109, and any other military force organized under the laws of this state; **and**

128 **(13) For taxpayers authorized to conduct business under Article XIV of the**  
129 **Constitution of Missouri or sections 196.3000 to 196.3048, the amount that would have**  
130 **been deducted from the computation of the taxpayer's federal taxable income if such a**  
131 **deduction were not disallowed under 26 U.S.C. Section 280E, as in effect on January 1,**  
132 **2022, because of the status of marijuana as a controlled substance under federal law.**

133 4. There shall be added to or subtracted from the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross  
134 income the taxpayer's share of the Missouri fiduciary adjustment provided in section 143.351.

135 5. There shall be added to or subtracted from the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross  
136 income the modifications provided in section 143.411.

137 6. In addition to the modifications to a taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income in this  
138 section, to calculate Missouri adjusted gross income there shall be subtracted from the  
139 taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income any gain recognized pursuant to 26 U.S.C. Section  
140 1033 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, arising from compulsory or  
141 involuntary conversion of property as a result of condemnation or the imminence thereof.

142 7. (1) As used in this subsection, "qualified health insurance premium" means the  
143 amount paid during the tax year by such taxpayer for any insurance policy primarily  
144 providing health care coverage for the taxpayer, the taxpayer's spouse, or the taxpayer's  
145 dependents.

146 (2) In addition to the subtractions in subsection 3 of this section, one hundred percent  
147 of the amount of qualified health insurance premiums shall be subtracted from the taxpayer's  
148 federal adjusted gross income to the extent the amount paid for such premiums is included in  
149 federal taxable income. The taxpayer shall provide the department of revenue with proof of  
150 the amount of qualified health insurance premiums paid.

151           8. (1) Beginning January 1, 2014, in addition to the subtractions provided in this  
152 section, one hundred percent of the cost incurred by a taxpayer for a home energy audit  
153 conducted by an entity certified by the department of natural resources under section 640.153  
154 or the implementation of any energy efficiency recommendations made in such an audit shall  
155 be subtracted from the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income to the extent the amount paid  
156 for any such activity is included in federal taxable income. The taxpayer shall provide the  
157 department of revenue with a summary of any recommendations made in a qualified home  
158 energy audit, the name and certification number of the qualified home energy auditor who  
159 conducted the audit, and proof of the amount paid for any activities under this subsection for  
160 which a deduction is claimed. The taxpayer shall also provide a copy of the summary of any  
161 recommendations made in a qualified home energy audit to the department of natural  
162 resources.

163           (2) At no time shall a deduction claimed under this subsection by an individual  
164 taxpayer or taxpayers filing combined returns exceed one thousand dollars per year for  
165 individual taxpayers or cumulatively exceed two thousand dollars per year for taxpayers  
166 filing combined returns.

167           (3) Any deduction claimed under this subsection shall be claimed for the tax year in  
168 which the qualified home energy audit was conducted or in which the implementation of the  
169 energy efficiency recommendations occurred. If implementation of the energy efficiency  
170 recommendations occurred during more than one year, the deduction may be claimed in more  
171 than one year, subject to the limitations provided under subdivision (2) of this subsection.

172           (4) A deduction shall not be claimed for any otherwise eligible activity under this  
173 subsection if such activity qualified for and received any rebate or other incentive through a  
174 state-sponsored energy program or through an electric corporation, gas corporation, electric  
175 cooperative, or municipally owned utility.

176           9. The provisions of subsection 8 of this section shall expire on December 31, 2020.

**191.255. 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, no state  
2 agency, including employees therein, shall disclose to the federal government, any  
3 federal government employee, or any unauthorized third party the statewide list or any  
4 individual information of persons who have applied for or obtained a qualifying patient  
5 identification card, a qualifying patient cultivation identification card, or a primary  
6 caregiver identification card, as those cards are described in Article XIV, Section 1 of  
7 the Constitution of Missouri relating to the right to access medical marijuana.**

**8           2. Any violation of this section is a class E felony.**

**195.006. Notwithstanding any provision under this chapter or any other  
2 provision of law, beginning August 28, 2022, marijuana shall no longer be listed among**

3 **Missouri's drug schedules and shall no longer be considered a controlled substance or a**  
4 **drug.**

195.017. 1. The department of health and senior services shall place a substance in  
2 Schedule I if it finds that the substance:

3 (1) Has high potential for abuse; and

4 (2) Has no accepted medical use in treatment in the United States or lacks accepted  
5 safety for use in treatment under medical supervision.

6 2. Schedule I:

7 (1) The controlled substances listed in this subsection are included in Schedule I;

8 (2) Any of the following opiates, including their isomers, esters, ethers, salts, and  
9 salts of isomers, esters, and ethers, unless specifically excepted, whenever the existence of

- 783 salts, isomers and salts of isomers:

- 785 (b) Diethylpropion;
- 786 (c) Fencamfamin;
- 787 (d) Fenproporex;
- 788 (e) Mazindol;
- 789 (f) Mefenorex;
- 790 (g) Modafinil;
- 791 (h) Pemoline, including organometallic complexes and chelates thereof;
- 792 (i) Phentermine;
- 793 (j) Pipradrol;
- 794 (k) Sibutramine;
- 795 (l) SPA ((-)-1-dimethylamino-1,2-diphenylethane);
- 796 (6) Any material, compound, mixture or preparation containing any quantity of the
- 797 following substance, including its salts:
- 798 (a) Butorphanol (including its optical isomers);
- 799 (b) Eluxadoline (5-[[[(2S)-2-amino-3-[4-aminocarbonyl]-2,6-dimethylphenyl]-1-
- 800 oxopropyl][(1S)-1-(4-phenyl-1 H-imidazol-2-yl)ethyl]amino]methyl]-2-methoxybenzoic
- 801 acid) (including its optical isomers) and its salts, isomers, and salts of isomers;
- 802 (c) Pentazocine;
- 803 (7) Ephedrine, its salts, optical isomers and salts of optical isomers, when the
- 804 substance is the only active medicinal ingredient;

805 (8) The department of health and senior services may except by rule any compound,  
806 mixture, or preparation containing any depressant substance listed in subdivision (1) of this  
807 subsection from the application of all or any part of sections 195.010 to 195.320 and sections  
808 579.015 to 579.086 if the compound, mixture, or preparation contains one or more active  
809 medicinal ingredients not having a depressant effect on the central nervous system, and if the  
810 admixtures are included therein in combinations, quantity, proportion, or concentration that  
811 vitiate the potential for abuse of the substances which have a depressant effect on the central  
812 nervous system.

813 9. The department of health and senior services shall place a substance in Schedule V  
814 if it finds that:

815 (1) The substance has low potential for abuse relative to the controlled substances  
816 listed in Schedule IV;

817 (2) The substance has currently accepted medical use in treatment in the United  
818 States; and

819 (3) The substance has limited physical dependence or psychological dependence  
820 liability relative to the controlled substances listed in Schedule IV.

821 10. The controlled substances listed in this subsection are included in Schedule V:

822 (1) Any compound, mixture or preparation containing any of the following narcotic  
823 drugs or their salts calculated as the free anhydrous base or alkaloid, in limited quantities as  
824 set forth below, which also contains one or more nonnarcotic active medicinal ingredients in  
825 sufficient proportion to confer upon the compound, mixture or preparation valuable medicinal  
826 qualities other than those possessed by the narcotic drug alone:

827 (a) Not more than two and five-tenths milligrams of diphenoxylate and not less than  
828 twenty-five micrograms of atropine sulfate per dosage unit;

829 (b) Not more than one hundred milligrams of opium per one hundred milliliters or per

831 (c) Not more than five-tenths milligram of difenoxin and not less than twenty-five  
832 micrograms of atropine sulfate per dosage unit;

833 (2) Any material, compound, mixture or preparation which contains any quantity of  
834 the following substance having a stimulant effect on the central nervous system including its  
835 salts, isomers and salts of isomers: pyrovalerone;

836 (3) Any compound, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of  
837 pseudoephedrine or its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers or any compound,  
838 mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of ephedrine or its salts or optical  
839 isomers, or salts of optical isomers;

840 (4) Unless specifically exempted or excluded or unless listed in another schedule, any  
841 material, compound, mixture, or preparation which contains any quantity of the following  
842 substances having a depressant effect on the central nervous system, including its salts:

843 (a) Brivaracetam ((2S)-2-[(4R)-2-oxo-4-propylpyrrolidin-1-yl]butanamide) (also  
844 referred to as BRV; UCB-34714; Briviact);

845 (b) Ezogabine [N-[2-amino-4(4-fluorobenzylamino)-phenyl]-carbamic acid ethyl  
846 ester];

847 (c) Lacosamide [(R)-2-acetoamido-N-benzyl-3-methoxy-propionamide];

848 (d) Pregabalin [(S)-3-(aminomethyl)-5-methylhexanoic acid];

849 (5) Any drug product in finished dosage formulation that has been approved by the  
850 U.S. Food and Drug Administration that contains cannabidiol (2-[1R-3-methyl-6R-(1-  
851 methylethenyl)-2-cyclohexen-1-yl]-5-pentyl-1,3-benzenediol) derived from cannabis and no  
852 more than 0.1 percent (w/w) residual tetrahydro cannabinoids.

853 11. If any compound, mixture, or preparation as specified in subdivision (3) of  
854 subsection 10 of this section is dispensed, sold, or distributed in a pharmacy without a  
855 prescription:

856 (1) All packages of any compound, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable  
857 quantity of pseudoephedrine, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers or  
858 ephedrine, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical isomers, shall be offered for sale only  
859 from behind a pharmacy counter where the public is not permitted, and only by a registered  
860 pharmacist or registered pharmacy technician; and

861 (2) Any person purchasing, receiving or otherwise acquiring any compound, mixture,  
862 or preparation containing any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine, its salts or optical  
863 isomers, or salts of optical isomers or ephedrine, its salts or optical isomers, or salts of optical  
864 isomers shall be at least eighteen years of age; and

865 (3) The pharmacist, intern pharmacist, or registered pharmacy technician shall require  
866 any person, prior to such person's purchasing, receiving or otherwise acquiring such  
867 compound, mixture, or preparation to furnish suitable photo identification that is issued by a  
868 state or the federal government or a document that, with respect to identification, is  
869 considered acceptable and showing the date of birth of the person;

870 (4) The seller shall deliver the product directly into the custody of the purchaser.

871 12. Pharmacists, intern pharmacists, and registered pharmacy technicians shall  
872 implement and maintain an electronic log of each transaction. Such log shall include the  
873 following information:

874 (1) The name, address, and signature of the purchaser;

875 (2) The amount of the compound, mixture, or preparation purchased;

876 (3) The date and time of each purchase; and

877 (4) The name or initials of the pharmacist, intern pharmacist, or registered pharmacy  
878 technician who dispensed the compound, mixture, or preparation to the purchaser.

879 13. Each pharmacy shall submit information regarding sales of any compound,  
880 mixture, or preparation as specified in subdivision (3) of subsection 10 of this section in  
881 accordance with transmission methods and frequency established by the department by  
882 regulation;

883 14. No person shall dispense, sell, purchase, receive, or otherwise acquire quantities  
884 greater than those specified in this chapter.

885 15. All persons who dispense or offer for sale pseudoephedrine and ephedrine  
886 products in a pharmacy shall ensure that all such products are located only behind a pharmacy  
887 counter where the public is not permitted.

888 16. The penalties for a knowing or reckless violation of the provisions of subsections  
889 11 to 15 of this section are found in section 579.060.

890 17. The scheduling of substances specified in subdivision (3) of subsection 10 of this  
891 section and subsections 11, 12, 14, and 15 of this section shall not apply to any compounds,  
892 mixtures, or preparations that are in liquid or liquid-filled gel capsule form or to any  
893 compound, mixture, or preparation specified in subdivision (3) of subsection 10 of this  
894 section which must be dispensed, sold, or distributed in a pharmacy pursuant to a  
895 prescription.

896 18. The manufacturer of a drug product or another interested party may apply with  
897 the department of health and senior services for an exemption from this section. The  
898 department of health and senior services may grant an exemption by rule from this section if  
899 the department finds the drug product is not used in the illegal manufacture of  
900 methamphetamine or other controlled or dangerous substances. The department of health  
901 and senior services shall rely on reports from law enforcement and law enforcement  
902 evidentiary laboratories in determining if the proposed product can be used to manufacture  
903 illicit controlled substances.

904 19. The department of health and senior services shall revise and republish the  
905 schedules annually.

906 20. The department of health and senior services shall promulgate rules under chapter  
907 536 regarding the security and storage of Schedule V controlled substances, as described in  
908 subdivision (3) of subsection 10 of this section, for distributors as registered by the  
909 department of health and senior services.

910 21. Logs of transactions required to be kept and maintained by this section and  
911 section 195.417 shall create a rebuttable presumption that the person whose name appears in  
912 the logs is the person whose transactions are recorded in the logs.

195.815. 1. The department of health and senior services shall require all officers, 2 managers, contractors, employees, and other support staff of licensed or certified medical 3 marijuana facilities, and all owners of such medical marijuana facilities who will have access 4 to the facilities or to the facilities' medical marijuana, **or the cannabis enforcement** 5 **authority shall require all officers, managers, contractors, employees, and other support** 6 **staff of marijuana businesses, and all owners of such marijuana businesses,** to submit 7 fingerprints to the Missouri state highway patrol for the purpose of conducting a state and 8 federal fingerprint-based criminal background check.

9 2. The department **or authority** may require that such fingerprint submissions be 10 made as part of a medical marijuana facility **or marijuana business** application [~~for licensure~~ 11 ~~or certification~~], a medical marijuana facility **or marijuana business renewal** application 12 [~~for renewal of licensure or certification~~], and an individual's application for **licensure under** 13 **sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 or licensure and issuance of** an identification card 14 authorizing that individual to be an owner, officer, manager, contractor, employee, or other 15 support staff of a medical marijuana facility **or marijuana business**.

16 3. Fingerprint cards and any required fees shall be sent to the Missouri state highway 17 patrol's central repository. The fingerprints shall be used for searching the state criminal 18 records repository and shall also be forwarded to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a 19 federal criminal records search under section 43.540. The Missouri state highway patrol shall 20 notify the department of any criminal history record information or lack of criminal history 21 record information discovered on the individual. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 22 610.120 to the contrary, all records related to any criminal history information discovered 23 shall be accessible and available to the department.

24 4. As used in this section, the following words shall mean:

25 (1) "Employee", [~~any~~] a person performing work or service of any kind or character 26 for hire in a medical marijuana facility;

27 (2) "Medical marijuana facility", an entity licensed or certified by the department of 28 health and senior services, or its successor agency, to acquire, cultivate, process, manufacture, 29 test, store, sell, transport, or deliver medical marijuana;

30 (3) "Other support staff", any person performing work or service of any kind or 31 character, other than employees, on behalf of a medical marijuana facility if such a person 32 would have access to the medical marijuana facility or its medical marijuana or related 33 equipment or supplies.

**196.3000. Sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 shall be known and may be cited as the** 2 **"Cannabis Freedom Act".**

**196.3003. As used in sections 196.3000 to 196.3048, the following terms mean:**

2           (1) "Authority", the cannabis enforcement authority (CEA) within the  
3 department;

4           (2) "Consumer", a person twenty-one years of age or older who purchases  
5 marijuana, marijuana products, or marijuana accessories for personal use but not for  
6 resale to others;

7           (3) "Department", the department of health and senior services;

8           (4) "Marijuana", all parts of the plant of the genus *Cannabis*, whether growing;  
9 the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound,  
10 manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant, its seeds, or its resin,  
11 including marijuana concentrate. "Marijuana" shall not include industrial hemp, nor  
12 shall it include fiber produced from the stalks, oil, or cake made from the seeds of the  
13 plant; sterilized seed of the plant that is incapable of germination; or the weight of any  
14 other ingredient combined with marijuana to prepare topical or oral administrations,  
15 food, drink, or other products;

16           (5) "Marijuana accessories", any equipment, products, or materials of any kind  
17 that are used, intended for use, or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating,  
18 growing, harvesting, composting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing,  
19 processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, vaporizing,  
20 or containing marijuana or for ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing marijuana  
21 into the human body;

22           (6) "Marijuana business", a licensed marijuana processor, marijuana  
23 commercial grower, or marijuana retailer;

24           (7) "Marijuana commercial grower" or "commercial grower", an entity licensed  
25 to cultivate, prepare, and package marijuana and transfer or contract for transfer of  
26 marijuana to a marijuana retailer, marijuana processor, or any other marijuana  
27 commercial grower. A commercial grower may sell seeds, flower, or clones to  
28 commercial growers under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048;

29           (8) "Marijuana processor", a person or entity licensed under sections 196.3000  
30 to 196.3048 to operate a business, including the production, manufacture, extraction,  
31 processing, packaging, or creation of marijuana products as described under sections  
32 196.3000 to 196.3048;

33           (9) "Marijuana products", concentrated marijuana products and marijuana  
34 products that are composed of marijuana and other ingredients and are intended for use  
35 or consumption including, but not limited to, edible products, ointments, and tinctures;

36           (10) "Marijuana retailer", an entity that has been licensed by the authority  
37 under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 to purchase marijuana or marijuana products from  
38 a licensed marijuana commercial grower or marijuana processor, sell marijuana or

39 marijuana products to consumers under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048, or sell or  
40 transfer marijuana or marijuana products to another marijuana retailer;

41 (11) "Personal use", personal use or consumption of marijuana by a person  
42 twenty-one years of age or older.

196.3006. The provisions of sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 shall not:

2 (1) Restrict the rights of employers to maintain a drug-and alcohol-free  
3 workplace or affect the ability of employers to enact workplace policies restricting the  
4 use of marijuana or marijuana products by employees or prospective employees;

5 (2) Require an employer to allow or accommodate the use, consumption,  
6 possession, transfer, display, transportation, sale, or cultivation of marijuana or  
7 marijuana products in a place of employment;

8 (3) Allow driving, flying, or boating while impaired by marijuana or marijuana  
9 products or prevent this state from enacting and imposing penalties for driving, flying,  
10 or boating while impaired by marijuana or marijuana products;

11 (4) Allow individuals who are under twenty-one years of age to purchase,  
12 possess, transport, or consume marijuana or marijuana products;

13 (5) Allow the sale, transfer, or provision of marijuana or marijuana products to  
14 individuals who are under twenty-one years of age;

15 (6) Restrict the rights of employers, schools, day care centers, adult care  
16 facilities, health care facilities, or correctional facilities to prohibit or regulate conduct  
17 otherwise allowed under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 if such conduct occurs on or in  
18 properties listed under this subdivision;

19 (7) Restrict the ability of an individual, partnership, limited liability company,  
20 private corporation, private entity, or private organization of any character that  
21 occupies, owns, or controls property to prohibit or regulate conduct otherwise allowed  
22 in this section on or in such property;

23 (8) Prohibit this state or a political subdivision of this state from prohibiting or  
24 regulating conduct otherwise allowed under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 when such  
25 conduct occurs on or in property that is occupied, owned, controlled, or operated by this  
26 state or a political subdivision of this state; or

27 (9) Require a person to violate federal law or to implement or fail to implement a  
28 restriction on the possession, consumption, displaying, transferring, processing,  
29 manufacturing, or cultivation of marijuana if by doing so the person will lose a  
30 monetary or licensing-related benefit under federal law.

196.3009. 1. The following acts shall not be unlawful and shall not be an offense  
2 under Missouri law:

3 (1) Possessing or consuming marijuana or marijuana products for personal use;

4           **(2) For any person twenty-one years of age or older in possession of a personal**  
5 **cultivation registration card, cultivating or possessing no more than six mature,**  
6 **flowering marijuana plants for noncommercial, personal use. The authority shall make**  
7 **available to the public application forms and application instructions for personal**  
8 **cultivation registration cards. The authority shall set fines for any person who exceeds**  
9 **the limitation under this subdivision if the person has not obtained a marijuana business**

14 **to operate a marijuana business;**

15           **(4) Providing marijuana, marijuana accessories, or marijuana products for sale**  
16 **to consumers twenty-one years of age or older; and**

17           **(5) Leasing or otherwise allowing the use of property owned, occupied, or**  
18 **controlled by any person, corporation, or other entity for any of the activities conducted**  
19 **lawfully in accordance with subdivisions (1) to (4) of this subsection.**

20           **2. The use or possession of marijuana shall in no way impede on a person's legal**  
21 **right to possess a firearm, as long as the person is not in an intoxicated state as defined**  
22 **under section 577.001.**

**196.3012. Notwithstanding any provision of law, it shall be lawful for a person**  
2 **twenty-one years of age or older, or an emancipated individual under twenty-one years**  
3 **of age with a physician's recommendation authorizing the use of marijuana, to transfer**  
4 **or gift marijuana in any form including, but not limited to, plant material, seeds,**  
5 **extract, or concentrate, to another adult twenty-one years of age or older, or to another**  
6 **emancipated individual under twenty-one years of age with a physician's**  
7 **recommendation authorizing the use of marijuana, provided no compensation of any**  
8 **kind is given or received; however, nothing in this section shall be construed to permit**  
9 **the transfer or gifting of marijuana to a person under twenty-one years of age, if such**  
10 **person has a physician's recommendation authorizing the use of marijuana, by anyone**  
11 **other than such person's legal guardian, under and in accordance with the provisions**  
12 **governing the medically authorized administration of marijuana to a person under**  
13 **twenty-one years of age.**

**196.3015. Marijuana farmers, manufacturers, processors, and distributors shall**  
2 **not be subject to any special zoning requirement or licensing fee that is excessive,**  
3 **discriminatory, prohibitive, or in any way contrary to that which is relative to any other**  
4 **commercial or agricultural farmer, manufacturer, processor, or distributor.**

196.3018. 1. No Missouri law enforcement personnel or state funds shall be used  
2 to assist or aid in the enforcement of federal marijuana laws involving acts that are no  
3 longer illegal in the state of Missouri under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048.

4 2. As provided under section 610.135, Missouri's courts shall expunge conviction  
5 records of offenses or municipal violations pertaining to nonviolent marijuana-related  
6 offenses or violations that are no longer illegal in the state of Missouri under sections  
7 196.3000 to 196.3048.

196.3021. 1. A tax shall be levied upon the sale of marijuana or marijuana  
2 products to consumers or buyers not licensed for resale at a rate of four and two  
3 hundred twenty-five thousandths percent. The department of revenue shall direct the  
4 authority to establish procedures for the collection of all taxes levied. The tax shall be  
5 evidenced by stamps that shall be furnished by and purchased from the department of  
6 revenue, and the department of revenue shall enforce any such tax in a manner similar  
7 to taxes levied on cigarettes under chapter 149.

8 2. All tax revenues collected under subsection 1 of this section shall be deposited  
9 in the cannabis freedom fund established under section 196.3045. Moneys in the fund  
10 shall be used to pay for the direct and indirect costs associated with the implementation,  
11 administration, and enforcement of sections 196.3000 to 196.3048.

12 3. After all costs under subsection 2 of this section have been paid, moneys  
13 remaining in the fund shall be disbursed as follows:

16 (2) Ten percent of remaining funds shall be deposited to the peace officer standards

18 (3) Ten percent of remaining funds shall be disbursed to the state fire marshal  
19 for disbursement of grants to volunteer fire protection associations for the purpose of  
20 funding such association's costs related to workers' compensation insurance premiums  
21 for volunteer firefighters under section 287.245;

22 (4) Fifteen percent of remaining funds shall be disbursed to the department to  
23 establish and administer the work training program under subsection 3 of section  
24 557.059; and

25 (5) Five percent of remaining funds shall be used to provide assistance with  
26 small business loans under section 196.3047.

27 4. Any excess moneys remaining in the fund after all costs and disbursements  
28 under subsections 2 and 3 of this section have been paid shall revert to the general  
29 revenue fund.

30           **5. Nothing in this section shall prohibit state and local sales tax as imposed under**  
31 **the sales tax law and local sales tax law.**

**196.3024. All provisions of sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 shall supersede any**  
2 **conflicting city, county, or state statute, local charter, ordinance, or resolution.**

**196.3026. 1. The department shall issue rules or emergency rules for a**  
2 **marijuana and marijuana products independent testing and certification program for**  
3 **marijuana licensees under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048, and the department shall issue**  
4 **rules or emergency rules requiring such licensees to test marijuana and marijuana**  
5 **products using one or more impartial, independent laboratories to ensure, at a**  
6 **minimum, that products sold for human consumption do not contain contaminants that**  
7 **are injurious to health and to ensure correct labeling and measure potency. The**  
8 **department shall not require any marijuana or marijuana product to be tested more**  
9 **than once prior to sale.**

10           **2. The department shall issue rules or emergency rules to provide for the**  
11 **certification of and standards for marijuana testing facilities, including the**  
12 **requirements for equipment and qualifications for personnel, but shall not require**  
13 **certificate holders to have any federal agency licensing or have any relationship with a**  
14 **federally licensed testing facility. The department shall certify, if possible, at least two**  
15 **entities as marijuana testing facilities. No marijuana testing facility shall be owned by**  
16 **an entity under substantially common control, ownership, or management as a**  
17 **marijuana business.**

**196.3027. 1. There is hereby established the "Cannabis Enforcement Authority"**  
2 **under the department. The authority shall have oversight and auditing responsibilities**  
3 **to ensure that all marijuana being grown in Missouri for personal use is accounted for**  
4 **and shall implement an inventory tracking system as provided under subsection 2 of this**  
5 **section. The authority shall require that each marijuana business keep records for**  
6 **every transaction with another marijuana business or consumer. Inventory shall be**  
7 **tracked and updated after each individual sale and reported to the authority.**

8           **2. The authority shall require a seed-to-sale tracking system that tracks**  
9 **marijuana from either seed or immature plant stage until the marijuana or marijuana**  
10 **product is sold to a consumer at a marijuana business to ensure that no marijuana**  
11 **grown or processed is sold or otherwise transferred except by a marijuana business.**  
12 **The authority shall contract with a vendor or vendors to maintain a standardized**  
13 **tracking system in the state. The tracking system shall include, at a minimum, the**  
14 **following:**

15           **(1) Notification of when marijuana seeds are planted;**

16           **(2) Notification of when marijuana plants are harvested and destroyed;**

- 17           **(3) Notification of when marijuana is transported, sold, stolen, diverted, or lost;**  
18           **(4) A complete inventory of all marijuana seeds, plant tissue, clones, plants,**  
19 **usable marijuana or trim, leaves, and other plant matter, batches of extract, and**  
20 **marijuana concentrates;**  
21           **(5) All samples sent to a testing laboratory, an unused portion of a sample**  
22 **returned to a licensee, and all samples utilized by a licensee for purposes of negotiating a**  
23 **sale; and**  
24           **(6) All samples used for quality testing by a licensee.**

**196.3028. 1. There is hereby created the marijuana business license, which shall**  
2 **include applications for the following categories:**

- 3           **(1) Marijuana commercial growers;**  
4           **(2) Marijuana processors; and**  
5           **(3) Marijuana retailers.**

6           **2. The authority, with the aid of the office of administration, shall develop a**  
7 **website for marijuana business license applications.**

8           **3. The authority shall determine an application fee for a marijuana business**  
9 **license in an amount sufficient to cover administration, regulation, and enforcement**  
10 **costs associated under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048, and the fee shall be deposited into**  
11 **the cannabis freedom fund established under section 196.3045.**

12           **4. All applicants seeking licensure as a marijuana business shall comply with the**  
13 **following general requirements:**

- 14           **(1) All applications shall contain the name and address of the applicant;**  
15           **(2) All applications for marijuana commercial growers and marijuana**  
16 **processors shall contain the name, address, and the legal description of the property;**  
17           **(3) All applications for licenses authorized under this section shall be made upon**  
18 **forms prescribed by the authority;**  
19           **(4) All applications shall identify the city or county in which the applicant seeks**  
20 **to obtain licensure as a marijuana business;**  
21           **(5) Applicants shall submit a complete and accurate application to the authority**  
22 **before the application may be accepted or considered;**  
23           **(6) All applications shall include all attachments or supplemental information**  
24 **required by the forms supplied by the authority;**  
25           **(7) All applications shall be accompanied by a full remittance for the entire**  
26 **amount of the application fees;**  
27           **(8) All applicants shall be approved for licensing review that, at a minimum,**  
28 **meet the following criteria:**  
29           **(a) All applicants shall be twenty-one years of age or older; and**

30 (b) All applying individuals or entities shall be registered to conduct business in  
31 the state of Missouri, and all applying individuals shall be residents of the state of  
32 Missouri;

33 (9) All applicants for a marijuana business license authorized under sections  
34 196.3000 to 196.3048, including:

- 35 (a) Individual applicants applying on their own behalf;
- 36 (b) Individuals applying on behalf of an applying entity;
- 37 (c) All principal officers of an applying entity; and
- 38 (d) All owners of an entity,

39

40 shall undergo a Missouri criminal background check within thirty days prior to  
41 applying for the license;

42 (10) All applicable fees charged for the criminal background check are the  
43 responsibility of the applicant and shall not be higher than fees charged to any other  
44 person or industry for such background check;

45 (11) All applicants, or applying individuals if an entity, shall establish their  
46 identity through submission of a color copy or digital image of one of the following  
47 unexpired documents:

- 48 (a) Front and back of a Missouri driver's license;
- 49 (b) Front and back of a Missouri identification card; or
- 50 (c) A United States passport or other photo identification issued by the United  
51 States government; and

52 (12) All applicants, or applying individuals if an entity, shall submit an applicant  
53 photograph.

54 5. A person or entity applying for a marijuana business license shall submit the  
55 following to the authority:

56 (1) Business-formation documents, which may include, but are not limited to,  
57 articles of incorporation, operating agreements, partnership agreements, and fictitious  
58 business name statements;

59 (2) Financial information pertaining to the operations of the marijuana business,  
60 which shall include the following:

61 (a) A list of funds belonging to the applicant held in savings, checking, or other  
62 accounts maintained by a financial institution. The applicant shall provide for each  
63 account the name of the financial institution, the address of the financial institution,  
64 account type, account number, and the amount of moneys in the account;

65           **(b) A list of loans made to the applicant. For each loan, the applicant shall**  
66 **provide the amount of the loan; the date of the loan; term of the loan; security provided**  
67 **for the loan; and the name, address, and phone number of the lender;**

68           **(c) A list of investments made into the marijuana business. For each investment,**  
69 **the applicant shall provide the amount of the investment; the date of the investment;**  
70 **term of the investment; and the name, address, and phone number of the investor;**

71           **(d) A complete list of every individual who has a financial interest in the**  
72 **marijuana business but is not an owner of the marijuana business;**

73           **(e) Whether the applicant has an ownership or a financial interest in any other**  
74 **marijuana business licensed in Missouri.**

75           **6. If the applicant is not the landowner of the real property upon which the**  
76 **premises is located, the applicant shall provide to the authority a document from the**  
77 **landowner or the agent of the landowner that states that the applicant has the right to**  
78 **occupy the property and acknowledges the applicant may use the property for**  
79 **marijuana business activities for which the applicant is applying for licensure. An**  
80 **applicant shall also provide a copy of the rental agreement, as applicable.**

81           **7. If the applicant is the landowner of the real property upon which the premises**  
82 **is located, the applicant shall provide to the authority a copy of the title or deed to the**  
83 **property.**

84           **8. If the applicant is applying for a marijuana commercial grower license, the**  
85 **applicant shall also submit the following:**

86           **(1) For indoor and mixed light cultivation, identification of all power sources for**  
87 **cultivation activities including, but not limited to, illumination, heating, cooling, and**  
88 **ventilation;**

89           **(2) If the applicant is proposing to use a diversion from a waterbody,**  
90 **groundwater well, or rain catchment system as a water source for cultivation, the**  
91 **following locations on the property diagram with locations also provided as GPS**  
92 **coordinates in latitude and longitude:**

93           **(a) Sources of the water used, including the location of waterbody diversion;**

94           **(b) Pump location and distribution system; and**

95           **(c) Location, type, and capacity of each storage unit to be used for cultivation;**

96           **(3) A proposed cultivation plan, which shall include identification of all water**  
97 **sources used for cultivation activities;**

98           **(4) Evidence of insurance including, but not limited to:**

99           **(a) General liability insurance;**

100           **(b) Workers' compensation insurance; and**

101           **(c) Product liability insurance; and**

102           **(5) Any additional information required by the authority.**

103           **9. The authority shall be authorized to issue the following types of marijuana**  
104 **processor licenses based on the level of risk posed by the type of processing conducted:**

105           **(1) A nonhazardous marijuana processor license; or**

106           **(2) A hazardous marijuana processor license.**

107           **10. In addition to the application requirements under this section, a marijuana**  
108 **commercial grower or marijuana processor shall demonstrate to the authority that the**  
109 **grower or processor has a bank account and shall provide growth estimates, processing**  
110 **estimates, and predicted electrical and water usage to grow or process marijuana.**

111           **11. All applicants shall submit information to the authority in a full, faithful,**  
112 **truthful, and fair manner. The authority may deny an application if the applicant made**  
113 **misstatements, omissions, misrepresentations, or untruths in the application or in**  
114 **connection with the background investigation of the applicant. Such conduct may be**  
115 **considered as the basis for additional administrative action against the applicant. Typos**  
116 **and scrivener's errors shall not be grounds for denial. The criminal background of an**  
117 **applicant, as long as it does not include any violation under sections 196.3000 to**  
118 **196.3048, shall not be used as the sole grounds for denial of an application.**

119           **12. In investigating the qualifications of an applicant, the authority may have**  
120 **access to criminal history record information furnished by a criminal justice agency,**  
121 **subject to any restrictions imposed by such an agency. In the event the authority**  
122 **considers the criminal history record of the applicant, the authority shall also consider**  
123 **any information provided by the applicant regarding such criminal history record**  
124 **including, but not limited to, evidence of rehabilitation, character references, and**  
125 **educational achievements, and those items pertaining to the period of time between the**  
126 **last criminal conviction of the applicant and the consideration of the application for a**  
127 **state license.**

128           **13. (1) The authority shall review the marijuana business license application,**  
129 **approve or reject the application, and mail or email the approval, rejection, or status-**  
130 **update letter to the applicant within ninety days of receipt of the application.**

131           **(2) The authority may reject an application for a marijuana business license if**  
132 **the requirements for the marijuana business license application are not satisfied.**

133           **(3) If an application is rejected for failure to provide the required information,**  
134 **the applicant shall have thirty days to submit the required information for**  
135 **reconsideration. No additional application fee shall be charged for such**  
136 **reconsideration.**

137           **14. The following violations shall be grounds for denial of a marijuana license**  
138 **under this section:**

- 139           **(1) Unlawful sales or purchases;**  
140           **(2) Any fraudulent acts, falsification of records, or misrepresentation to the**  
141 **authority;**  
142           **(3) Any grossly inaccurate or fraudulent reporting;**  
143           **(4) Threatening or harming any marijuana patient, caregiver, consumer,**  
144 **medical practitioner, or employee of the authority;**  
145           **(5) Knowingly or intentionally refusing to permit the authority access to the**  
146 **premises or records;**  
147           **(6) Using a prohibited, hazardous substance for processing in a residential area;**  
148           **(7) Criminal acts relating to the operation of a marijuana business; or**  
149           **(8) Any violation that endangers public health and safety or product safety.**  
150           **15. Status-update letters shall provide a reason for delay in either approval or**  
151 **rejection if a situation arises in which an application was submitted properly but a delay**  
152 **in processing the application occurred.**  
153           **16. All marijuana business applicants shall pay the relevant application fee prior**  
154 **to receiving a license under section 196.3029 to operate a marijuana business, as**  
155 **provided under this section, for each category of license.**  
156           **17. The authority shall issue, at a minimum, twice the number of marijuana**  
157 **commercial growers licenses as were authorized or issued for medical marijuana**  
158 **cultivation facilities under Article XIV, Section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri as of**  
159 **August 28, 2022, twice the number of marijuana processing licenses as were authorized**  
160 **or issued for medical marijuana-infused products manufacturing facilities under Article**  
161 **XIV, Section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri as of August 28, 2022, and twice the**  
162 **number of marijuana retailers licenses as were authorized or issued for medical**  
163 **marijuana dispensary facilities under Article XIV, Section 1 of the Constitution of**  
164 **Missouri as of August 28, 2022. The department may lift or ease any limit on the**  
165 **number of licensees or certificate holders in order to meet the demand for marijuana in**  
166 **the state and to ensure a competitive market while also preventing an over-**  
167 **concentration of marijuana facilities within the boundaries of any particular local**  
168 **government.**

**196.3029. 1. As used in this section, "conditional marijuana business license"**  
2 **means a conditional license that authorizes the licensee to engage in commercial**  
3 **marijuana activities as would be permitted under the privileges of an annual marijuana**  
4 **business license. A conditional marijuana business licensee shall follow all applicable**  
5 **rules and regulations as would be required if the licensee held an annual license.**

6           **2. Once the authority has certified the application is complete and accurate, a**  
7 **conditional marijuana business license shall be issued under this section.**

8           **3. The authority shall continue its review of the licensee of the conditional**  
9 **marijuana business license and conduct all investigations, inspections, and interviews,**  
10 **including a site inspection, before approving the licensee for an annual marijuana**  
11 **business license. The authority shall promulgate rules and regulations relating to the**  
12 **investigations, inspections, and interviews required to be conducted under this**  
13 **subsection.**

14           **4. Status-update letters shall provide a reason for any delay in issuing an annual**  
15 **license.**

16           **5. An annual license provided under this section shall not be issued until all**  
17 **investigations, inspections, and interviews required under this section have been**  
18 **satisfied and all relevant local licenses and permits have been issued by the municipality**  
19 **including, but not limited to, an occupancy permit or certificate of compliance.**

20           **6. An annual license issued to a marijuana business under this section shall**  
21 **expire one year from the date on which the license was issued. Such license shall be**  
22 **renewed by the licensee, and the license renewal requirements and fee for such renewal**  
23 **shall be determined by the authority. A marijuana business that attempts to renew its**  
24 **license after the expiration date of the license shall pay a late renewal fee of ten percent**  
25 **of the license fee. Late renewal fees are nonrefundable. A license that has been expired**  
26 **for more than ninety days shall not be renewed.**

27           **7. A marijuana business license shall not be issued to or held by:**

28           **(1) A person until all required fees have been paid;**

29           **(2) A person under twenty-one years of age;**

30           **(3) A person licensed under this section who, during a period of licensure, or at**  
31 **the time of application under section 196.3028, has failed to:**

32           **(a) File taxes or report interest or penalties due; or**

33           **(b) Pay taxes, interest, or penalties due.**

**196.3031. 1. (1) A licensed marijuana commercial grower shall sell only at the**  
2 **wholesale level to a licensed marijuana retailer, another licensed marijuana commercial**  
3 **grower, or a licensed marijuana processor.**

4           **(2) A licensed marijuana commercial grower shall be required to complete and**  
5 **submit a monthly yield and sales report to the authority. The report shall be due on the**  
6 **fifteenth of each month and provide reporting for the previous month. The report shall**  
7 **detail the amount of marijuana harvested in pounds, the amount of drying or dried**  
8 **marijuana on hand, the amount of marijuana sold to licensed processors in pounds, the**  
9 **amount of waste in pounds, and the amount of marijuana sold to licensed marijuana**  
10 **dispensaries in pounds. Additionally, the report shall show total wholesale sales in**  
11 **dollars.**

12           **(3) The authority may inspect a growing operation and determine the**  
13 **operation's compliance with sections 196.3000 to 196.3048. If a deficiency is found, a**  
14 **written report of the deficiency shall be issued to the licensed marijuana commercial**  
15 **grower. The licensed marijuana commercial grower shall have one month to correct the**  
16 **deficiency or be subject to fines as determined by the authority.**

17           **(4) The authority shall have oversight and auditing responsibilities to ensure**  
18 **that all marijuana being grown by a licensed marijuana commercial grower is**  
19 **accounted for.**

20           **2. (1) A licensed marijuana processor may take marijuana plants and distill or**  
21 **process such plants into concentrates, edibles, and other forms for consumption.**

22           **(2) The authority shall make available a set of standards that shall be used by**  
23 **licensed marijuana processors in the preparation of edible marijuana products. The**  
24 **standards shall be in line with current food preparation guidelines. No excessive or**  
25 **punitive rules shall be established by the authority.**

26           **(3) The authority may inspect a processing operation and determine the**  
27 **operation's compliance with the preparation standards. If a deficiency is found, a**  
28 **written report of the deficiency shall be issued to the licensed marijuana processor. The**  
29 **licensed marijuana processor shall have one month to correct the deficiency or be**  
30 **subject to fines as determined by the authority.**

31           **(4) A licensed marijuana processor may sell marijuana products the processor**  
32 **creates to a licensed marijuana dispensary or any other licensed marijuana processor.**  
33 **All sales by a licensed marijuana commercial grower or marijuana processor shall be**  
34 **considered wholesale sales and shall not be subject to taxation.**

35           **(5) A licensed marijuana processor shall be required to complete and submit a**  
36 **monthly yield and sales report to the authority. The report shall be due on the fifteenth**  
37 **of each month and shall provide reporting for the previous month. The report shall**  
38 **detail the amount of marijuana and marijuana products purchased in pounds, the**  
39 **amount of marijuana cooked or processed in pounds, and the amount of waste in**  
40 **pounds. Additionally, the report shall show total wholesale sales in dollars. The**  
41 **authority shall have oversight and auditing responsibilities to ensure that all marijuana**  
42 **being processed is accounted for.**

**196.3032. 1. A marijuana transporter license shall be issued to qualifying**  
2 **applicants for a marijuana retailer, marijuana commercial grower, or marijuana**  
3 **processor license. The marijuana transporter license shall be issued at the time of**  
4 **approval of a conditional or annual marijuana business license. The fees for the**  
5 **marijuana transporter license, including any renewal fees, shall be paid by the applicant**  
6 **as determined by the authority.**

7           **2. A marijuana transporter license shall allow the holder to transport marijuana**  
8 **from a Missouri-licensed marijuana retailer, licensed marijuana commercial grower**  
9 **facility, or licensed marijuana processor facility to a Missouri-licensed marijuana**  
10 **retailer, licensed marijuana commercial grower facility, or licensed marijuana**  
11 **processing facility.**

12           **3. All marijuana or marijuana products shall be transported in a locked**  
13 **container and clearly labeled "Marijuana or Derivative".**

14           **4. No marijuana business shall possess, sell, or transfer marijuana or marijuana**  
15 **products without a valid, unexpired marijuana transporter license issued by the**  
16 **authority.**

17           **5. A marijuana transporter license shall be valid for one year and shall not be**  
18 **transferred with a change of ownership. A licensed marijuana transporter shall be**  
19 **responsible for all marijuana, marijuana concentrate, and marijuana products once the**  
20 **transporter takes control of the product.**

21           **6. A marijuana transporter license shall be required for any person or entity to**  
22 **transport or transfer marijuana, marijuana concentrate, or marijuana products from a**  
23 **licensed marijuana business to another licensed marijuana business.**

24           **7. A marijuana transporter licensee may contract with multiple licensed**  
25 **marijuana businesses.**

26           **8. A marijuana transporter licensee shall use the seed-to-sale tracking system**  
27 **developed under section 196.3027 to create shipping manifests documenting the**  
28 **transport of marijuana, marijuana concentrate, and marijuana products throughout**  
29 **the state.**

30           **9. With the exception of a lawful transfer between marijuana businesses that are**  
31 **licensed to operate at the same physical address, all marijuana, marijuana concentrate,**  
32 **and marijuana products shall be transported:**

33           **(1) In a vehicle equipped with a global positioning system (GPS) tracker or with**  
34 **cell phone tracking;**

35           **(2) In a locked and number-tagged container clearly labeled "Marijuana or**  
36 **Derivative"; and**

37           **(3) In a secured area of the vehicle that is not accessible by the driver during**  
38 **transit.**

39           **10. A marijuana transporter agent may possess marijuana at any location while**  
40 **the marijuana transporter agent is transferring marijuana to or from a licensed**  
41 **marijuana business. The department shall administer and enforce the provisions of this**  
42 **section concerning transportation.**

43           **11. The authority shall issue a marijuana transporter agent license to individual**  
44 **agents, employees, officers, or owners of a marijuana transporter licensee in order for**  
45 **the individual to qualify to transport marijuana, marijuana concentrate, or marijuana**  
46 **products.**

47           **12. The fee for a marijuana transporter agent license shall be one hundred**  
48 **dollars and shall be paid by the marijuana transporter license holder or the individual**  
49 **applicant. Marijuana transporter agent license reprints shall be one hundred dollars.**  
50 **The authority shall issue each marijuana transporter agent a registry identification card**  
51 **within thirty days of receipt of the name, address, and date of birth of the person.**

52           **13. A registry identification card for a marijuana transporter agent shall expire**  
53 **three years after the date of issuance or upon notification from the holder of the**  
54 **marijuana transporter license that the marijuana transporter agent ceases to work as a**  
55 **marijuana transporter.**

56           **14. The department may revoke the registry identification card of a marijuana**  
57 **transporter agent who knowingly violates any provision of this section, and the**  
58 **marijuana transporter shall be subject to any other penalties established by law for the**  
59 **violation. The department may revoke or suspend the marijuana transporter license of**  
60 **a marijuana transporter that the department determines knowingly aided or facilitated**  
61 **a violation of any provision of this section, and the license holder shall be subject to any**  
62 **other penalties established in law for the violation.**

63           **15. Vehicles used in the transport of marijuana or marijuana products shall:**

64           **(1) Be insured at or above the legal requirements in Missouri; and**

65           **(2) Be capable of securing marijuana during transport.**

66           **16. Prior to the transport of any marijuana, marijuana concentrate, or**  
67 **marijuana product, an inventory manifest shall be prepared at the origination point of**  
68 **the marijuana. The inventory manifest shall include the following information:**

69           **(1) For the origination point of the marijuana:**

70           **(a) The license number for the commercial grower, processor, or retailer;**

71           **(b) The address of the origination of transport; and**

72           **(c) The name and contact information for the originating licensee;**

73           **(2) For the end-recipient license holder of the marijuana:**

74           **(a) The license number for the retailer, commercial grower, and processor;**

75           **(b) The address of the destination; and**

76           **(c) The name and contact information for the destination licensee;**

77           **(3) Quantities by weight or unit of each type of marijuana product contained in**  
78 **the transport;**

79           **(4) The date of the transport and the approximate time of departure;**

80 (5) The arrival date and the estimated time of arrival;

81 (6) Printed names and signatures of the personnel accompanying the transport;  
82 and

83 (7) Notation of the transporting licensee.

84 17. A separate inventory manifest shall be prepared for each licensee receiving  
85 the marijuana.

86 18. The marijuana transporter agent shall provide the other marijuana business  
87 with a copy of the inventory manifest at the time the product changes hands and after  
88 the other licensee prints his or her name and signs the inventory manifest.

89 19. A receiving licensee shall refuse to accept any marijuana, marijuana  
90 concentrate, or marijuana product that is not accompanied by an inventory manifest.

91 20. Originating and receiving licensees shall maintain copies of inventory  
92 manifests and logs of quantities of marijuana exchanged for three years from the date of  
93 receipt.

94 21. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, a peace officer licensed by the  
95 POST commission under sections 590.010 to 590.195 when off-duty may transport  
96 marijuana without a marijuana transportation license.

196.3036. An entity that was awarded a medical marijuana business license by  
2 the department may apply for a marijuana business license under section 196.3028 so  
3 long as the requirements under sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 are met.

196.3042. If marijuana is legalized on a federal level, the state shall explore the  
2 option to enter into any interstate compact or agreement relating to marijuana.

196.3045. 1. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Cannabis  
2 Freedom Fund", which shall consist of moneys collected under sections 196.3021,  
3 196.3028, and 196.3029, and subsection 12 of section 196.3032. The state treasurer shall  
4 be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state  
5 treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon  
6 appropriation, moneys in this fund shall be used solely as provided in section 196.3021.

7 2. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as  
8 other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be  
9 credited to the fund.

196.3047. The department shall establish a loan program in which women and  
2 minority business enterprises may apply for a small business loan that shall be interest-  
3 free for a period of two years.

196.3048. The authority shall promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for  
2 the administration of sections 196.3000 to 196.3048. Any rule or portion of a rule, as  
3 that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in

4 **this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the**  
5 **provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter**  
6 **536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly**  
7 **pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul**  
8 **a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority**  
9 **and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2022, shall be invalid and void.**

288.045. 1. If a claimant is at work with a detectible amount of alcohol, **marijuana**,  
2 or a controlled substance as defined in section 195.010 in the claimant's system, in violation  
3 of the employer's alcohol and controlled substance workplace policy, the claimant shall have  
4 committed misconduct connected with the claimant's work.

5 2. A test conducted by a laboratory certified by the United States Department of  
6 Health and Human Services, or another certifying organization so long as the certification  
7 requirements meet the minimum standards of the United States Department of Health and  
8 Human Services, and the laboratory's trial packet shall be included in the administrative  
9 record and considered as evidence.

10 3. The claimant must have previously been notified of the employer's alcohol and  
11 controlled substance workplace policy by conspicuously posting the policy in the workplace,  
12 by including the policy in a written personnel policy or handbook, or by statement of such  
13 policy in a collective bargaining agreement governing employment of the employee. The  
14 policy, public posting, handbook, collective bargaining agreement or other written notice  
15 provided to the employee must state that a positive test result may result in suspension or  
16 termination of employment.

17 4. Test results shall be admissible if the employer's policy clearly states an employee  
18 may be subject to random, preemployment, reasonable suspicion or post-accident testing. An  
19 employer may require a preemployment test for alcohol, **marijuana**, or controlled substance  
20 use as a condition of employment, and test results shall be admissible so long as the claimant  
21 was informed of the test requirement prior to taking the test. A random, preemployment,  
22 reasonable suspicion or post-accident test result, conducted under this section, which is  
23 positive for alcohol, **marijuana**, or controlled substance use shall be considered misconduct.

24 5. The application of this section for alcohol, **marijuana**, and controlled substance  
25 testing, relating only to methods of testing, criteria for testing, chain of custody for samples or  
26 specimens and due process for employee notification procedures shall not apply in the event  
27 that the claimant is subject to the provisions of any applicable collective bargaining  
28 agreement, so long as said agreement contains methods for alcohol, **marijuana**, or controlled  
29 substance testing that meet or exceed the minimum standards established in this section.  
30 Nothing in this chapter is intended to authorize any employer to test any applicant or  
31 employee for alcohol, **marijuana**, or drugs in any manner inconsistent with Missouri or

34 6. All specimen collection for drugs and alcohol under this chapter shall be performed

37 Any employer that performs drug testing or specimen collection shall use chain-of-custody

41 custody" refers to the methodology of tracking specified materials or substances for the  
42 purpose of maintaining control and accountability from initial collection to final disposition

44 handling, testing, and storing specimens and reporting test results.

45 7. The employee may request that a confirmation test on the specimen be conducted.

4 **identification card under Article XIV, Section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri or prior**

5 to the enactment of sections 196.3000 to 196.3048 and has not been convicted of any  
6 subsequent drug-related offense for a period of ten years may petition the court to have  
7 the nonviolent marijuana-related offense or municipal violation expunged so long as the  
8 offense or violation was prosecuted under the jurisdiction of a Missouri associate circuit  
9 or circuit court or municipal court and all nonviolent marijuana-related offenses are  
10 listed in the petition of expungement.

11 2. If the court determines, after hearing, that a person has been issued a patient  
12 identification card or was convicted of a nonviolent marijuana-related offense or  
13 municipal violation that is no longer an offense or violation because of the enactment of  
14 sections 196.3000 to 196.3048, the offense seeking to be expunged is related to the  
15 nonviolent marijuana-related offense or violation, and the offense or violation occurred  
16 within the state of Missouri, the court may enter an order for expungement.

Section 2. 1. Any person who is seventeen years of age or older and under  
2 twenty-one years of age who represents that he or she has attained twenty-one years of  
3 age for the purpose of purchasing, asking for, or in any way receiving marijuana or any  
4 marijuana product, except in cases authorized by law, shall upon conviction be deemed  
5 guilty of a misdemeanor. Any person under seventeen years of age who represents that  
6 he or she is twenty-one years of age for the purpose of purchasing, asking for, or in any  
7 way receiving marijuana or any marijuana product, except in cases authorized by law,  
8 may be considered a delinquent child and may be dealt with in accordance with the  
9 provisions of chapter 211.

6 Constitution of Missouri. A first violation of this section shall be punishable as a class D  
7 misdemeanor. A second or subsequent violation of this section shall be punishable as a

Section 4. 1. A valid and unexpired operator's or chauffeur's license issued  
2 under the provisions of section 302.177, a valid and unexpired operator's or chauffeur's  
3 license issued under the laws of any state or territory of the United States to residents of  
4 such states or territories, a valid and unexpired identification card or nondriver's  
5 license as provided for under section 302.181, a valid and unexpired nondriver's license  
6 issued under the laws of any state or territory of the United States to residents of such  
7 states or territories, a valid and unexpired identification card issued by any uniformed  
8 service of the United States, or a valid and unexpired passport shall be presented by the  
9 holder thereof upon request of any agent of the division of alcohol and tobacco control  
10 or any licensee or the servant, agent, or employee thereof for the purpose of aiding the  
11 licensee or the servant, agent, or employee to determine whether the person is twenty-  
12 one years of age or older when such person desires to purchase or use marijuana or a

14 the servant, agent, or employee thereof shall compare the photograph and physical  
15 characteristics noted on the license, identification card, or passport with the physical  
16 characteristics of the person presenting the license, identification card, or passport.

17 2. Upon proof of full compliance by the licensee with the provisions of this  
18 section, no penalty shall be imposed if the supervisor of the division of alcohol and  
19 tobacco control or the courts are satisfied that the licensee acted in good faith.

20 3. Any person who shall, without authorization from the department of revenue,  
21 reproduce, alter, modify, or misrepresent any chauffeur's license, motor vehicle  
22 operator's license, or identification card shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and  
23 upon conviction shall be subject to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars or  
24 confinement for not more than one year, or both.
