2 inserting after the second occurrence of the word "a" the word "state"; and

4 Further amend said bill, page and section, Line 6, by deleting the word "area" and inserting in lieu  
5 thereof the word "county"; and

7 Further amend said bill, page and section, Line 7, by deleting the word "tax" in both occurrences  
8 and inserting in lieu thereof the phrase "state tax"; and

9  
10 Further amend said bill, page and section, Line 9, by deleting the word "area" and inserting in lieu  
11 thereof the word "county"; and

12  
13 Further amend said bill, Page 13, Section 253.550, Line 18, by deleting the word "area" and  
14 inserting in lieu thereof the word "county"; and

15  
16 Further amend said bill and section, Page 15, Line 91, by deleting the word "area" and inserting in  
17 lieu thereof the word "county"; and

18  
19 Further amend said bill, page and section, Line 107, by inserting after all of said line the following:

20  
21 "5. A single-resource certified historic structure of more than one million gross square feet  
22 with a Part I approval before January 1, 2023, shall not be subject to the dollar caps under  
23 subsection 2 of section 253.550 if:

24 (a) The project otherwise meets all the requirements of this section;

25 (b) The project meets the ten percent incurred costs test under subsection 10 of section  
26 253.559 within thirty-six months after an award is issued; and

27 (c) The taxpayer agrees with the department of economic development, on a form  
28 prescribed by the department, to claim the original "state historical tax credits" over three state fiscal  
29 years with the initial year being the calendar year when the tax credits are issued."; and

31 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
32 accordingly.
