AMEND House Amendment No. \_\_\_\_\_ to House Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 186,  
Page 1, Line 27, by inserting after said line the following:

"Further amend said bill, Page 6, Section 301.3175, Line 32, by inserting after said section and line  
the following:

"455.050. 1. Any full or ex parte order of protection granted pursuant to sections 455.010 to  
455.085 shall be to protect the petitioner from domestic violence, stalking, or sexual assault and  
may include such terms as the court reasonably deems necessary to ensure the petitioner's safety,  
including but not limited to:

(1) Temporarily enjoining the respondent from committing or threatening to commit  
domestic violence, molesting, stalking, sexual assault, or disturbing the peace of the petitioner,  
including violence against a pet;

(2) Temporarily enjoining the respondent from entering the premises of the dwelling unit of  
the petitioner when the dwelling unit is:

(a) Jointly owned, leased or rented or jointly occupied by both parties; or

(b) Owned, leased, rented or occupied by petitioner individually; or

(c) Jointly owned, leased, rented or occupied by petitioner and a person other than  
respondent; provided, however, no spouse shall be denied relief pursuant to this section by reason of  
the absence of a property interest in the dwelling unit; or

(d) Jointly occupied by the petitioner and a person other than respondent; provided that the  
respondent has no property interest in the dwelling unit; or

(3) Temporarily enjoining the respondent from communicating with the petitioner in any  
manner or through any medium.

2. Mutual orders of protection are prohibited unless both parties have properly filed written  
petitions and proper service has been made in accordance with sections 455.010 to 455.085.

3. When the court has, after a hearing for any full order of protection, issued an order of  
protection, it may, in addition:

1 (1) Award custody of any minor child born to or adopted by the parties when the court has  
2 jurisdiction over such child and no prior order regarding custody is pending or has been made, and  
3 the best interests of the child require such order be issued;

4 (2) Establish a visitation schedule that is in the best interests of the child;

5 (3) Award child support in accordance with supreme court rule 88.01 and chapter 452;

6 (4) Award maintenance to petitioner when petitioner and respondent are lawfully married in  
7 accordance with chapter 452;

8 (5) Order respondent to make or to continue to make rent or mortgage payments on a  
9 residence occupied by the petitioner if the respondent is found to have a duty to support the  
10 petitioner or other dependent household members;

11 (6) Order the respondent to pay the petitioner's rent at a residence other than the one  
12 previously shared by the parties if the respondent is found to have a duty to support the petitioner  
13 and the petitioner requests alternative housing;

14 (7) Order that the petitioner be given temporary possession of specified personal property,  
15 such as automobiles, checkbooks, keys, and other personal effects;

16 (8) Prohibit the respondent from transferring, encumbering, or otherwise disposing of  
17 specified property mutually owned or leased by the parties;

18 (9) Order the respondent to participate in a court-approved counseling program designed to  
19 help batterers stop violent behavior or to participate in a substance abuse treatment program;

20 (10) Order the respondent to pay a reasonable fee for housing and other services that have  
21 been provided or that are being provided to the petitioner by a shelter for victims of domestic  
22 violence;

23 (11) Order the respondent to pay court costs;

24 (12) Order the respondent to pay the cost of medical treatment and services that have been  
25 provided or that are being provided to the petitioner as a result of injuries sustained to the petitioner  
26 by an act of domestic violence committed by the respondent;

27 (13) Award possession and care of any pet, along with any moneys necessary to cover  
28 medical costs that may have resulted from abuse of the pet.

29 4. If, after a hearing for any full order of protection, the court issues an order of protection,  
30 the court may also:

31 (1) Prohibit the respondent from knowingly possessing or purchasing any firearm while the  
32 order is in effect;

33 (2) Inform the respondent of such prohibition in writing and, if the respondent is present,  
34 orally; and

35 (3) Forward the order to the Missouri state highway patrol so that the Missouri state  
36 highway patrol can update the respondent's record in the National Instant Criminal Background  
37 Check System (NICS). Upon receiving an order under this subsection, the Missouri state highway  
38 patrol shall notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation within twenty-four hours.

1           5. A verified petition seeking orders for maintenance, support, custody, visitation, payment  
2 of rent, payment of monetary compensation, possession of personal property, prohibiting the  
3 transfer, encumbrance, or disposal of property, or payment for services of a shelter for victims of  
4 domestic violence, shall contain allegations relating to those orders and shall pray for the orders  
5 desired.

6           ~~[5-]~~ 6. In making an award of custody, the court shall consider all relevant factors including  
7 the presumption that the best interests of the child will be served by placing the child in the custody  
8 and care of the nonabusive parent, unless there is evidence that both parents have engaged in  
9 abusive behavior, in which case the court shall not consider this presumption but may appoint a  
10 guardian ad litem or a court-appointed special advocate to represent the children in accordance with  
11 chapter 452 and shall consider all other factors in accordance with chapter 452.

12           ~~[6-]~~ 7. The court shall grant to the noncustodial parent rights to visitation with any minor  
13 child born to or adopted by the parties, unless the court finds, after hearing, that visitation would  
14 endanger the child's physical health, impair the child's emotional development or would otherwise  
15 conflict with the best interests of the child, or that no visitation can be arranged which would  
16 sufficiently protect the custodial parent from further domestic violence. The court may appoint a  
17 guardian ad litem or court-appointed special advocate to represent the minor child in accordance  
18 with chapter 452 whenever the custodial parent alleges that visitation with the noncustodial parent  
19 will damage the minor child.

20           ~~[7-]~~ 8. The court shall make an order requiring the noncustodial party to pay an amount  
21 reasonable and necessary for the support of any child to whom the party owes a duty of support  
22 when no prior order of support is outstanding and after all relevant factors have been considered, in  
23 accordance with Missouri supreme court rule 88.01 and chapter 452.

24           ~~[8-]~~ 9. The court may grant a maintenance order to a party for a period of time, not to exceed  
25 one hundred eighty days. Any maintenance ordered by the court shall be in accordance with chapter  
26 452.

27           ~~[9-]~~ 10. (1) The court may, in order to ensure that a petitioner can maintain an existing  
28 wireless telephone number or numbers, issue an order, after notice and an opportunity to be heard,  
29 directing a wireless service provider to transfer the billing responsibility for and rights to the  
30 wireless telephone number or numbers to the petitioner, if the petitioner is not the wireless service  
31 accountholder.

32           (2) (a) The order transferring billing responsibility for and rights to the wireless telephone  
33 number or numbers to the petitioner shall list the name and billing telephone number of the  
34 accountholder, the name and contact information of the person to whom the telephone number or  
35 numbers will be transferred, and each telephone number to be transferred to that person. The court  
36 shall ensure that the contact information of the petitioner is not provided to the accountholder in  
37 proceedings held under this chapter.

38           (b) Upon issuance, a copy of the full order of protection shall be transmitted, either  
39 electronically or by certified mail, to the wireless service provider's registered agent listed with the

1 secretary of state, or electronically to the email address provided by the wireless service provider.  
 2 Such transmittal shall constitute adequate notice for the wireless service provider acting under this  
 3 section and section 455.523.

4 (c) If the wireless service provider cannot operationally or technically effectuate the order  
 5 due to certain circumstances, the wireless service provider shall notify the petitioner within three  
 6 business days. Such circumstances shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 7 a. The accountholder has already terminated the account;
- 8 b. The differences in network technology prevent the functionality of a device on the  
 9 network; or
- 10 c. There are geographic or other limitations on network or service availability.

11 (3) (a) Upon transfer of billing responsibility for and rights to a wireless telephone number  
 12 or numbers to the petitioner under this subsection by a wireless service provider, the petitioner shall  
 13 assume all financial responsibility for the transferred wireless telephone number or numbers,  
 14 monthly service costs, and costs for any mobile device associated with the wireless telephone  
 15 number or numbers.

16 (b) This section shall not preclude a wireless service provider from applying any routine and  
 17 customary requirements for account establishment to the petitioner as part of this transfer of billing  
 18 responsibility for a wireless telephone number or numbers and any devices attached to that number  
 19 or numbers including, but not limited to, identification, financial information, and customer  
 20 preferences.

21 (4) This section shall not affect the ability of the court to apportion the assets and debts of  
 22 the parties as provided for in law, or the ability to determine the temporary use, possession, and  
 23 control of personal property.

24 (5) No cause of action shall lie against any wireless service provider, its officers, employees,  
 25 or agents, for actions taken in accordance with the terms of a court order issued under this section.

26 (6) As used in this section and section 455.523, a "wireless service provider" means a  
 27 provider of commercial mobile service under Section 332(d) of the federal [Telecommunications]  
 28 Communications Act of [~~1996~~] 1934 (47 U.S.C. Section [~~151, et seq.~~] 332).

29 455.523. 1. Any full order of protection granted under sections 455.500 to 455.538 shall be  
 30 to protect the victim from domestic violence, including danger to the child's pet, stalking, and sexual  
 31 assault may include such terms as the court reasonably deems necessary to ensure the petitioner's  
 32 safety, including but not limited to:

- 33 (1) Temporarily enjoining the respondent from committing domestic violence or sexual  
 34 assault, threatening to commit domestic violence or sexual assault, stalking, molesting, or disturbing  
 35 the peace of the victim;
- 36 (2) Temporarily enjoining the respondent from entering the family home of the victim,  
 37 except as specifically authorized by the court;
- 38 (3) Temporarily enjoining the respondent from communicating with the victim in any  
 39 manner or through any medium, except as specifically authorized by the court.

1           2. If, after a hearing for any full order of protection, the court issues an order of protection,  
2 the court may also:

3           (1) Prohibit the respondent from knowingly possessing or purchasing any firearm while the  
4 order is in effect;

5           (2) Inform the respondent of such prohibition in writing and, if the respondent is present,  
6 orally; and

7           (3) Forward the order to the Missouri state highway patrol so that the Missouri state  
8 highway patrol can update the respondent's record in the National Instant Criminal Background  
9 Check System (NICS). Upon receiving an order under this subsection, the Missouri state highway  
10 patrol shall notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation within twenty-four hours.

11           3. When the court has, after hearing for any full order of protection, issued an order of  
12 protection, it may, in addition:

13           (1) Award custody of any minor child born to or adopted by the parties when the court has  
14 jurisdiction over such child and no prior order regarding custody is pending or has been made, and  
15 the best interests of the child require such order be issued;

16           (2) Award visitation;

17           (3) Award child support in accordance with supreme court rule 88.01 and chapter 452;

18           (4) Award maintenance to petitioner when petitioner and respondent are lawfully married in  
19 accordance with chapter 452;

20           (5) Order respondent to make or to continue to make rent or mortgage payments on a  
21 residence occupied by the victim if the respondent is found to have a duty to support the victim or  
22 other dependent household members;

23           (6) Order the respondent to participate in a court-approved counseling program designed to  
24 help stop violent behavior or to treat substance abuse;

25           (7) Order the respondent to pay, to the extent that he or she is able, the costs of his or her  
26 treatment, together with the treatment costs incurred by the victim;

27           (8) Order the respondent to pay a reasonable fee for housing and other services that have  
28 been provided or that are being provided to the victim by a shelter for victims of domestic violence;

29           (9) Order a wireless service provider, in accordance with the process, provisions, and  
30 requirements set out in subdivisions (1) to (6) of subsection 9 of section 455.050, to transfer the  
31 billing responsibility for and rights to the wireless telephone number or numbers of any minor  
32 children in the petitioner's care to the petitioner, if the petitioner is not the wireless service  
33 accountholder;

34           (10) Award possession and care of any pet, along with any moneys necessary to cover  
35 medical costs that may have resulted from abuse of the pet."; and

37 Further amend said bill, Page 11, Section 558.043, Line 16, by inserting after all of said section and  
38 line the following:

1 "565.076. 1. A person commits the offense of domestic assault in the fourth degree if the  
2 act involves a domestic victim, as the term "domestic victim" is defined under section 565.002, and:

3 (1) The person attempts to cause or recklessly causes physical injury, physical pain, or  
4 illness to such domestic victim;

5 (2) With criminal negligence the person causes physical injury to such domestic victim by  
6 means of a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument;

7 (3) The person purposely places such domestic victim in apprehension of immediate  
8 physical injury by any means;

9 (4) The person recklessly engages in conduct which creates a substantial risk of death or  
10 serious physical injury to such domestic victim;

11 (5) The person knowingly causes physical contact with such domestic victim knowing he or  
12 she will regard the contact as offensive; or

13 (6) The person knowingly attempts to cause or causes the isolation of such domestic victim  
14 by unreasonably and substantially restricting or limiting his or her access to other persons,  
15 telecommunication devices or transportation for the purpose of isolation.

16 2. The offense of domestic assault in the fourth degree is a class A misdemeanor, unless the  
17 person has previously been found guilty of the offense of domestic assault, of any assault offense  
18 under this chapter, or of any offense against a domestic victim committed in violation of any county  
19 or municipal ordinance in any state, any state law, any federal law, or any military law which if  
20 committed in this state two or more times would be a violation of this section, in which case it is a  
21 class E felony. The offenses described in this subsection may be against the same domestic victim  
22 or against different domestic victims.

23 3. Upon a person's conviction for the offense of domestic assault in the fourth degree, the  
24 court shall forward the record of conviction to the Missouri state highway patrol so that the Missouri  
25 state highway patrol can update the respondent's record in the National Instant Criminal Background  
26 Check System (NICS). Upon receiving a record under this subsection, the Missouri state highway  
27 patrol shall notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation within twenty-four hours.

28 565.227. 1. A person commits the offense of stalking in the second degree if he or she  
29 purposely, through his or her course of conduct, disturbs, or follows with the intent to disturb  
30 another person.

31 2. This section shall not apply to activities of federal, state, county, or municipal law  
32 enforcement officers conducting investigations of any violation of federal, state, county, or  
33 municipal law.

34 3. Any law enforcement officer may arrest, without a warrant, any person he or she has  
35 probable cause to believe has violated the provisions of this section.

36 4. The offense of stalking in the second degree is a class A misdemeanor, unless the  
37 defendant has previously been found guilty of a violation of this section or section 565.225, or of  
38 any offense committed in another jurisdiction which, if committed in this state, would be chargeable  
39 or indictable as a violation of any offense listed in this section or section 565.225, or unless the

1 victim is intentionally targeted as a law enforcement officer, as defined in section 556.061, or the  
 2 victim is targeted because he or she is a relative within the second degree of consanguinity or  
 3 affinity to a law enforcement officer, in which case stalking in the second degree is a class E felony.

4 5. Upon a person's conviction for the offense of stalking in the second degree, the court shall  
 5 forward the record of conviction to the Missouri state highway patrol so that the Missouri state  
 6 highway patrol can update the respondent's record in the National Instant Criminal Background  
 7 Check System (NICS). Upon receiving a record under this subsection, the Missouri state highway  
 8 patrol shall notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation within twenty-four hours."; and

9  
 10 Further amend said bill, Page 26, Section 571.070, Line 7, by deleting the word "or"; and

11  
 12 Further amend said bill, page, and section, Line 8, by deleting said line and inserting in lieu thereof  
 13 the following:

14  
 15 "(3) Such person has been convicted of a misdemeanor offense of domestic violence under  
 16 the laws of this state, or of a crime under the laws of any state or of the United States that if  
 17 committed in this state would be a misdemeanor offense of domestic violence; or

18 (4) Such person is subject to an order of protection granted under sections 455.010 to  
 19 455.095 or sections 455.500 to 455.538 that was issued after a hearing of which the person had  
 20 actual notice and at which the person had an opportunity to participate or such person is subject to  
 21 an equivalent order issued under the laws of another state or the United States; or

22 (5) Such person was adjudicated delinquent when he or she was under the age of"; and

23  
 24 Further amend said bill, page, and section, Line 15, by inserting after said line the following:

25  
 26 "4. As used in this section, the following terms mean:

27 (1) "Family or household member", the same meaning as such term is defined under section  
 28 455.010;

29 (2) "Misdemeanor offense of domestic violence":

30 (a) Domestic assault in the fourth degree under section 565.076;

31 (b) Stalking in the second degree under section 565.227; or

32 (c) Any misdemeanor offense committed by a family or household member of the victim  
 33 that involves the use or attempted use of physical force or the threatened use of a deadly weapon."  
 34 and"; and

 36 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
 37 accordingly.
