4	"(b) Maintain geographic proximity, except as specified in this paragraph. The following
5	provisions shall apply with respect to this requirement:
6	a. Until August 28, 2025, an advanced practice registered nurse providing services in a
7	correctional center, as defined in section 217.010, and his or her collaborating physician shall satisfy
8	the geographic proximity requirement if they practice within two hundred miles by road of one
9	another. An incarcerated patient who requests or requires a physician consultation shall be treated
10	by a physician as soon as appropriate;
11	b. The collaborative practice arrangement may allow for geographic proximity to be waived
12	for a maximum of twenty-eight days per calendar year for rural health clinics as defined by P.L. 95-
13	210 (42 U.S.C. Section 1395x, as amended), as long as the collaborative practice arrangement
14	includes alternative plans as required in paragraph (c) of this subdivision. This exception to
15	geographic proximity shall apply only to independent rural health clinics, provider-based rural
16	health clinics where the provider is a critical access hospital as provided in 42 U.S.C. Section 1395i-
17	4, and provider-based rural health clinics where the main location of the hospital sponsor is greater
18	than fifty miles from the clinic[-]:
19	c. The collaborative practice arrangement may allow for geographic proximity to be waived
20	when the arrangement outlines the use of telehealth, as defined in section 191.1145;
21	d. In addition to the waivers and exemptions provided in this subsection, an application for a
22	waiver for any other reason of any applicable geographic proximity shall be available if a physician
23	is collaborating with an advanced practice registered nurse in excess of any geographic proximity
24	limit. The board of nursing and the state board of registration for the healing arts shall review each
25	application for a waiver of geographic proximity and approve the application if the boards
26	determine that adequate supervision exists between the collaborating physician and the advanced
27	practice registered nurse. The boards shall have forty-five calendar days to review the completed
28	application for the waiver of geographic proximity. If no action is taken by the boards within forty-
29	five days after the submission of the application for a waiver, then the application shall be deemed

1	approved. If the application is denied by the board, the provisions of section 536.063 for contested
2	cases shall apply and govern proceedings for appellate purposes; and
3	e. The collaborating physician is required to maintain documentation related to this
4	requirement and to present it to the state board of registration for the healing arts when requested;

5	requirement shall not authorize a physician in implementing such protocols, standing orders, or
6	delegation to violate applicable standards for safe medical practice established by hospital's medical
