1 2 3	AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 515, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting after all of the said section and line the following:
4	"9.138. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the first week of
5	March as ["Math, Engineering, Technology and Science (METS) Week"] "Science, Technology,
6	Engineering, and Math (STEM) Week", and recommending to the people of the state that the week
7	be appropriately observed through activities that will result in an increased awareness of the
8	importance of advancing community interest in [math, engineering, technology, and science]
9	science, technology, engineering, and math programs, and promote [METS] STEM careers
10	statewide in order to advance Missouri's workforce. The proclamation shall also recommend that
11	the week be observed with appropriate activities in public schools. Public and private involvement
12	in [METS] STEM week demonstrates that fostering and encouraging interest in the sciences is a
13	major factor in determining growth and success in school and will help students develop a focus on
14	technology-based careers after graduation.
15	161.264. 1. Subject to appropriation, the department of elementary and secondary education
16	shall establish a statewide program to be known as the "STEM Career Awareness Activity Program"
17	to increase STEM career awareness among students in grades nine through twelve. For the purposes
18	of this section, "STEM" means science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
19	2. The department of elementary and secondary education shall promote the statewide
20	program beginning in the 2024-25 school year. The program shall introduce students in grades nine
21	through twelve to a wide variety of STEM careers and technology through an activity program that
22	involves participating in STEM-related activities at state, national, or international competitions.
23	3. (1) By January 1, 2024, the department of elementary and secondary education shall
24	solicit proposals to provide the activity program. By March 1, 2024, the department of elementary
25	and secondary education shall select a provider for the program.
26	(2) The department shall select a provider that presents quantitative or qualitative data
27	demonstrating the effectiveness of the program in any of the following areas:
28	(a) Helping teachers improve their instruction in STEM- related subjects;
29	(b) Increasing the likelihood that students will go on to study a STEM-related subject at a
30	four-year college upon graduation from high school; or

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1	(c) Increasing the likelihood that students will enter the STEM workforce upon graduation
2	from high school or college.
3	(3) The department shall select a provider that delivers a program that meets the following
4	criteria:
5	(a) Provides an activity program that is led by teachers who are fully certified to teach in
6	STEM-related subjects in grades nine through twelve under the laws governing the certification of
7	teachers in Missouri; and
8	(b) Facilitates a cohort of students in grades nine through twelve to participate in STEM-
9	related activities at state, national, or international competitions.
10	4. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections 2 and 3 of this section to the contrary, the
11	department of elementary and secondary education may choose a third-party nonprofit entity to
12	implement the statewide program, solicit proposals, and select a provider as described under
13	subsection 3 of this section.
14	5. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "STEM Career Awareness Activity
15	Fund". The fund shall consist of any appropriations, gifts, bequests, or public or private donations
16	to such fund. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170
17	and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements of public moneys in accordance with
18	distribution requirements and procedures developed by the department of elementary and secondary
19	education. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, moneys in the fund shall be
20	used solely for the administration of this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080
21	to the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the
22	credit of the general revenue fund. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same
23	manner as other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be
24	credited to the fund.
25	6. The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate all necessary
26	rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that
27	term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall
28	become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if
29	applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers
30	vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to
31	disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking
32	authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2023, shall be invalid and void."; and
