2. As used in this sect	tion, the following terms mean:
(1) "Community polic	eing zone", an area that is designated as such by a city, town, or village
and where law enforcement ta	akes a proactive approach to address public safety concerns;
(2) "Eligible taxpayer	", any individual subject to the state income tax imposed under chapter
143, excluding the withholdin	g tax imposed under sections 143.191 to 143.265, who is employed as
a law enforcement officer;	
(3) "High-crime area"	, an area, as determined by the department of public safety, that has a
crime rate in the top twenty-fi	ive percent of all areas listed in the report required under subsection 4
of this section;	
(4) "Present address",	the address stated on an eligible taxpayer's income tax return;
(5) "Tax credit", a cre	dit against the tax otherwise due under chapter 143, excluding

3. For all tax years be	ginning on or after January 1, 2024, an eligible taxpayer who lives in
both a high-crime area and a c	community policing zone shall be allowed to claim a tax credit against
the taxpayer's state tax liabilit	y in an amount equal to three thousand dollars.
4. The department of	public safety shall issue a report to the department of revenue that
determines the crime rate of a	reas in this state. The report shall rank areas from the highest to
lowest crime rate. Crime rate	s shall be calculated by adding the total property and violent crimes
reported in an area and dividir	ng such sum by the population of the area. The department of public
safety shall have discretion in	determining the geographic boundaries of the areas but in so
determining shall consider the	e availability of crime data and the difficulty of correlating street
addresses to the area. Areas s	shall not be as large as counties.
5. For eligible taxpaye	ers who apply for the tax credit, the department of revenue shall verify

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- 6. Tax credits issued under the provisions of this section shall be refundable but no tax credit claimed under this section shall be carried forward to any subsequent tax year.
 - 7. No tax credit claimed under this section shall be assigned, transferred, sold, or otherwise conveyed.
 - 8. The department of revenue and department of public safety shall promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section including, but not limited to, rules relating to the verification of a taxpayer's qualified amount. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2023, shall be invalid and void.
 - 9. Under section 23.253 of the Missouri sunset act:

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- (1) The provisions of the new program authorized under this section shall automatically sunset December thirty-first six years after the effective date of this section unless reauthorized by an act of the general assembly;
- (2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under this section shall automatically sunset December thirty-first twelve years after the effective date of the reauthorization of this section; and
- (3) This section shall terminate on September first of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which the program authorized under this section is sunset."; and
