FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§70.441, 571.030, 571.101, 571.107, 571.111, 571.205, 577.703, and 577.712 – CCW

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Kansas City Police Department**, the **St. Joseph Police Department**, the **St. Louis County Police Department**, and the **Phelps County Sheriff's Department** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight notes this bill lowers the age requirement from nineteen to eighteen for a concealed carry permit, which may increase the number of CCW applications submitted to county sheriffs. Oversight assumes any increase in revenue to sheriff's departments will be offset by an increase in cost to process the applications for CCW permits. Therefore, the impact to local governments-sheriff's departments will be presented as netting to \$0.

House Amendment (HA) 1

Oversight assumes House Amendment 1 is a title change and will have no fiscal impact on state or local governments.

House Amendment (HA) 2

§§571.030, 571.107, 571.117, 571.215, 571.225 – Concealed firearms

In response to similar legislation from 2023 (HCS HB 485), officials from the **Kansas City Police Department** and the **Phelps County Sheriff's Department** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version (HB 485), officials from the **El Dorado Springs Police Department** and the **St. Joseph Police Department** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Responses regarding the proposed legislation as a whole

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office**, the **Department of Corrections**, the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Revenue**, the

Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Missouri National Guard, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Missouri Senate, the Office of the State Public Defender, the City of Kansas City, the City of Springfield, and the Branson Police Department assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities and local law enforcement were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the MOLIS database is available upon request.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Currently, it is a crime to board a bus with a dangerous or deadly weapon or carry such a weapon in a terminal.

This bill allows a concealed carry permit holder to lawfully carry firearms on public transportation, as defined in the bill. Anyone with a permit may also carry a firearm while

traveling by bus. This bill does not apply to property of Amtrak or any partnership in which Amtrak engages.

This bill expands the listed items that satisfy the requirement that an applicant for a concealed carry permit demonstrate knowledge of firearms safety training to include, for active duty military service members, receipt of a pistol marksmanship recognition.

Currently, an applicant is not eligible for a concealed carry permit or a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit if the applicant has pled guilty to, entered a plea of nolo contendere, or been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment of a term exceeding one year or has pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to one or more misdemeanor offenses involving crimes of violence within a five-year period immediately preceding application for the permit. This bill removes the ban on eligibility for a concealed carry permit or a Missouri lifetime or extended concealed carry permit if the applicant has pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere of such crimes.

This bill expands the list of persons exempted from certain prohibitions on the unlawful use of weapons as provided for in 571.030, RSMo, to now include certain retired judiciary members and current and former members of the General Assembly.

This bill lowers the age requirement from at least 19 to 18 years of age or older for concealed carry permits.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.


