ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of Administration** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight notes, according to the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL):

"In the last five years, 19 states have enacted legislation or passed resolutions to provide for year-round daylight saving time, if Congress were to allow such a change, and in some cases, if surrounding states enact the same legislation. Because federal law does not currently allow full-time DST, Congress would have to act before states could adopt changes. The 19 states are:

- Colorado (2022)
- Alabama, Georgia, Minnesota, Mississippi and Montana (2021).
- Idaho, Louisiana, Ohio (resolution), South Carolina, Utah and Wyoming (2020).
- Arkansas, Delaware, Maine, Oregon, Tennessee and Washington (2019).
- Florida (2018; California voters also authorized such a change that year, but legislative action is pending)."
