FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 9.025 Historical Designations

Officials from **Office of Administration** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agency has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on the organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, **Oversight** will reflect a <u>zero impact</u> on the fiscal note for this section.

Section 620.4000 "U.S. Grant Heritage Area"

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development (DED)** assume the proposal establishes the US Grant Heritage Area to be managed by the Division of Tourism. This will require an FTE to administer, as the division is currently charged with marketing efforts for the state, and this legislation creates a new area within the Division of Tourism. At a minimum, this will require 1.0 FTE (Economic Development Professional) along with needed equipment, telecommunications, professional development and travel to the various counties in the state of Missouri. The FTE will be paid for by the Tourism Supplemental Revenue Fund, which is funded by a GR transfer every year. The grants the division is charged with managing are subject to a GR appropriation and the amount is unknown at this time.

Oversight notes the officials from the DED provided additional information regarding the need for FTE and note:

DED responded to the similar proposal, HB 308 - 2023, and the Division of Tourism did not request an FTE because they prepared a comment memo asking for the program to be managed by Department of Natural Resources, and responded as if the program was going to be moved. When DED received this proposal, one FTE was added to the fiscal note since the Division of Tourism would not be able to manage this program with their current FTE.

Oversight notes the officials from the DED assume the proposal will have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect DED's estimated cost for one FTE (Economic Development Professional at \$58,128 annually) beginning FY 2024 in the fiscal note.

Lastly, **Oversight** will show the funds being transferred out of the general revenue and appropriated into the Division of Tourism Supplemental Revenue Fund (0274) resulting in net zero after FTE expenditures.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources**, the **Office of the Secretary of State**, the **City of Kansas City**, and the **City of Springfield** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact

on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a <u>zero</u> impact in the fiscal note for the above agencies.
