FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** state the proposed legislation creates provisions relating to gender transition procedures. The Section for Health Standards and Licensure could potentially receive complaints that would have to be investigated at hospitals or Ambulatory Surgical Centers (ASCs) as a result of this legislation. It is anticipated the number of complaints would be minimal and could be absorbed into the Section's normal complaint workload.

The Department anticipates being able to absorb the costs of this bill with current resources. However, if the workload significantly increased or other legislation was enacted, additional resources would be requested through the appropriation process. Until the FY24 budget is final, the Department cannot identify specific funding sources.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Officials from the Office of Administration - Budget and Planning, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol, Kansas City, the University of Central Missouri and St. Charles Community College each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (SB 49), officials from the **Department of Social Services** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities and counties were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.
