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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 161.670 - Virtual School (as amended)

Officials from **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume changes to the MOCAP program will result in increased ADA claimed as part of the Foundation Formula. The increase to the formula call would depend on the school districts involved, number of students and local contributions. Any additional ADA claimed may result in a zero to unknown increase to the appropriation required to fully fund the formula.

Officials from the **Office of Administration – Information Technology** state it is assumed that every new IT project/system will be bid out because all ITSD resources are at full capacity. This project would have to be prioritized by DESE to be worked among DESE's other projects. ITSD assumes there will be modifications made to the foundation formula calculation. ITSD estimates the project would take 1,231.20 hours at a contract rate of \$95 for a total cost of \$116,964 with on-going support costs.

Oversight notes, currently, the attendance of a student enrolled in virtual course shall equal ninety-four percent of the hours of attendance possible (§162.1250.3). Oversight assumes this proposal would change the attendance calculation to equal the host district's or charter school's prior-year average attendance percentage. Oversight is uncertain how the average attendance would be calculated but notes the following estimated attendance rates in the table below.

Oversight assumes the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent mitigation policies may have impacted the attendance numbers for the 2021 school year. In school year 2019 (pre-pandemic), the ADA as percent of enrollment for Missouri was 95.4% (839,546 / 879,708).

Oversight assumes the impact to the foundation formula (if fully funded) would depend on the host district's attendance rate; therefore, Oversight will show a range of impact of an unknown cost to an unknown savings from the changes to attendance hours with corresponding gains or losses to the school districts.

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Oversight notes one full term of attendance is 1,044 hours per student. For each full term of attendance, the average state funding per ADA is <u>approximately at \$5,066</u> (per DESE from a previous year) or \$4.85 per hour of full term attendance. However, Oversight notes this is an approximation of the cost as the state aid payment can vary greatly by district.

Oversight estimates to reach a revenue impact of \$250,000 would require a change in attendance hours of approximately 52,000 hours or approximately 50 ADA (52,000 * \$4.85 = \$252,200). Oversight notes a change of 52,000 hours is approximately a 1.0% change virtual attendance hours assuming all 3,949 virtual students enrolled in a full-time course load (according to the 2020-21 Annual Report – Missouri Course Access and Virtual School Program); therefore, Oversight assumes it is possible the cost or savings could exceed \$250,000.

Oversight received no responses from school districts related to the fiscal impact of this proposal. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information available. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, school districts were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill modifies the calculation for full-time virtual students completing required instructional activities. The bill requires host school districts to adopt enrollment policies regarding student enrollment and allows virtual schools to mutually agree with a resident school district on services that the district might offer including possible financial reimbursements for those services. The bill also clarifies that student progress reports are only necessary for part-time virtual school program enrollees.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
