AN ACT

To amend chapters 9 and 620, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to historical designations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapters 9 and 620, RSMo, are amended by adding thereto two new sections, to be known as sections 9.025 and 620.4000, to read as follows:

9.025. The following historical designations shall be celebrated in Missouri each month on a yearly basis:

- (1) January as Veterans History Month;**
- (2) February as Black History Month;**
- (3) March as Women's History Month;**
- (4) April as Arts History Month;**
- (5) May as County and Community History Month;**
- (6) June as Sports History Month;**
- (7) July as Liberty History Month;**
- (8) August as Missouri History Month;**
- (9) September as Humanities History Month;**
- (10) October as Agriculture History Month;**
- (11) November as Native American History Month; and**
- (12) December as Religion History Month.**

620.4000. 1. There is hereby established within the division of tourism within the department of economic development the "U.S. Grant Heritage Area" to be managed and administered by the director of tourism in accordance with this section.

2. (1) The U.S. Grant heritage area shall consist of the following counties:

5 (a) Tier one counties shall be: Audrain, Bollinger, Callaway, Cape Girardeau,
6 Cole, Franklin, Gasconade, Iron, Jefferson, Madison, Marion, Mississippi, Monroe,
7 Montgomery, New Madrid, Perry, Pike, Ralls, Scott, Shelby, St. Francois, Ste.
8 Genevieve, Stoddard, Warren, and Washington; and

9 (b) Tier two counties shall be: St. Charles County, St. Louis County, and the city
10 of St. Louis.

11 (2) There shall be no distinction in the administration of the heritage area
12 between tier one and tier two counties, except that the division of tourism may
13 distinguish between such tiers in the percentage of funding allowed, provided that the
14 same percentage shall apply to all counties of the same tier and the division of tourism
15 shall not allow the grant of appropriated public funds to exceed fifty percent of total
16 funds received from all sources for tier one counties and twenty-five percent of total
17 funds received from all sources for tier two counties for any purpose authorized by this
18 section or by a management plan approved under subsection 6 of this section.

19 3. (1) The Missouri humanities council and the National U.S. Grant Trail
20 Association, Missouri chapter, shall administer the provisions of this section, subject to a
21 division of responsibilities adopted by rule by the division of tourism.

22 (2) The provisions of this section shall be subject to appropriation and such
23 appropriation shall be to the division of tourism or directly to the Missouri humanities
24 council.

25 4. (1) Subject to appropriation, the Missouri humanities council shall dedicate a
26 staff member who will oversee the preparation of a management plan as required by
27 subsection 6 of this section, and who shall be responsible for coordinating outreach to
28 county and municipal governments, agencies, nonprofit organizations, and civic groups
29 within the boundaries of the heritage area, until such time as the management plan has
30 been presented to the director of tourism.

31 (2) Subject to appropriation, the division of tourism shall establish a committee
32 to advise the division and to further facilitate outreach to included counties. The
33 committee shall be composed of eleven members selected as follows:

34 (a) The executive director of Missouri humanities council or his or her designee;

35 (b) The executive director of the state historical society of Missouri or his or her
36 designee;

37 (c) The executive director of the Missouri historical society or his or her
38 designee;

39 (d) The chair of the National U.S. Grant Trail Association, Missouri chapter, or
40 his or her designee; and

41 (e) Residents of the following Missouri senate districts, appointed by the director
42 of the division of tourism: 03, 06, 10, 18, 25, 26, and 27.

43 5. The division of state parks, the state historic preservation office, the Missouri
44 state library and records and archives division of the office of the secretary of state, and
45 the department of conservation shall cooperate with the division of tourism in the
46 development and administration of the management plan.

47 6. Within two years of the date of appropriation of funds to develop the
48 management plan, the Missouri humanities council and the National U.S. Grant Trail
49 Association, Missouri chapter, shall submit to the director of tourism a proposed
50 management plan for the heritage area. The management plan for the heritage area
51 shall include the following elements:

52 (1) Comprehensive policies, goals, strategies, and recommendations for telling
53 the story of the heritage of the region and encouraging long-term resource protection,
54 enhancement, interpretation, funding, management, and development of the heritage
55 area;

56 (2) Consideration for existing state, county, and local plans in the development
57 and implementation of the management plan;

58 (3) A description of actions and commitments that governments, private
59 organizations, and citizens plan to take to protect, enhance, and interpret the cultural,
60 historical, archaeological, natural, and recreational resources of the heritage area;

61 (4) Existing and potential sources of funding or economic development strategies
62 to protect, enhance, interpret, fund, manage, and develop the heritage area;

63 (5) An inventory of the cultural, historical, archaeological, natural, and
64 recreational resources of the heritage area relating to the stories and themes of the
65 region that should be protected, enhanced, managed, or developed;

66 (6) Policies and strategies for resource management including the development
67 of intergovernmental and interagency agreements to protect the natural, historic,
68 cultural, educational, scenic, and recreational resources of the heritage area;

69 (7) A program for implementation of the management plan, including:

70 (a) Performance goals;

71 (b) Plans for resource protection, enhancement, and interpretation; and

72 (c) Specific commitments for implementation that have been made by the
73 Missouri humanities council; the National U.S. Grant Trail Association, Missouri
74 chapter; or any government, organization, business, or individual;

75 (8) Analysis of, and recommendations for, ways in which federal, state, tribal,
76 and local programs may best be coordinated, including the role of the National Park

77 Service and other federal agencies associated with the heritage area, to further the
78 purposes of this section;

79 (9) An interpretive plan for the heritage area; and

80 (10) A business plan that:

81 (a) Describes the role, operation, financing, and functions of the local
82 coordinating entity and of each of the major activities described in the management
83 plan; and

84 (b) Provides adequate assurances that the local coordinating entity has the
85 partnerships and financial and other resources necessary to implement the management
86 plan for the heritage area.

87 7. (1) In determining whether to approve a management plan for the heritage
88 area, the director of tourism shall consider:

89 (a) The diverse interests of the heritage area, including federal government
90 liaisons; state, tribal, and local governments; natural and historical resource protection
91 organizations; educational, business, and recreational organizations; community
92 residents; and private property owners;

93 (b) If there was adequate opportunity for public and federal, state, tribal, and
94 local governmental involvement in the preparation of the management plan and the
95 plan provides for at least semiannual public meetings to ensure adequate
96 implementation of the management plan;

97 (c) If resource protection, enhancement, interpretation, funding, management,
98 and development strategies described in the management plan would adequately
99 protect, enhance, interpret, fund, manage, and develop the natural, historical, cultural,
100 educational, scenic, and recreational resources of the heritage area;

101 (d) Demonstration of financial capability to carry out the plan;

102 (e) Assurances of support from state, tribal, and local officials; and

103 (f) Demonstrated partnerships between federal, state, tribal, and local
104 governments; regional planning organizations; nonprofit organizations; or private
105 sector entities to aid in implementation of the management plan.

106 (2) If the director of tourism disapproves of the management, he or she:

107 (a) Shall advise the Missouri humanities council and the National U.S. Grant
108 Trail Association, Missouri chapter, in writing of the reasons for the disapproval; and

109 (b) May make recommendations for revisions to the management plan.

110 (3) Upon receipt of the revised management plan, the director of tourism shall
111 approve or disapprove of the plan within one hundred eighty days.
