# **HOUSE BILL NO. 867**

## AN ACT

To repeal sections 168.036 and 169.560, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to public school retirement systems.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 168.036 and 169.560, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 168.036 and 169.560, to read as follows:

168.036. 1. In addition to granting certificates of license to teach in public schools of the state under section 168.021, the state board of education shall grant substitute teacher certificates as provided in this section to any individual seeking to substitute teach in any public school in this state.

5 2. (1) The state board shall not grant a certificate of license to teach under this section 6 to any individual who has not completed a background check as required under section 7 168.021.

8 (2) The state board may refuse to issue or renew, suspend, or revoke any certificate 9 sought or issued under this section in the same manner and for the same reasons as under 10 section 168.071.

3. The state board may grant a certificate under this section to any individual who hascompleted:

13 (1) At least thirty-six semester hours at an accredited institution of higher education;14 or

15 (2) The twenty-hour online training program required in this section and who 16 possesses a high school diploma or the equivalent thereof.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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4. The department of elementary and secondary education shall develop and maintain
an online training program for individuals, which shall consist of twenty hours of training
related to subjects appropriate for substitute teachers as determined by the department.

5. The state board may grant a certificate under this section to any highly qualified individual with expertise in a technical or business field or with experience in the Armed Forces of the United States who has completed the background check required in this section but does not meet any of the qualifications under subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 3 of this section if the superintendent of the school district in which the individual seeks to substitute teach sponsors such individual and the school board of the school district in which the individual seeks to substitute teach votes to approve such individual to substitute teach.

27 6. (1) Notwithstanding any other provisions to contrary, beginning on June 30, 2022, 28 and ending on June 30, [2025] 2027, any person who is retired and currently receiving a 29 retirement allowance under sections 169.010 to 169.141 or sections 169.600 to 169.715, other 30 than for disability, may be employed to substitute teach on a part-time or temporary substitute 31 basis by an employer included in the retirement system without a discontinuance of the 32 person's retirement allowance. Such a person shall not contribute to the retirement system, or 33 to the public school retirement system established by sections 169.010 to 169.141 or to the 34 public education employee retirement system established by sections 169.600 to 169.715, because of earnings during such period of employment. 35

36 (2) In addition to the conditions set forth in subdivision 1 of this subsection, any 37 person retired and currently receiving a retirement allowance under sections 169.010 to 38 169.141, other than for disability, who is employed by a third party or is performing work as 39 an independent contractor may be employed to substitute teach on a part-time or temporary 40 substitute basis, if such person is performing work for an employer included in the retirement 41 system without a discontinuance of the person's retirement allowance.

42 (3) If a person is employed pursuant to this subsection on a regular, full-time basis the 43 person shall not be entitled to receive the person's retirement allowance for any month during 44 which the person is so employed. The retirement system may require the employer, the third-45 party employer, the independent contractor, and the retiree subject to this subsection to 46 provide documentation showing compliance with this subsection. If such documentation is 47 not provided, the retirement system may deem the retiree to have exceeded the limitations 48 provided in this subsection.

7. A certificate granted under this section shall be valid for four years. A certificate
granted under this section shall expire at the end of any calendar year in which the individual
fails to substitute teach for at least five days or forty hours of in-seat instruction.

52 8. (1) An individual to whom the state board grants a certificate under this section 53 may be a substitute teacher in a public school in the state if the school district agrees to

employ the individual as a substitute teacher and such individual has completed a backgroundcheck as required in subsection 10 of this section.

56 (2) No individual to whom the state board grants a certificate under this section and 57 who is under twenty years of age shall be a substitute teacher in grades nine to twelve.

9. Each school district may develop an orientation for individuals to whom the state board grants a certificate under this section for such individuals employed by the school district and may require such individuals to complete such orientation. Such orientation shall contain at least two hours of subjects appropriate for substitute teachers and shall contain instruction on the school district's best practices for classroom management.

10. Beginning January 1, 2023, any substitute teacher may, at the time such substitute teacher submits the fingerprints and information required for the background check required under section 168.021, designate up to five school districts to which such substitute teacher has submitted an application for substitute teaching to receive the results of the substitute teacher's criminal history background check and fingerprint collection. The total amount of any fees for disseminating such results to up to five school districts under this subsection shall not exceed fifty dollars.

The state board may exercise the board's authority under chapter 161 topromulgate all necessary rules and regulations necessary for the administration of this section.

169.560. 1. Any person retired and currently receiving a retirement allowance pursuant to sections 169.010 to 169.141, other than for disability, may be employed in any 2 3 capacity for an employer included in the retirement system created by those sections on either 4 a part-time or temporary-substitute basis not to exceed a total of five hundred fifty hours in any one school year, and through such employment may earn up to fifty percent of the annual 5 compensation payable under the employer's salary schedule for the position or positions filled 6 by the retiree, given such person's level of experience and education, without a 7 discontinuance of the person's retirement allowance. If the employer does not utilize a 8 9 salary schedule, or if the position in question is not subject to the employer's salary schedule, 10 a retiree employed in accordance with the provisions of this subsection may earn up to fifty percent of the annual compensation paid to the person or persons who last held such position 11 or positions. If the position or positions did not previously exist, the compensation limit shall 12 be determined in accordance with rules duly adopted by the board of trustees of the retirement 13 system; provided that, it shall not exceed fifty percent of the annual compensation payable for 14 15 the position by the employer that is most comparable to the position filled by the retiree. In any case where a retiree fills more than one position during the school year, the fifty-percent 16 17 limit on permitted earning shall be based solely on the annual compensation of the highest paid position occupied by the retiree for at least one-fifth of the total hours worked during the 18 year. Such a person shall not contribute to the retirement system or to the public education 19

20 employee retirement system established by sections 169.600 to 169.715 because of earnings 21 during such period of employment. If such a person is employed in any capacity by such an 22 employer in excess of the limitations set forth in this subsection, the person shall not be 23 eligible to receive the person's retirement allowance for any month during which the person is 24 so employed. In addition, such person shall contribute to the retirement system if the person 25 satisfies the retirement system's membership eligibility requirements. In addition to the 26 conditions set forth above, this subsection shall apply to any person retired and currently 27 receiving a retirement allowance under sections 169.010 to 169.141, other than for disability, 28 who is employed by a third party or is performing work as an independent contractor, if such person is performing work for an employer included in the retirement system as a temporary 29 or long-term substitute teacher or in any other position that would normally require that 30 person to be duly certificated under the laws governing the certification of teachers in 31 32 Missouri if such person was employed by the district. The retirement system may require the 33 employer, the third-party employer, the independent contractor, and the retiree subject to this 34 subsection to provide documentation showing compliance with this subsection. If such 35 documentation is not provided, the retirement system may deem the retiree to have exceeded 36 the limitations provided in this subsection.

37 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, any person retired and currently receiving a retirement allowance in accordance with sections 169.010 to 169.141, 38 39 other than for disability, may be employed by an employer included in the retirement system 40 created by those sections in a position that does not normally require a person employed in 41 that position to be duly certificated under the laws governing the certification of teachers in 42 Missouri, and through such employment may earn up to sixty percent of the minimum 43 teacher's salary as set forth in section 163.172, without a discontinuance of the person's retirement allowance. Such person shall not contribute to the retirement system or to the 44 45 public education employee retirement system established by sections 169.600 to 169.715 because of earnings during such period of employment, and such person shall not earn 46 47 membership service for such employment. The employer's contribution rate shall be paid by 48 the hiring employer into the public education employee retirement system established by 49 sections 169.600 to 169.715. If such a person is employed in any capacity by an employer in 50 excess of the limitations set forth in this subsection, the person shall not be eligible to receive 51 the person's retirement allowance for any month during which the person is so employed. In 52 addition, such person shall become a member of and contribute to any retirement system 53 described in this subsection if the person satisfies the retirement system's membership 54 eligibility requirements. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any person retired and currently receiving a retirement allowance in accordance with sections 169.010 to 55 169.141 employed by a public community college. 56

57 3. (1) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, beginning in the 2023-24 58 school year, and ending on June 30, 2027, any person, regardless of whether such person 59 has a certificate of license issued under section 168.021, who is retired and currently receiving a retirement allowance under this chapter, other than for disability, may be 60 employed in any capacity by an employer included in any retirement system under this 61 chapter, in a position that does not normally require a person employed in that position 62 63 to be duly certificated under the laws governing the certification of teachers in Missouri, 64 without a discontinuance of the person's retirement allowance.

65 (2) In addition to the conditions set forth in subdivision 1 of this subsection, any 66 person, regardless of whether such person has a certificate of license issued under section 168.021, who is retired and currently receiving a retirement allowance under this 67 68 chapter, other than for disability, and who is employed by a third party or is performing work as an independent contractor, may work in any capacity by an employer included 69 in any retirement system under this chapter, that does not normally require a person 70 71 employed in that position to be duly certificated under the laws governing the 72 certification of teachers in Missouri, without a discontinuance of the person's retirement 73 allowance.

(3) For any person employed during the time period and provisions established
 under this subsection, such a person shall not contribute to any retirement system under
 this chapter because of earnings during such period of employment.

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
