AN ACT

To amend chapter 324, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the practice of certain licensed professions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 324, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be
2 known as section 324.1720, to read as follows:

3 **324.1720. 1. The general assembly hereby occupies and preempts the entire field**
4 **of legislation concerning the practice of licensed professions regulated under chapters**
5 **331, 332, 334, 335, 336, 337, 338, and 340. A political subdivision of this state is**
6 **preempted from enacting, maintaining, or enforcing any order, ordinance, rule,**
7 **regulation, policy, or other similar measure that prohibits, restricts, limits, regulates,**
8 **controls, directs, or interferes with the practice of such licensed professions.**

9 **2. Nothing in this section shall preclude or preempt a political subdivision of this**
10 **state from exercising its lawful authority to regulate zoning or land use, to enforce a**
11 **building or fire code regulation, to impose a tax or license fee for the privilege of**
12 **carrying on a profession described in subsection 1 of this section consistent with the laws**
13 **regulating such taxes or license fees, or to otherwise regulate for the general health,**
14 **safety, sanitation, and welfare as long as the order, ordinance, rule, regulation, policy, or**
15 **other measure does not interfere with, restrict, or limit the ability of a lawfully licensed**
16 **person from engaging in any act or performing any procedure that falls within the**
17 **professionally recognized scope of practice of a licensed professional in the practice of a**
18 **profession described in subsection 1 of this section.**

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EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.
