BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sponsor of this House Resolution, Representative David Evans, or his designee, shall be present in the House Chamber and shall assume responsibility for the group's actions for the duration of the aforementioned event.

Special note: Participants in the aforementioned event shall conduct themselves in a manner that preserves the dignity and honor of the House of Representatives. Such persons shall behave respectfully and dress appropriately for the occasion. Food items, drinks, and smoking are prohibited on the floor of the House and lower gallery, and participants shall refrain from any conduct that diminishes the decorum of the House Chamber.

Access to the dais is limited to the Speaker's podium for purposes of using the microphone to speak to those assembled. Access to the staff area behind the rostrum is prohibited.

Group photographs; the hanging of any banners or other items on the walls, curtains, or any surface within the House Chamber; and the use of any equipment, including computers, phones, or other items on the dais and rostrum area, are also prohibited.
