

# HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 267

## 102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY

INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE BOSLEY.

1           **WHEREAS**, people of color in the United States are disproportionately the victims of  
2 shootings, chokeholds, and other uses of excessive force by law enforcement officers; and

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4           **WHEREAS**, police brutality and the use of excessive force by law enforcement  
5 officers are among the most serious ongoing human rights and civil liberties violations in the  
6 United States; and

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8           **WHEREAS**, the use of excessive force during an arrest or investigatory stop  
9 constitutes an unreasonable seizure under the Fourth Amendment to the Constitution of the  
10 United States, which guarantees the right of every person in the United States to be free from  
11 unreasonable searches and seizures at the hands of law enforcement officers; and

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13           **WHEREAS**, the use of excessive force during a period of pretrial detention  
14 constitutes the deprivation of due process under the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments to the  
15 Constitution of the United States, which guarantee the right of every person in the United  
16 States to be free from arbitrary interference with the liberty of that person at the hands of law  
17 enforcement officers; and

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19           **WHEREAS**, the use of excessive force during a term of imprisonment constitutes the  
20 use of cruel and unusual punishment under the Eighth Amendment to the Constitution of the  
21 United States, which guarantees the right of every person in the United States to be free from  
22 cruel and unusual punishment at the hands of law enforcement officers; and

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24           **WHEREAS**, the rule of law in the United States and in the state of Missouri is  
25 undermined when law enforcement officers engage in conduct inconsistent with the  
26 Constitution of the United States; and

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28           **WHEREAS**, it is a fundamental principle of a democratic society that law  
29 enforcement officers should be held to account for their actions; and

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31           **WHEREAS**, it is necessary to focus attention upon legislation to address violence  
32 committed by law enforcement and law enforcement officer accountability:

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34           **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of  
35 Representatives of the One Hundred Second General Assembly, First Regular Session, hereby  
36 urge a commitment to addressing police violence, particularly against people of color, and  
37 ensuring that law enforcement officers who engage in misconduct, discrimination, or  
38 inappropriate use of force are held accountable for their actions; and

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40           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of  
41 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the  
42 Speaker of the Missouri House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Missouri  
43 Senate, and each member of the Missouri General Assembly.

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
