AN ACT

To repeal section 115.163, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 115.163, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 115.163, to read as follows:

115.163. 1. Each election authority shall use the Missouri voter registration system established by section 115.158 to prepare a list of legally registered voters for each precinct. The list shall be arranged alphabetically or by street address as the election authority determines and shall be known as the precinct register. The precinct registers shall be kept by the election authority in a secure place, except when given to election judges for use at an election. Except as provided in subsection 6 of section 115.157, all registration records shall be open to inspection by the public at all reasonable times.

8 2. A new precinct register shall be prepared by the election authority prior to each 9 election.

3. (1) The election authority shall send to each voter, except those who registered by mail and have not voted, a [voter identification card] first-class mailing no later than ninety days prior to the date of a primary or general election for federal office, unless the voter has received such a [eard] mailing during the preceding six months. The election authority shall send to each voter who registered by mail and has not voted the verification notice required under section 115.155 no later than ninety days prior to the date of a primary or general election for federal office.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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17 (2) The [voter identification card] first-class mailing shall contain the voter's name, 18 address, political party affiliation, and precinct. The [card] mailing also shall inform the 19 voter of the personal identification requirement in section 115.427 and may also contain other 20 voting information at the discretion of the election authority.

(3) [The voter identification card shall be sent to a voter, except those who registered by mail and have not voted, after a new registration or a change of address. If any voter, except those who registered by mail and have not voted, shall lose his or her voter identification card or change political party affiliation, he or she may request a new card from the election authority.

26 (4)] The [voter identification card] first-class mailing authorized pursuant to this 27 section may be used as a canvass of voters in lieu of the provisions set out in sections 115.179 28 to 115.193.

[(5)] (4) Except as provided in subsection 6 of section 115.157, anyone, upon request and payment of a reasonable fee, may obtain a printout, list and/or computer tape of those newly registered voters or voters deleted from the voting rolls, since the last canvass or updating of the rolls.

33 [(6)] (5) The election authority may authorize the use of the postal service contractors 34 under the federal National Change of Address program to identify those voters whose address 35 is not correct on the voter registration records. The election authority shall not be required to 36 [mail a voter registration card] send a first-class mailing to those voters whose addresses are 37 incorrect. Confirmation notices to such voters required by section 115.193 shall be sent to the 38 corrected address provided by the National Change of Address program.

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
