WHEREAS, the Kansas City Chiefs are the official professional football team of the state of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2023, the Kansas City Chiefs defeated the Philadelphia Eagles in Super Bowl LVII in Glendale, Arizona; and

WHEREAS, the Chiefs overcame a ten-point deficit at halftime and scored a field goal in the final seconds to win the game; and

WHEREAS, the Chiefs Super Bowl captains included University of Missouri alumnus Nick Bolton and the season's league and Super Bowl MVP, Patrick Mahomes; and

WHEREAS, University of Missouri alumnus Nick Bolton led the Chiefs defense with a game-high nine tackles and scored a touchdown in the second quarter on a thirty-six-yard fumble return:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives, One Hundred Second General Assembly, First Regular Session, hereby congratulate the entire Chiefs organization on their second Super Bowl win in four years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the Kansas City Chiefs.
