

HB 951 -- STUDENT-TEACHER COLLABORATION ADVISORY BOARD

SPONSOR: Bland Manlove

This bill creates the "Student-Teacher Collaboration Advisory Board" made up of one deputy commissioner from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, and a student and teacher from each of the congressional districts in the state as appointed by the Commissioner of Education. A student must be in grade eight or higher and a teacher must have taught in a classroom for at least two years to be appointed to the Board.

The Board shall meet annually to discuss best practices in the classroom and programs and submit a report summarizing meeting discussions to the Governor and the General Assembly.
