Where will my children see others who look like them? In a state where only 2% of the total population identifies as Asian, this is a tough question to answer. The reality is my children are not likely to be in classrooms with many other Asian children to see themselves in their teachers, doctors, or coaches. This means my children often feel invisible.I often question our state's desire to truly care for our children and act accordingly. A bill like HB 1051 doesn't change the challenging realities that AAPI families face, discrimination, acts of violence, stereotypes, and assumptions. But it opens the door to continued conversations about the fabric of Missouri and how we can continue strengthening our communities across lines of difference. It is an opportunity for state leaders, who often disagree, to stand behind the message that my family matters. 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Dear Mr. Chairman Seitz and members of the Special Committee on Tourism, My name is Atsuki Mori. and I live in Warrensburg, Missouri. I came to the United States from Japan in 2001 with three young children, and became a citizen in 2015. I have a medical degree from a Japanese university and am currently working as a registered nurse at a community hospital in Warrensburg, Today, I would like to share my thoughts on what the designation of Asian Pacific Islander Heritage Month means and why it is important for Missouri. Warrensburg is a small college town in Johnson County. Its population was 16,340 in 2000. The Asian population is 2.8%, and the native Hawaiian & Pacific islander population was 0.1%. This population composition has not changed drastically. The population of Warrensburg was 23,313 in 2020, the Asian population was 2.7%, and the native Hawaiian & Pacific islander population was 0%. These data indicate that the population composition has not changed drastically. Simply put, there were not many Asians. For many residents of Warrensburg, we were the first Asians with who they had interacted. I knew I would face stereotyping when I decided to move to this country. Needless to say, I had unpleasant experiences because of how I talked and looked. In most cases, it was a nuisance level, but sometimes it was horrible enough to make me cry. Sadly, I learned to let my feelings go. But it broke my heart when my children faced stereotyping. They told me that being the target of constant microaggression was terrible enough to make them depressed. There were several occasions when my children rejected Japanese culture. When my oldest daughter was in the first grade, she refused to bring lunch from home because her classmates made fun of her food. My 12-year -old youngest son has a Japanese name. When he was in the 2nd grade, he came home and told me he hated Japan and his name. It shocked me because he had never been to Japan. It turned out that his classmates made fun of his name because it was unique to them. Witnessing my children rejecting their culture and identity was one of the awful experiences. Living in the United States also brought me great joy. I met many people who accepted me for who I was. They saw me as an individual, not an Asian. They accepted me as their friend. As we got to know each other more, they also started to accept my culture and show interest in it. Also, living away from Japan allowed us to appreciate Japanese culture more. API Heritage Month was initially designated as a 10-day celebration in May by Congress in 1978. In 1990, President George H. W. Bush and Congress extended the whole month of May as API Heritage Month, When I learned about API Heritage Month a few years ago, I felt that it gave me permission to be proud of my identity as a Japanese while living in the United States. It made me feel I was finally allowed and welcomed to belong to this nation even though I have lived here for almost 20 years. There are two reasons why I think the designation of API Heritage Month is important for Missouri. First, it will provide Missourians with opportunities to learn about our culture. I see the United States as a beautiful mosaic. So many cultures and traditions from all over the world come together and create one very diverse nation. And that diversity is what makes the United States great and robust. Unfortunately, some perceive diversity as unpleasant. Humans are afraid of the unknown

and constantly perform pattern recognition to find the answer to the unknown. These characteristics contributed to scientific advancements, but also cause unconscious bias. In other words, stereotyping of certain races or ethnicities is caused by a lack of information. Celebrating API Heritage Month will provide plenty of opportunities for Missourians to deepen their understanding of API cultures and reduce implicit biases towards the API community. Second, celebrating API Heritage Month statewide will promote the development of the healthy identity of API youth in Missouri. Knowing that our culture is officially recognized by the State will also increase feelings of belongingness and promote positive behaviors as responsible citizens in the entire API community in Missouri.In conclusion, I believe that the API Heritage Month designation benefits all Missourians. Please support House Bill 1051. Thank you for your time and consideration. However, as an impressional young person, I believe that having my heritage celebrated and legitimately acknowledged by leaders I respected would have made a tremendous difference in how I viewed myself then and today. I have an almost 2 year old daughter, and I smile thinking of how wonderful her young world is, knowing that our state legislature is considering making Asian and Pacific Islander Heritage Month official in the state of Missouri. I thank you for seeing this as an important topic to be heard, and passed. I do everything in my power to enrich her life with family traditions I once pushed away, and within my own community, have worked with other AAPI leaders to officially declare May as AAPI Heritage Month in the city of Kansas City. To be a part of making May officially AAPI Heritage Month in the state of Missouri is an honor, and one that I am proud of being able to participate in as an Asian American. Thank you.

America is a nation of immigrants and our diversity makes us stronger. The first Jewish immigrants arrived in America in the 1650's, among them a group of Dutch-Brazilian Jews seeking refuge for the Spanish Inquisition. The doctrine of separation of church and state and religious freedom has allowed the Jewish community to thrive in the United States.Immigrants of Asian descent have made a significant contribution to the history of our country and continue to play an important role today. For example, of the over 1.3 million Vietnamese living in the United States today, roughly 70 percent arrived seeking asylum from the 1980s to 2000. During the 1990s, large numbers of Vietnamese who were in the "re-education camps" of the new communist government were granted asylum on humanitarian and political grounds. Tens of thousands of them were relocated to St. Louis. The contributions of the Vietnamese community cannot be understated. They were directly responsible for the revitalization of the South Grand neighborhood in St. Louis City into a thriving retail district. Missouri recognizes February as African American History Month, March as Women's History Month, and has recently adopted a requirement for Holocaust Education Week in public schools. The time is now to recognize the important contribution of Asian and Pacific Islanders to our State and to educate about their history and achievements. We urge you to vote yes in support of HB 1051.

As a historian of Missouri history, I can attest that Asian immigrant communities have influenced our state's economic growth since the late 19th century and helped further enrich Missouri's cultural heritage. The first Chinese immigrants arrived in Missouri in the late 19th and early 20th centuries and, despite facing tremendous roadblocks such as the Chinese Exclusion Act and open hostilities against them, settled Missouri cities and towns, large and small, to begin a new life in America. These individuals opened small businesses, such as stores, laundries, and restaurants, that contributed to the economic development of the larger communities in which they operated. Later, in the post-WWII and Vietnam eras, Korean, Vietnamese, Taiwanese, Indian, and other AAPI communities joined the earlier immigrant groups and established thriving communities that furthered the achievements of those who came before them.St. Louis and Kansas City are home to creative, modern buildings designed by Missouri Asian American architects, our universities have produced groundbreaking scientists and medical professionals, business leaders, artists and journalists from Missouri's AAPI communities, and our state's culinary heritage has been influenced by everything from the invention of cashew chicken to modern pan-Asian fusion. These contributions have brought national and international recognition to Missouri. Therefore, I ask all the committee members to support this bill observing May AAPI Month in Missouri and bring much-deserved recognition to these communities of Missouri citizens who have influenced our state and country for the better for generations. Second, creating and maintaining visibility of the state's commitment to diversity reinforces the economic appeal for external and internal businesses and organizations seeking to establish operations, relocate employees, host conferences and events, or otherwise do business in the state of Missouri. Missouri grows from its diverse and deep roots to advance progress for all. Third, declaring May as Asian and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in Missouri signals the importance of recognizing, celebrating, and protecting cultural and social diversity, especially for those of Asian and Pacific Islander descent. The nation has seen an uptick in violence and hate toward AAPI peoples, including the 2017 shooting of two Indian residents in Olathe, Kansas. Violence anywhere against anyone is unacceptable in a nation of laws for citizens who wish to live and prosper in a free, safe society. Racially-motivated devastating and hateful acts take a toll on our society - locally and nationally, socially, politically, culturally, and economically. The counter to the trend of violence and hate is to show leadership. It involves sharing a clear signal to all people about the importance of our mutual diversity. Both official acts and personal actions that connect us as a community and citizens amplify that signal and strengthen us. It is important to protect the interests and freedoms of all Americans, their innate existence, and their value as human beings and fellow citizens. As board advisor for the 15-year-old Kansas City chapter of the National Association of Asian American Professionals, I have witnessed multiple ways in which the Asian, Asian American, Pacific Islander, and Desi American (AAPIDA) communities have contributed to the growth and development of the KC metro. In 2019, we hosted the largest gathering of AAPIDA professionals in the history of our organization, with record-breaking financial contributions from national, regional, and local sponsors. To this day, our networks continue to remark that the event in Missouri disrupted the biases held by many about the Midwest, We are not alone in this collective work of strengthening Missouri's reputation and highlighting that small organizations can create a deep impact in a state that continuously evolves for the benefit of its citizens. Thank you for helping to accomplish this visibility and continuing this work by openly demonstrating the value of our diversity as a nation and society.
