Myself, my husband, Joe, and our children Isaac, Jian, and Jonas are seeking your help. 8 years ago, I researched and designed (with some assistance from an architect) the passive solar home in which we now live. We built the home on our family's Century Farm in rural Callaway County about 7 years ago. It is energy efficient with a geothermal heating/cooling system. We actually try to do things that are beneficial in regards to energy and the environment. Joe works very hard and we made this investment on the family's Century Farm expecting it to be our forever home on earth. We made the decision to pay thousands above the norm to have the utility lines buried rather than having them above ground on poles. We wanted to focus on the land and not have poles and wires lining our long, half-mile driveway and cutting through our yard. After years of living in a crowded subdivision with houses blocking every horizon line, we were seeking serenity for us and our family and friends when they come to visit. Before we decided where on the land to build, we consulted with the farmer who rents our family's land. He is a neighbor and we were considerate of him, even though it is our family's land. We honestly considered those around us and how our actions and choices might affect them. With the industrial solar installations, we should all be seeing red flags: The solar companies are telling those who have signed leases to not let their neighbors know. The overwhelming majority of those who have signed leases are not having the industrial solar installations near their own homes—we know of 1 person out of dozens who actually is putting one by his home. ONE out of dozens. But they are putting them by other peoples' homes. Why won't they put these massive solar installations by their own homes and why does this matter to the State?: The view which will be a sea of metal waves, the awful noise from the inverters, the Warning-High Voltage signs on the 8-10 foot fences with barbed wire, the likely "landfill" that will be left when the solar panel use comes to an end. They don't want to live near hazardous chemicals and waste. There is risk of a fire which cannot be put out using any method for which firemen, especially rural volunteer firemen, from around the state have the resources or capability. The value of their homes and land would take a huge hit. No one wants a view or the sounds of an industrial solar installation. That, however, will be our reality if something isn't done. 1,900 acres will surround our home and land. That will be our backyard and all the way down our driveway—where we ride our bikes and take walks. That is where the kids play baseball, soccer, and jump in or ride bikes through the rain puddles to see who can make the biggest splash. Here at the state level, you have the power to protect your state citizens from federal government entities—from power being forced upon the state from the federal level with federal money backing it up. You also have the power to protect your citizens in a way that counties do not. We are asking you to consider the enormous risks to residents who will go to school by, live next to, and work next to these massive solar installations. We are asking you to consider the costs, both short-term and long-term to the state and counties. Thank you! Rhonda Burns

 Re: Testimony to the House Utilities Committee on HB 1065  
 To Chairman Bromwell and Members of the Committee, Renew Missouri, a 501(c)(3) organized to promote clean energy policy, wishes to testify in opposition to House Bill 1065. As there are two subjects in the bill, it is important to start by saying that, while we oppose the segment that would impose a 37.5% property tax assessment on solar equipment, our group has spent the past few years working with the sponsor to come up with a resolution that will benefit counties and its citizens as well as the solar industry as a whole. We have no reason to believe those conversations will not continue this session. In the portion of the bill that gives County Commissions authority to veto solar projects, we see a number of significant problems. First and foremost, the section that prohibits solar projects within a thousand feet of any town or village or any private residence. This could have the effect of effectively banning solar in a county and it is Renew Missouri's contention such a provision would violate the Missouri Constitution's "Right to Farm" amendment that reads: That agriculture which provides food, energy, health benefits, and security is the foundation and stabilizing force of Missouri's economy. To protect this vital sector of Missouri's economy, the right of farmers and ranchers to engage in farming and ranching practices shall be forever guaranteed in this state... If this provision were to pass, it would lead to a Constitutional challenge. The reality is counties have the ability to reasonably regulate land through by adopting zoning ordinances. If a County Commission believes they should be able to restrict solar projects, they should put zoning laws in place. Absent that, the Legislature adopting this language shows a tendency to pick winners and losers through selective land use restrictions. Corporate owned farms are okay under statutes. Solar would not be. If the Missouri Legislature feels strongly about restricting or freeing up certain types of land use, we would encourage a statewide zoning system that would be put in place a fully-encompassing set of rules and regulations across all unincorporated areas. Given the Constitutional and policy concerns the legislation raises, Renew Missouri urges you to vote "no" on HB 1065 as it is presented to this Committee. Thank you. Ranger Power LLC ("Ranger Power") is a Chicago-based developer of utility-scale solar energy projects. Ranger Power has a portfolio of projects across the Midwest totaling over 6 GW, including over 1,500MW of active development projects in Missouri and two projects that will commence construction in 2023. Our Missouri projects represent over \$2 billion of capital investment in the State and will result in the creation of hundreds of construction jobs and several full-time operations jobs across multiple counties. Ranger takes pride in its "community-first" approach to development. Ranger believes the communities that host its solar projects should benefit from the project they host, including financially. Financial benefits must be balanced, however, with cost of energy to ratepayers and other factors. In its current form, Ranger does not support HB 1065. First, any dramatic change to property tax on solar projects, particularly a change to projects that will soon start construction, will jeopardize or cause us to abandon those projects. Ranger Power is working directly with host communities to make sure significant benefits are realized from its projects. In parallel, Ranger Power will continue to work with state legislators to create a fair and balanced tax structure for utility-scale solar in Missouri. Second, HB 1065 imposes planning and zoning on counties that have chosen not to enact it, and singles out the solar industry in this regard. Ranger Power is not aware of similar state regulations requiring county permits for other industries such as landfills, agricultural operations, etc. In counties that have already adopted planning and zoning, the bill creates an unnecessary additional layer of regulation. In counties that have chosen not to adopt planning and zoning, Ranger Power works directly with host communities and implements industry best practices in its project design. As written the bill adds unclear and unnecessary regulatory standards on the solar industry that will significantly delay or otherwise harm investment.
