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My name is Dr. Christopher Paynter, Family Physician with SSM Health and Vice President of the Missouri Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons (MAOPS). I also am the Regional Assistant Dean for Kansas City University. I speak in great support of this bill. While we have 6 medical schools (7 if you count the KCU Joplin campus separately), according to the Kaiser Family Foundation as of September 30, 2022, Missouri has 363 Primary Care Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) designations, with 2,035,170 people within these respective areas, and the need of 599 more primary care professionals to remove said HPSA designation. I am also a recipient of the Primary Care Resource Initiative for Missouri. While I grew up in Missouri almost all my life, having funding to help ensure I stay in Missouri is critical. They could be a great way to ensure former residents stay in Missouri by following up with them, as I have to do every 6 months until my time is completed. States on average fund less than 12% of medical residencies. An overwhelming 86% comes from federal funds through Medicaid, Medicare, and Veterans Affairs. Nearly of teaching hospitals that are eligible for these funds are in urban settings. Only 3% of medical students surveyed nationwide plan on practicing in rural areas in the future. However, data does suggest those who complete their medical studies often stay in the state they graduated for residency. Residents who come from rural areas, train in family practice, rotate in rural communities, or take courses that incorporate rural health elements are most likely to practice as physicians in rural areas. What do some of these programs look like? In CA, a one-time budget allocation supported residencies in family medicine, pediatrics, internal medicine, and OB/GYN resulting in a 40% increase in physician residents practicing in health professional shortage areas. In TX, an expansion of grant programs sponsored medical residents, and resulted in more residency slots compared to medical graduates and an increased likelihood of doctors practicing in family practices. Importantly, economic or community benefit analyses for residency funding often characterize trends, but not exact values. This is because hospitals, states, or federal agencies like Medicare do not collect or require metrics like patient fees collected, residency funding, or patient outcomes. But one Indiana policy report estimates savings of \$200K per residency due to better care coordination, fewer unnecessary hospitalizations, and closer medical access. Regarding physician economic output, and a 2015 report states that in Missouri, for everyone 1 physician job, there are 12 support jobs roughly, resulting in nearly 1 Billion in state tax revenue.
