Hello! I am a Missouri social worker writing in favor of HB 1399.I live in St. Louis and work in Alton, IL, and am a Licensed Clinical Social Worker in Illinois. Even though I cross the border between the two states daily, I do not have flexibility to find the same jobs in Missouri that I can in Illinois. Social workers getting licensed in Illinois need to wait for a full year before we can apply for "reciprocity" in Missouri. On the other side, fully licensed Missouri social workers also have to cut through red tape to get their Illinois license. This results in delays and frustrations for social workers if we learn of a job opportunity across the state line. It makes it harder for us to get out there being of service to vulnerable populations, especially in St. Louis and East St. Louis. HB 1399 will help get rid of these obstacles, not just here in Missouri but nationwide. It will create an interstate compact that will make it easier for fully licensed social workers to practice in a variety of states. This will reduce burden on those providing telehealth; make it easier for military spouses who are social workers when their families get stationed in a new state; and make participating states (hopefully including Missouri!) more attractive to recent social work grads. Thank you for helping cut through red tape and making it easier for social workers to do our jobs!

Chair Haden and Committee Members: Thank you for holding a hearing on HB 1399 today. My name is Grace Nielson and I am anundergraduate student at the University of Missouri in Columbia studying Social Work. I amwriting today on behalf of the Associated Students of the University of Missouri (ASUM), anon-partisan advocacy organization that speaks for the more than 75,000 students across the University of Missouri System. ASUM stands in support of HB 1399 for a variety of reasons. First, we believe that the Social Work Compact would expand access to a variety of specialistsfor students in our state. In the most recent survey of the University of Missouri system studentbody, 60% of students reported some level of financial insecurity. A staggering 97% of studentsnamed access to reliable and healthy food and housing as a top legislative priority. Thesestatistics are reflective of nationwide trends showing an increase in resource insecurity for overhalf of US college students. Social Workers who have obtained a Bachelor's Degree in SocialWork often serve in the roles of case managers, victim advocates, and resource brokers, all ofwhom are able to address directly the needs our students have expressed. Once social workers have obtained their masters (and, typically, their licensure as well), theybecome either Licensed Masters of Social Workers or Licensed Clinical Social Workers. Through obtaining a license as a social worker, these professionals are then able to legallypractice therapy. As such, this Compact would also expand access to the potential pool ofmental health providers. This is especially crucial for students given the rising demand formental healthcare services on our campuses and beyond. In a 2022 survey by MissouriPartners in Prevention, 70% of Missouri's college students reported having anxiety, and 55% reported feelings of depression. With high demand for services, students can face staggeringwait times of up to six weeks to see a mental health provider on campus. Expanding the pool of social workers who serve as mental health providers through an expedited licensure processwould decrease student wait times and help meet the demand for mental healthcare in ourstate. I became a social work student four years ago after watching my mother raise me and my sisteralone, as a social worker herself. She began her career in the field working for the Division ofFamily Services in the Joplin unit of Children's Division. Once my sister and I got older, sherealized that her passions within social work evolved and to pursue those new passions, sheneeded her Master's. For two years, she would take night classes, take off work to fulfill herpracticum requirements, and come home and raise two kids. After obtaining her license sheworked in private practice as a therapist for five years. Today she is a specialized PTSDtherapist for combat veterans at the Veteran Affairs office in Joplin and serves policedepartments across the state of Missouri doing crisis counseling in honor of my late father whopassed in the line of duty, almost 20 years ago. She did all of this as a social worker. She is just one example of the passion, commitment, and pure dedication

that social workers need to be within this field. While not widely recognized fortheir contributions, social workers are consistently in their communities on the ground floor, serving the needs of others. Missouri would benefit greatly by expanding the state's access tothese professionals. I graduate in four weeks with my Bachelor's in Social Work and am morethan proud to join this community of change makers. We respectfully ask for the committee's support in expanding access to the vast scope of caresocial workers can provide by passing HB 1399. Thank you again for your consideration.

I also own a counseling/therapy practice and employ others doing therapy in Missouri. The Social Work Licensure Compact will have multiple benefits for the citizens of Missouri and will likely also attract clinicians here for school and work. At the present time, it is often an onerous process to get licensed in a State that one is moving to. I am a Missouri social worker (LCSW) and registered social work supervisor of younger LMSW social workers. I am writing in favor of HB 1399.As an LCSW supervisor, I often have conversations about career planning with my supervisees. I frequently hear apprehension about their decision to become licensed in Missouri because they are unsure of their long-term career or personal plans and would rather leave their career options open. Similarly, I am in a leadership role at a local company that employs masters-level social workers in direct service roles serving perinatal and postpartum families. While we are a nationwide company, we sometimes have difficulty attracting talent to our job postings because it would require a Missouri license. An interstate compact would significantly expand our ability to attract talent to our company and Missouri as a whole. Finally, in my direct service work with perinatal and postpartum families, the barriers to rural families receiving high quality mental healthcare specialized to postpartum is *immense.* An interstate compact that would allow more specialists, nationwide, to serve Missouri families -- particularly those who live in rural areas and must drive hours to receive specialized care. I appreciate your time and attention to this issue.

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I am a licensed clinical social worker, and a CSW Supervisor in Missouri, I'm licensed in Florida and in Washington DC as well. My work in social work dates to 2005. I've been doing onsite, office and online clinical practice since 2010 and have been a lead presenter for digital online practices with the NASW FL conference in 2016. Multi-state licenses are difficult to manage as the state by state credential continuing education requirements are not identical. When I have Florida, DC and Missouri residents move out of state I am not permitted by law or board rules to treat virtually across state lines. And while my home state may allow me to work in and from my home state the destination state must also agree. In my near 20 years of practice not one state outside of my home state has granted permission (meaning I've asked other states for case by case permission many times to ask be denied). This harms patient continuity of care. Further in large states I am able to treat online remotely without a problem, such as from North Florida to South Florida. Requiring patients and providers to get state by state licenses to practice is unnecessary for our profession for at least 48 states where the ASWB board exam is used for licensing approval (I believe California has their own exam and possibly Hawaii). I currently live in Missouri working both in private online practice and in an outpatient hospital rural health clinic. Where I'm near Illinois (and when in Florida near GA; and in DC near VA and MD) a 13 mile difference across a neighboring state line currently will disallow me to treat a patient online or even by visiting their state. The university system in the US has resolved these same types of licensing issues for credentialing and training of masters and doctor level supervisors for supervisees in field work and residencies ... that is to say a precedent for a 50 state legal mechanism to practice exists already. Similarly nurses and Medical doctors do this as well. I would love to be able to have one state license, and to I would gladly pay all 49 other state licensing boards a reciprocity fee every two years if that were required. I've written on my website about the archaic licensing limitation since 2010 where even in 2020 I think I last wrote the US still did not have s national licensing standard. While this compact is not, in my view, as streamlined as a home state and national licensing credential, it is a step in the right direction.

I have several patients in Illinois since I am so close to the state line, and currently they must drive across the border to talk with me. I also have many patients who are Missouri residents who travel extensively for work and school, and due to licensing laws, I cannot talk with them in another state. This is a serious disruption to the therapeutic relationship for vulnerable patients with mental illness. I am considering moving to another state, but would have to start fresh with licensing there, even after 36 years of experience in Missouri. The Social Work Licensure Compact is most important for providing consistent psychotherapy for my patients, but also for the health of my own private practice.
