One never takes away the vote of the people without them being aware of it, especially for something as important as the Presidential Preference Primary (PPP). I have randomly spoken to constituents and voters on the street and have told them about the fact that they have lost their vote to choose their preference for president, which is the beginning of the process to the RNC electing their candidate for president. People are angry, even livid, to learn that they were not considered or informed. These are the same people who are the constituents of you, our elected state representatives. I hear the county clerks are not wanting to do this. In my opinion, the clerks are hired by the county voters, and this was in their job description when they filed for office. They are paid employees of the county taxpayer, and this is their job. They know elections are their responsibility going into this.I also hear that the cost of running an election, which only happens once every four years, has been a talking point for removing this vote of the people. And, if you give this to the county central committees to run means renting spaces, getting insurance, hiring security and getting volunteers. Will the state pick up the tab for all this to set up, tear down, and to pay by the hour for people to help for every county? The use of a courthouse will be too small, and two political parties cannot use the same courtroom if we have to do it the same day. A lot of counties are not going to be able to afford this. Another large concern is that so few people will be able to be there one day at one time to vote, if you do not change this back. Our first responders, our military, our people who work in hospitals and others who are working at that particular time will be disenfranchised. As it stands now, they have to be there at one time for the caucus; whereas, when we had the PPP, they could come over a period of time to cast their vote. And there are other ways to vote, as the military does, for example. Another thing most people do not realize is that we have used the results of the PPP to get our delegate allocation per county to send to Congressional and State Conventions. At that point, we elect our delegates to the RNC Presidential Convention. The RNC then nominates its candidate, our nominee for President of the United States. And state delegates are bound on the first ballot to the winner of the PPP in their state. They sign a pledge before they go. This is not for one paid county employee to make a decision that concerns the whole county. Sometimes, we make mistakes. You have the chance now to correct this one. Let's fix this!

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Testimony: House Bills 267 & 347 that will reinstate the Presidential Preference Primary(The research and description of PPP below is offered from variety of sources.) Provided by: Kay Hoflander, Lafayette County Republican Committee Chair (20 years), former MRP State Committee member (8 years) and former Missouri Republican Party Chair (2019-2021 term). My hope is that understanding what a PPP is and how that impacts the process of choosing delegates to the RNC Convention will help lawmakers better understand the importance the PPP has in providing a fair method of electing delegates to the RNC who will in turn select its nominee for President. What are the two basic purposes of the presidential primary? To open the nomination process to greater participation. To reduce the ability of party bosses to dictate outcomes. Primaries are less hands on and allow the voters to show up and select a candidate. Caucuses are more hands on and are gatherings of local political party leaders that register their preference among candidates running for office. A presidential preference primary is a primary election in which a voter indicates a preference for a particular candidate to be a party's nominee for the presidency. In general, a state's presidential preference primary is not a direct election; that is, voters do not select the party's nominee directly, but instead at caucus vote for delegates who will then vote for the preferred candidate at the party's national convention, where the presidential nominee is formally selected. Presidential preference primaries are conducted by the state in accordance with state laws; caucuses, by contrast, are conducted by the parties themselves. To the individual who makes the effort to come out to vote for the Presidential candidate he or she prefers, the idea, that a possible cost and additional work might be incurred on the part of county election authorities, means next to nothing to them. PPP voters want to participate and have their presidential choice recorded. At the Republican National Convention every four years, delegates are bound on their first vote to the results of the PPP in their particular state if that state holds a PPP. The presidential primary elections and caucuses held in the various states, the District of Columbia, and territories of the United States form part of the nominating process of candidates for United States presidential election. The United States Constitution has never specified the process; political parties have developed their own procedures over time. Some states hold only primary elections, some hold only caucuses, and others use a combination of both. These primaries and caucuses are staggered, generally beginning sometime in January or February, and ending about mid-June before the general election in November. State and local governments run the primary elections, while caucuses are private events that are directly run by the political parties themselves. A state's primary election or caucus is usually an indirect election: instead of voters directly selecting a particular person running for president, they determine the number of delegates each party's Democratic Party and Republican Party will receive from their respective state. These delegates then in turn select their party's presidential nominee.Both major political parties of the U.S.— Democratic Party and the Republican Party officially nominate their candidate for president at their respective national conventions. Each of these conventions is attended by a number of delegates selected in accordance with the given party's bylaws. The results of the presidential primaries and caucuses bind many of these delegates, known as pledged delegates, to vote for a particular candidate. These are each state's two national committeepersons and the state chairperson.Remember the two purposes of the PPP: to open the nomination process to greater participation and to reduce the ability of party bosses to dictate outcomes.I urge you to consider reinstating the PPP in Missouri and give voters the chance for their preference for president to be noted and considered.

The rules are for caucuses are confusing and complicated and there are many other practices during caucuses that silence voices. Participation in our democracy shouldn't be a game of chance, depending on the weather, illness, emergency farm or family needs. We have had tornados and hail, floods and fog, sleet and ice in Missouri on Election Days, Spring and Fall! At least when elections are local alternative polls have been established when roads are closed due to flooding (even then some remained trapped by waters). Voters in elections have more options for their voices to be heard. For example, those with disabilities and their caretakers who happen to live with them can plan to participate by voting absentee or curbside. Some of the previously mentioned professions may also vote absentee with an excuse. Many others can try to plan to vote during the no-excuse two week absentee period. Finally, it is not good for democracy for presidential nominations to be chosen by the few, it further polarizes our communities. Thank you.

Presidential Preference Primaries can be done through either a Caucus or through Elections/Voting. While Missouri keeps going back and forth between these two formats of doing a Primary, it limits the ability of the local election authorities and other key people from being able to plan accordingly and to ensure that all applicable laws and requirements are met. Such requirements include Title IV Miscellaneous Provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act, which is where Elections and Voting Accommodations are listed. Such Accommodations include Curbside voting, Accessible Voting Machines and Absentee/Mail-in options. Caucus style formats are less accessible and less inclusive of individuals with disabilities, particularly those who are blind, have mobility issues and others who struggle with crowds and moving around. Therefore there will be a need for Paper ballots or some way for those who need it to submit their primary preferences in a manner that is accessible and that allows for the integrity and dignity they deserve to know that their vote/decision will be heard. Currently not every voting location is at Accessible sites and several have had 4 inch steps or larger to get inside without a ramp or alternative entry. This is why several polling sites have been moved or changed at the last minute, in order to help ensure that those with wheelchairs and other aids and assistive devices are able to enter the building and participate to their greatest extent just like anyone else. While changes might be necessary to current protocols and procedures around voting and elections and the debate about caucus vs election is ongoing, it is important to remember that we must make sure that these changes allow everyone to participate.
