Bill HB 1083 would create one standard for everyone to follow, like a majority of cities and county's across Missouri already do. As a local business owner this will make it easier for us to hire, maintain, and keep our skilled employees, which also will allow us to give our customers the type of service they deserve. Jefferson City just started the permitting process within the last year. As is typical, the reason permitting and inspection was started, was to provide a process of verifying a safe installation. One that fits today's mechanical code. The fact that this city chose inspection rather than licensing is evidence that licensing does not guarantee a safe installation, it rather puts the burden on the inspection process.

My name is Travis Rackers. I'm owner of 2 local HVAC companies, I'm here to testify in support of House Bill 368 & 1083. I ask for your support as well. As you may know, for this fiscal year, there will be tens or possibly hundreds of millions of dollars spent by the State of Missouri on mechanical work. A good portion of this work will be performed in political subdivisions that do NOT require individual mechanical licensure. In fact, this very building... the State Capitol, as well as all the other state-owned buildings in this city and county will have mechanical work performed on, or in them, without the personnel being required to hold an individual mechanical license. Just last year, there was major mechanical work performed on the Capitol building, yet not one person was required to be individually licensed to do this work. How can the State of Missouri ensure that this work is safe or meet the acceptable industry standards of quality without having an individual license requirement? This insurance of safety and quality is done through an inspection process that uses the mechanical code as guidance. The State's representatives will perform inspections of the work being performed. So regardless of a person's licensing status, the work they perform must pass the test of the inspector. If the State of Missouri is okay with using this model for much of the state, shouldn't it work everywhere else? In fact, we know it would work, because it had for years. We know, based on who is leading up the opposition to this bill, that if this bill is not passed, they will continue to use the status quo to limit their competition. Frankly, the current licensing structure is used as a protectionist scheme, and they know. This must be the reason they are so vehemently against any change. They fully intend to move these onerous requirements across the state with the goal of limiting competition. Their argument regarding safety doesn't carry weight as I had pointed out earlier. Safety is verified through the permitting and inspection process. Not a licensing requirement. It is with this in mind that, that I strongly encourage the committee to move this bill forward. Until that time comes, individual businesses and mechanic's livelihood will continue to suffer. Thank you for your time and I'll be happy to take any questions.

Please find below a letter from St. Louis City Mayor Jones outlining her opposition to HB 1083 & HB 368. Dear House Committee Members: Licensed mechanical tradespeople understand that the well-being of St. Louis City residents is dependent upon them. The tradespeople acquired their knowledge and skill through education, successful passage of an industry-wide exam, and on-the-job training. Public safety is a top priority in St. Louis City and we support only licensed mechanical contractors and individuals who can demonstrate that they understand and will uphold the safety standards our citizens expect and deserve. These bills not only work to prevent municipalities from implementing licensure requirements that prioritize public safety for their citizens, they would further punish cities that attempt to do so by preventing their citizens' taxpayer dollars from returning. In their current form, the bills say that while municipalities may establish their own mechanical contractor's license, they are required to recognize a statewide license in lieu of a local license. In other words, if an individual holds a state license, and that state license requires recipients to satisfy much lower safety standards than the City of St. Louis or any other municipality currently requires, the state forces the City to accept licenses reflecting lower safety standards. Further, if a municipality does not do so, the state is then required to prevent citizens' local sales tax dollars from rightfully returning to their community until the municipality agrees to accept the less-safe standards. Citizens across the state would suffer and bear the brunt of these misguided bills either way. In addition, these bills also effectively eliminate occupational, journeymen, and apprenticeship licensure. They further state that only one individual per company, regardless of the size of the company, complexity of the job, or skills and experience of their employees, has to be licensed. These bills do not ensure that work is completed safely and properly, and they deny every municipality's ability to make sure that it is. Protecting residents and consumers is a top priority for St. Louis City. Bills that allow the state to set licensure standards lower than municipalities, and hold citizens' taxpayer dollars as hostage until a municipality agrees to accept lower standards, constitute an extraordinary form of government overreach. There is simply no reason to encroach upon local governments' efforts in this way. I oppose these bills and would be happy to work with the sponsors to address the public safety concerns created by these pieces of legislation. Sincerely, Tishaura O. 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My entire life has been in service to the citizens of my community. I've been a firefighter for 40 years and retired as Deputy Chief of the Pattonville Fire District. I now serve as a volunteer firefighter in my hometown community of Augusta. I'm the local coordinator for the National Fire Sprinkler Association (NFSA) whose members are committed to saving lives and property through the design and installation of fire suppression systems. I would like to voice my opposition to HB 368, the Statewide Mechanical Contractor Licensing Act. The bill identifies "Fire Suppression" as a trade that would be required to obtain this proposed license. Fire suppression and fire protection systems are an integral part of our modern building environment. These systems can control dust explosions, extinguish fires in our restaurant kitchens, protect our computer rooms, lumber yards, homes, and businesses. These are often life safety systems that protect Missouri citizens in hospitals, apartment buildings and homes-- even while they sleep. House Bill 368, however does not provide sufficient fire protection training, education, or experience for the license holder to design and install these highly technical systems. Licensure should be a way for the public to ensure that an individual or company has met testing and competency standards based upon industry standard practices. The elimination of proficiency testing and apprentice/journeyman licensure, would "lower the bar" of competency for fire sprinkler installers. When I served as fire marshal, I realized that fire inspectors need to have the confidence that the person who completed the installation or performed a function test on a system is competent and understanding of the system design and operation. A certain level of trust is required between the inspector and the installer. Our public code officials are already overwhelmed. Without an acceptable level of certification and training, there could be disastrous consequences including unwanted system activation or failure of a system to operate, causing catastrophic property damage or loss of life. Modern fire protection systems require specific knowledge and experience which is not typical in the other mechanical trades cited in the bill. Fire protection licensure should specify the scope of practice and provide for defined training and education requirements of a licensee. These requirements in HB 368 are broad, ambiguous and undefined. We support licensing of fire suppression contractors, but in a more effective and meaningful manner. We are asking that "fire suppression" be removed from the bill.

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This bill will not raise the bar for public safety in Missouri, it only lowers it in areas that have set a high bar. Areas like St. Louis Metro have very sophisticated mechanical systems. The St. Louis area relies on it's knowledgeable craftsmen (men and women) to properly install these mechanical systems for the safety of everyone. We have some of the best training facilities in the country. The licensing requirements in and around St. Louis set the bar high so systems in our area are being installed by the most qualified mechanics. These mechanics are installing systems that have potential for serious health and financial consequences if not installed properly (boilers / steam systems, natural gas, medical gas, flues (co2), public water, sewer, chemical manufacturing, pharmaceutical manufacturing, critical cooling systems, food grade manufacturing, ... to name a few). We need the installing mechanics to have the necessary expertise. Project managers & inspectors are necessary but can't provide the quality assurance we need. The basis of all quality management programs is to instill quality at the installer level. Eliminating a counties ability to set it's own quality standard is a huge step backwards. We need to be training mechanics to reach the bar not lower the bar so untrained mechanics can get over it. Some type of State Licensing would probably be good for business and good for the State but only if it allows for local control of quality. We have made great strides in recognizing that the construction trades are just as important as other career choices. College isn't for everyone. This bill implies that mechanical construction is a low end career that doesn't require skill and training. The craft licensing requirement is what distinguishes the skilled, trained mechanic from the unskilled, untrained worker. Sincerely, Robert Grossmann
