The Good Time Credit is about giving credit for doing what is expected of you while in prison. It is about taking advantage of the opportunities to learn from your mistakes and improve yourself for when you are released. Jacob is a first-time offender given the maximum of 15 years for the choice he made at 24 years of age. Jacob knew he deserved prison time and he made a promise to himself and God that he would use his time to become a better man when he was released. In the 6.5 years he has spent						

that he would use his time to become a better man when he was released. In the 6.5 years he has spent in prison, he has received 1 minor write-up for being "out of bounds". This write up happened when he was first entered Diagnostics. Since that write-up he has kept his record clean. Jacob has participated in all the programs offered including facilitating several during his time. Jacob has been in the Therapuetic Care Unit (TCU), Honors Dorm and Kryos programs. Jacob has continuously held a job working in the kitchen, maintenance, facilities, and several others. His biggest accomplishment to date has been completing his Associates in Christian Ministry and continuing to work towards his bachelor's degree through an online, accredited university. He has been asked to speak in front of both small and large groups sharing his story. Jacob's dream for the future is to help other young men so they do not find themselves in a similar situation. Did prison make Jacob a better person? The answer is yes because he has taken advantage of the programs and the situation to become a better person. Will serving 15 years make him a better person? The answer is no! Jacob will continue to do what is right because it is the right choice not because he has served his maximum of 15 years on a first-time offense. The data shows a Missouri prisoner cost approximately \$32,000/yearly. A full 15-year sentence will cost the state of Missouri \$480,000 which is a true financial burden when resources are needed elsewhere. My son has been making all the right choices long before the Good Time Credit was even a thought. There are so many incarcerated individuals just like Jacob, making good choices, taking advantage of resources and serving their time while planning for a brighter future for themselves. This bill would prove that making a mistake can be overcome and encourages others with an incentive to better themselves in programs that will impact their lives forever.
