February 8, 2023 Chairwoman Cyndi Buchheit-Courtway Transportation Infrastructure CommitteeMO House of Representatives 201 W Capitol Ave., Rm. 236-AJefferson City, MO 65101 Dear Chairwoman Buchheit-Courtway and Members of the Committee, Missouri Coalition for the Environment is a statewide, advocacy nonprofit organization that works to empower Missourians to protect their environment and health. House Bill No. 491 seeks to fund ports that use Missouri rivers as transportation routes rather than prioritize the recreational and wildlife benefits of those waterways. For this reason, we respectfully ask that you oppose HB 491. Water transportation results in the degradation of water quality and causes eutrophication. The increased sedimentation and pollution in rivers are the result of poor river management, which includes channelization of rivers to allow for more transportation of goods. This can alter the biological makeup of rivers and raise the acidity of rivers to the point of destruction of living organisms. 1 The impacts of waterways transportation will further result in an increase of air pollution from transportation, an increase in greenhouse gas emissions, discharge of ballast water containing aquatic invasive species for the use of transportation stability, usage of antifoulant chemicals, accidental oil, and chemical spills, disposal of garbage, permeated sediment contamination among others as well. Additionally, extreme weather events, intense management and built infrastructure on our rivers, and increased development have all contributed to making flooding more costly and deadly for Missourians. Flooding has impacted Missourians statewide - from rural farmers whose crops are drowned to urban homeowners with flooded basements. Investing more into using our rivers as transportation routes is reckless for the future of Missouri. We urge you to recognize that rivers are natural systems that want to ebb and flow and should not be channelized for transportation. The more we restrict our rivers, the more we set ourselves up for flooding disasters. This Fund will incentivize behavior that fails to acknowledge the benefits to Missouri's people and their environment when rivers are left alone and the risks imposed on Missouri's people and their environment when we view rivers as primarily transportation routes.Our rivers and streams should be valued for the natural systems they are. We don't need to invest in using our rivers and streams for more transportation of goods. We need to protect the water quality, habitat, and floodplain communities from the harms that come from increased transport of goods. Once again, Missouri Coalition for the Environment respectfully urges you to vote "NO" on HB 491. Thank you for your time.
