general population. Theft and financial exploitation of those with severe mental health concerns is also						
a major concern. A searchable public database creates the opportunity for this vulnerable population						
to be an easy target, and at risk for an even higher chance of being victimized. Empower Missouri						
respectfully asks the committee to amend the current wording of HB 83 to address this concern, and ensure that those found not guilty by reason of mental disease or defect not be included in any
