On behalf of the 21-member steering committee of the Greater KC Food Policy Coalition, we oppose HB 747, which would impose harsh penalties for noncompliance with work requirements for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Hunger is bad for workers and productivity. About 696,000 Missouri residents (11.4%) didn't have consistent access to enough food to live a healthy life in 2020. Hunger and food insecurity are connected to poor health outcomes for adults of all ages, including chronic health conditions and diseases. This impacts workplace productivity, from lack of focus due to hunger to absenteeism from food-related health issues. Workers need resources, not punitive motivation. Wages in Missouri haven't kept up with the rising cost of food. In 2021, 42% of SNAP recipients were working families. The food service industry pays some of the lowest wages in the state and has the highest number of workers participating in SNAP. In addition, many low-wage workers, including cashiers and cooks, don't control the number of hours they're scheduled each week and are at risk of violating work requirements. Workers don't need punitive motivation. They need a living wage, safe working conditions, paid sick leave and family leave, SNAP dollars support local economies. Through SNAP, nearly \$1 billion in federal funds were funneled into Missouri in 2019. For every SNAP benefit dollar spent at the grocery store or farmers market, about \$1.50 in economic growth is generated during an economic turndown. When SNAP benefits are revoked for life, local economies feel the impact. The Greater KC Food Policy Coalition, a program of KC Healthy Kids, convenes diverse stakeholders to advocate for an equitable, sustainable, and resilient food system in greater Kansas City and promote policies for the nutritional, economic, social, and environmental health of the community.
