I started getting more involved while I was in college and would like to think that the Initiative Petition process is one of the MAJOR reasons that, as a young person, I'm still so engaged in our democratic process today. I've worked as a volunteer on a myriad of different ballot initiatives over the past few years and, thanks to those experiences, have a great appreciation for the extreme amount of effort that goes into engaging with our fellow voters and simply getting an initiative on the ballot (let alone passed). It takes thousands of volunteer hours, expansive state-wide efforts, and the full-time dedication of countless individuals; all just to reach what are already nearly unreachable signature qualification numbers. All that to say, the Initiative Petition process is already difficult enough to work with as it is. I firmly believe that adding any more barriers to this process, like those proposed in HJR18, would render it virtually UNUSABLE. These bills would effectively put an end to the rich direct democratic process that Missouri has protected since 1907. Not only that, but they would remove a critical avenue of engagement for local young voters—on all sides of the political spectrum—to have their voices heard and see the value of participating in the political process. Please stop trying to stifle our voices and evade the will of the people! We deserve a say in what issues make it on to the ballot. We deserve a legitimately usable process by which to promote and vote on issues important to us. We deserve better than HJR18.

To the Missouri House Election and Elected Officials Committee: The Missouri Sierra Club is in opposition to House Joint Resolution 18. The Missouri Sierra Club represents over 8,000 dues-paying members across the state who advocate for conservation, environmental, social justice, and democracy through grassroots efforts. We believe that every voter should have all the tools to exert their constitutional right to be involved in our democracy. Missouri's 115 year constitutional right to utilize the initiative petition to bring policy to the people of the state is a historic treasure and allows voters to participate in our democratic process. HJR 18 creates unnecessary and unwanted changes to our state's initiative petition. It would require all petitions proposing constitutional amendments to be signed by 8% of legal voters in each congressional district. This means campaigns would need to spend even more money, time, and resources for the people of Missouri to even be able to get an item to the ballot, which is already very difficult to manage under the current rules of our state's initiative petition process. This would effectively end possibilities of grassroots led petition campaigns and leave the door for only large money and special interests to utilize the system. Additionally, HJR 18 proposes constitutional amendments proposed by initiative to require approval by two-thirds of the votes cast. This infringes on Missouri's freedom to be able to pass legislation by the people. Since when does "majority rule" mean 66%? This is an attempt to make it harder for Missouri voters to pass legislation together, leads to minority rule, and is in direct opposition to our organization's values of an equitable and accessible democracy for all. According to research from the Missouri Scout, Missourians across the political spectrum want the initiative petition process to be made EASIER (40%) or LEFT ALONE (33%). The Sierra Club, Missouri Chapter has worked on numerous initiative petition campaigns over the past 50 years. This organization and our leadership understand how rigorous this process already is— you have to get hundreds of thousands of voters to sign on before a measure even gets considered for the ballot. This is the people's tool to get things done. Adding additional barriers does nothing more than censure the voice of the people and thwart democracy. As Governor Ashcroft once said, "It is through the initiative process that those who have no influence with elective representatives may take their cause directly to the people. The General Assembly should be reluctant, therefore, to enact legislation which places any impediments on the initiative power which are inconsistent with the reservation found in the Constitution." The Missouri Sierra Club urges you to Vote NO on HJR 18.

The state of Missouri has had a citizen initiative petition system for over 100 years, allowing regular folks to exercise the people’s power when lawmakers won’t. It’s a tried-and-true process that in recent years has led voters to raise Missouri’s minimum wage and expand Medicaid. But those who say it’s been a tool for liberal interests to bypass the Legislature – including some current state lawmakers who want to “reform” the process – should take a broader view beyond the recent past. Since 1907, Missourians have also used ballot measures to create the state’s nationally recognized Conservation Commission to manage fish, game and wildlife resources; enshrine the Right to Farm in the Missouri Constitution; and set constitutional limits on state and local taxation and spending, among other conservative efforts. The current requirement to pass an initiative petition is a simple majority, whether initiated by citizens or added to the ballot by lawmakers. No fewer than 20 different pieces of legislation in Jefferson City would make that more difficult, including one fast-moving bill which increases that threshold to 67 percent. This wouldn’t “reform” the process – it would effectively eliminate any chance of a successful citizen-led effort. So would increasing the minimum-signature threshold. The process is hardly the cakewalk critics describe. In the past 115 years, only 40 percent of citizen-initiated constitutional amendments succeeded (28 of 69). Thousands more proposed initiatives never received enough signatures to even qualify for the ballot. Thirty years ago, then-Gov. John Ashcroft, a Republican, rejected a similar effort by the Democratic majority in the General Assembly to drastically curtail citizen power to make laws. Here’s what Ashcroft – father of current Missouri Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft – had to say in his veto message of that attempt: “It is through the initiative process that those who have no influence with elected representatives may take their cause directly to the people.” “The General Assembly should be reluctant, therefore, to enact legislation which places any impediments on the initiative power which are inconsistent with the reservation found in the Constitution.” Adding these obstacles is unnecessary, unfair and should not be enacted. Our 100-plus years of citizen petition process has worked; please do not change what is NOT broken.

The Missouri Voter Protection Coalition (MOVPC) submits this testimony in opposition to HJR 18. This resolution undermines Missouri’s long-standing and well-functioning citizen initiative process by making it harder for citizens to place proposed constitutional amendments on the ballot and by raising the threshold for passage to near impossible levels. This would effectively exclude all but the most well-funded efforts from participation, and silence the voices of Missouri’s citizens of all political persuasions, who have relied on the citizen initiative process to advance ideas across the political spectrum. We should be encouraging citizen participation, not limiting it. The Missouri Voter Protection Coalition is Missouri’s statewide nonpartisan network of voter advocates who work to advance the right to vote in Missouri through policy advocacy, strategic litigation, voter education and coordination of the statewide nonpartisan Election Protection program. Through the collective experience of our 50+ partner organizations and nationally recognized expertise of our leaders and partners, over the last 15 years, we have provided this Committee with analysis and assessment of how legislation before the committee stands to impact access to the ballot for Missouri’s voters. Specifically HJR 18 proposes increasing the number of signatures needed to place a proposed constitutional amendment on the ballot by requiring signatures from voters all 8 Congressional districts, rather than 6, as is currently the law. Further, HJR 18 proposes increasing the threshold for passage once a citizen proposed amendment is on the ballot, increasing the threshold from a simple majority to 2/3 - a supermajority. This means that citizen proposed changes that are supported by a wide majority of Missourians — including measures supported by nearly 2/3 of Missouri’s voters — would still not pass into law, upending the democratic process that has characterized our electoral process and thwarting the will of the voters. We should not limit citizen participation as HJR18 proposes. The initiative petition process is amongst the purest forms of democratic participation. About half the states have an initiative petition process. For more than a century, access to the citizen initiative process has allowed for a voter engagement on a range issues by Missouri voters across the political spectrum - conservative, progressive and everything in between. The citizen initiative process provides a manner for direct participation. It promotes civic engagement and encourages citizens to discuss issues with one another. It promotes accountability between the government and the governed. But for this potential to be realized, it must be actual — by not erecting undue barriers to participation. The First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution provides: “Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for a redress of grievances.” Creating a prerequisite for ballot measures that is too high for all but the wealthiest and paid supported measures, and establishing a passage threshold that ignores the will of a majority of Missouri’s voters

belies the First Amendment's promise. Missouri's initiative petition process allows its citizens to effectuate the the Constitution's guarantee and ensures the ability for all Missourians to have a voice in their government. Lawmakers should applaud Missouri's initiative process that encourages participation across the political spectrum, and eschew efforts to make direct participation more difficult and elusive for Missouri's citizens. Missouri and this nation are at a crossroads. We are faced with decisions as a state and as a nation that will impact the saliency of our democracy for decades to come. We know democracy only functions with robust citizen participation. Missourians deserve nothing less. Accordingly, we urge you to reject this and other resolutions that further constrict democratic participation in the state of Missouri.

My name is Elizabeth Franklin, Plattsburg MO and I am submitting the following regarding House Joint Resolution No. 18. I do not support this House Joint Resolution and am respectively submitting testimony in opposition. The ballot initiative process is rigorous. Currently only 40% of the constitutional amendments placed on the ballot via citizen petition initiative have passed, proof that the process is demanding and requires much thought by Missouri voters and exceedingly hard work by interest groups who want an initiative on the ballot. Requiring signatures for constitutional amendments of 8% of voters from all eight congressional districts instead of the currently required six districts is excessive. It is not clear what "problem" is being fixed by this increased requirement or if there is any real problem at all. The proposed change to increase the threshold for ballot passage from a simple majority to two-thirds is unreasonable. The General Assembly should listen to our former Gov. John Ashcroft's statement when he vetoed efforts to suppress the use of the ballot initiative: "It is through the initiative process that those who have no influence with elective representatives may take their cause directly to the people. The General Assembly should be reluctant, therefore, to enact legislation which places any impediments on the initiative power which are inconsistent with the reservation found in the constitution." Moreover, Mr. Carl Bearden's Opinion piece printed in the Kansas City Star on 20 February 2022, captures the "desperate power grab" by politicians in our state. Points from his excellent and relevant opinion piece are provided below and full article may be found on KC Star website. Note that SJR 31 are 2022 efforts that are mirrored in HJR 18 in this session. By Carl Bearden Special to The Star Updated February 20, 2022 5:05 AM OPINION AND COMMENTARY – Partial Text "Attacks on the ballot initiative petition process in Missouri are not new — and usually arise after an issue passes that the party in power does not like. It happened in the late 1980s and early 1990s under Democratic majorities, and is happening once again under Republican majorities. Neither party was, or is, correct. The initiative process is a power and freedom that we the people have reserved to ourselves to check and be independent of the General Assembly. Elected lawmakers and wealthy special interests want to rig this system, preferring instead to keep all the power to themselves by making it harder for Missourians to place important reforms on the ballot. The freedom to have a say on important issues is a fundamental right — and Missouri's 115-year-old ballot measure process allows voters to circumvent partisan divides and directly get things done for the people. Efforts to modernize the initiative petition process are perfectly acceptable, including digitizing the paperwork and avoiding superfluous submissions through a minimal refundable filing fee. But the legislature should resist further changes that would create massive roadblocks to access or inject politics into the people's use of their reserved power. For example, Senate Joint Res. 31 would raise approval and signature thresholds to practically unattainable levels. This would effectively cut off use of the process for in-state volunteer and grassroots efforts, reserving it only for those with money and resources from large national groups. What cannot change is the fundamental principle associated with an issue. Gov.

Ashcroft laid out the principle of protecting and not impeding access to the initiative process by the people in his veto statement. That principle remains unchanged today.”Former Rep. I worked for the Clean Missouri initiative to reform redistricting, but I noticed that the popular restrictions on lobbyists were listed first and the more important redistricting reform last. The ballot to repeal that initiative did the same thing, putting a token lobbyist restriction first. In both cases it looked like the description was manipulated to make it pass. Also, it might be good to have a modest limit to the percentage of paid initiative signature gatherers, to insure some popular support for the initiative, maybe 50%. Gerrymandering of districts has made the Legislature less representative of the people than it should be, The citizen's initiative returns some of the power to the people.

An initiative proposal rises when the public senses that certain changes to Missouri’s laws are needed so that we can survive and surmount deep adversities. The United States has fine channels for evaluating and distributing information, and if a broad section of Missourians sees a problem and a feasible solution that the Legislature has not addressed and dealt with, then our present initiative process provides a way for Missourians to move us beyond an unacceptable bog-down. I have spent many hours as a volunteer gathering signatures on a busy shopping street. When I can get ten signatures an hour, that tells me that a good percentage of the public shares my sense that the proposed initiative needs to be on the ballot. The initiative process serves to reduce great disparities between the will of the public and the will of Legislators who can be excessively influenced by the money power of special interests. The initiative process is not a cakewalk that can clutter Missouri’s statutes with frivolous matters. In the past 115 years, only 40 percent of citizen-initiated constitutional amendments succeeded (28 of 69). Thousands more proposed initiatives never received enough signatures to even qualify for the ballot. Therefore I believe that the present features of Missouri’s initiative process are well in balance as part of government of, by, and for the people. In our present time of rising threats to broad-based liberties and prosperity, it would reflect poorly on the judgment of the 2023 Missouri Legislature if our initiative process were changed as the present bills propose to do.

House Elections and Elected Officials Committee ATTN: Chair Peggy McGaugh January 24th, 2023 Representative McGaugh, Thank you in advance for the opportunity to testify. On behalf of Action St. Louis Power Project, I would like to express our opposition to all bills submitted today that seek to limit democracy in our state. I offer this testimony to highlight the fundamental flaws of HJR 18, 24, 25, 30, and 43 and to strongly urge the legislature to vote no on the resolution which will make it more difficult for Missourians to enact change through our democratic process. Missouri was born from the depths of direct democracy. Since its conception in 1875, our state's constitution has reserved the right for people to "propose and enact or reject laws and amendments to the constitution by the initiative, independent of the general assembly." It is contradictory to our innately representative government for our state leaders to be focused on adding obstacles for Missourians to participate in the democratic process. Since its adoption in 1945, the current constitution has been amended more than 200 times. Each of these proposals has required 50% + 1 of the vote in order to pass. Each of the bills heard today proposes changing our long-established initiative petition rules by requiring a supermajority, or 2/3rds of the vote, setting a nearly impossible threshold for passage. Measures proposed and supported by a vast majority of Missourians would not pass into law, obliterating the very fundamentals that are enshrined in our state constitution. The ballot initiative petition process is about checks and balances and serves as an important part of our democracy by giving voters the freedom to have a say on the laws that govern us. Systematically denying voters the opportunity to use this tool is anti-democratic. Furthermore, the proposed changes are hypocritical in nature as they require citizen-proposed initiatives to obtain a supermajority to pass. At the same time, each chamber can refer a constitutional amendment to the ballot with a simple majority. HJR 24 & 25 seek to increase the threshold for passage from the majority of votes cast to the majority of registered voters. The Missouri Centralized Voter Registration list as of November of 2020 states that Missouri has 4,338,133 registered voters. The 2022 General Election showed a return of 2,069,130 voter turnout, which equates to about 47%. With less than half of all registered voters turning out to vote, this is a clear ploy to make sure that the will of the people is silenced. The bills heard in committee today threaten the independence of the initiative process. This resolution will silence Missourians by making direct participation more difficult. For these reasons, Action St. Louis Power Project firmly opposes HJR 18, 24, 25, 30, and 43 and urges members of the committee to vote no. Marcel R. We oppose the five bills that are scheduled to be heard at noon on January 24, all with language adversely impacting the initiative petition process. HJR 18 – would require signatures from all 8 Congressional districts rather than 2/3 currently and takes away the Governor’s right to call the election. To pass would require a 2/3 vote. HJR 25 – reduces to 7% the number of signatures needed, in all 8 Congressional Districts, BUT would require the initiative petition to be approved by a majority of ALL registered voters, not just those voting, an impossible task. HJR 30 – would require a simple majority BUT would need to pass in 51%, a majority of state House Districts. HJR 24 – reduces to 7% the number of signatures needed, in all 8 Congressional Districts, BUT would need to be approved by a majority of ALL registered voters, not just those voting, an impossible task. HJR 43 – would require 10% signatures in all 8 Congressional Districts for a Constitutional amendment, 5% of all 8 for a statutory change, requires the Secretary of State to have a period for review and comment from citizens, and require a 2/3 vote to approve. As you, representatives of the people of Missouri and members of the House Committee on Election and Elected Officials, hear testimony on these bills, please consider these points of importance to us:

- Initiative Petition gives citizens the opportunity to directly participate in democracy,
- Already requires a high threshold of signatures to get a proposal on the ballot,
- Citizens of all political parties have used and benefited from the citizen initiative process,
- These bills take away the rights of citizens as enshrined in the Missouri Constitution.

Missouri House of Representatives Elections and Elected Officials Committee January 24, 2023 Testimony on Initiative petition process: HJR 18, HJR 24, HJR 25, HJR 30, HJR 43 The League of Women Voters believes responsible government should be responsive to the will of the people. The citizen initiative petition process is the most direct form of voter participation in our democracy. This process has been enshrined in the Missouri Constitution for more than 100 years. The people resort to the initiative petition, especially regarding changes to the Constitution, only because they feel their voice isn't being heard. Former Missouri Governor John Ashcroft said, "It is through the initiative process that those who have no influence with elected representatives may take their cause directly to the people." In 1913, legislators at that time didn't believe that women really wanted the right to vote. To prove that they did want that right, women in the Missouri suffragist movement used the new initiative petition process to get the question on the ballot, going through the very difficult process of traveling around the state collecting thousands of signatures for a ballot measure. This valuable and trusted process is not easy, and the citizens of Missouri have not abused it. In more than a century, only 29 of 70 citizen-initiated Constitutional amendments have ever been approved. Many more proposed initiatives never got enough signatures to make it to the ballot. It has always been, and is, a difficult process requiring hundreds of thousands of signatures by citizens and a majority vote at the polls, so it is not taken lightly. This is why the League of Women Voters of Missouri (LWVMO) is opposed to any efforts by the General Assembly to make this process even more difficult. Each of these five House Joint Resolutions proposes a change in the current rules on initiative petitions in different ways. For example, there may be a requirement for signatures from more congressional districts, or a higher percentage of signatures required, or require votes from at least 50% of all registered voters to pass it (probably impossible for any vote). But the overall objective is to make the process even more onerous than it currently is. The General Assembly can put an issue on the ballot with just a simple majority (wouldn't need much more than 100 votes), does not require the governor's signature, and can be approved by a simple majority vote of the people. There does not appear to be any effort in current legislation to increase that threshold. In the years between 1910 and 2022, a total of 322 amendments to the state Constitution were proposed to the voters. Of that total, 246 were proposed by the General Assembly and 70 were proposed by citizen initiative which demonstrates how difficult the process is to get a proposition on the ballot. 133 propositions from the General Assembly were passed by the voters (54%) and 29 proposed by citizen initiative were passed by the voters (41%). * What problem is being solved by making these changes? Legislators have stated they have concerns about the amount of money being used (and coming from outside the state) to support these measures, but by increasing the thresholds, even more funds will be needed, impeding efforts by grassroots organizations. The IP has worked for both conservative and liberal causes which shows that it is a valuable and valued part

of our heritage and works for all Missourians of all different points of view. Legislators have said they have better understanding of the issues because they discuss them in their hearings. The implication is that “the people” won’t have the same knowledge when voting. Missouri citizens have shown that they are paying attention to the issues when they vote. Legislators also say that the Missouri Constitution has too many components added over the years to make this core document overburdened with extraneous matters, but the majority of the ballot issues that have been added to the Constitution were proposals by the General Assembly. Clearly, it would be preferable to use the citizen initiative process to make changes in Statute, rather than in the Constitution. However, in recent years, legislators have reversed some voter-approved ballot issues. Hence, the need was seen for the citizen initiative process to be used for additions to the Constitution rather than statute. Do not underestimate the voters. Proof of their knowledge was shown in the example of the November 2018 election when there were three separate items on the ballot about marijuana. The voters chose wisely and thoughtfully. If the legislature wants to improve the process, they should consider making the process more efficient for county clerks and election officials to check petition signatures. And – for measures proposed both by the General Assembly and by citizen initiative – it would be of great benefit for the voters to require that ballot language be clear and not misleading. To the House Elections and Elected Officials Committee I am writing in opposition to HJR 18, HJR 24, HJR 25 and HJR 30, bills that will (1) modify the number of signatures or number of congressional districts needed to get a Citizens Initiative Petition on the ballot, or that (2) will increase the threshold of passage of a Citizens Initiative Petition to the point where passage is unobtainable. A 3rd issue may be an attempt to confuse voters regarding who is a "legal voter" in Missouri. Regardless of their stated purpose, all of the bills aim to restrict a Missouri voter's ability to directly amend our state's constitution. The Statement "Make Your Voice Heard" is on the front page of the MO Secretary of State's Website regarding the Initiative Petition Process. The website also goes on to explain that the initiative petition process "Gives MO citizens the opportunity to directly participate in our democracy." The question is why are republicans wanting to make it more difficult for citizens to participate in our democracy. Two arguments emerge: one, the process is too easy and two, keeping out big money. The current threshold is already difficult. It isn't easy getting a citizen's initiative proposal to the ballot. Getting signatures is hard. It's not "easy" to collect the mandatory signatures (by hand, not online) to get a proposal on the ballot. It's not "easy" to mount a grassroots campaign to educate voters about an initiative. Quite the opposite of what it takes to get a legislative amendment on the ballot: a simple majority of both house and senate, and a simple majority of voters. Another argument being offered is "keep the big money interests" out of Missouri when it comes to the initiative process. A hard concept for me to accept when I see "big money" being spent in many other ways around the state when it comes to lobbyists, campaign contributions, ads, 3rd party sources used to copy legislation to be introduced, etc. The initiative petition is also nonpartisan. It is not a republican versus Democrat issue. There is evidence to indicate that prior amendments that have passed, including medicinal marijuana, medicaid expansion and increase of minimum wages, all reflected the will of the people, not a political party. One must then conclude that those attempting to make the process more difficult are not doing so for the "will of the people" but for other political reasons. Yet when elected officials don't want to govern for the "will of the people", but for themselves, the ballot initiative process is the only recourse voters have when politicians fail to address the issues that matter to them.

I am opposed to this bill and other attempts to make the Ballot Initiative process more difficult. I do not see any need to curtail it. The Ballot Initiative is true democracy which enables the will of the majority to be heard, voted on by all voters, and if a majority so chooses, to have it enacted into law. Any of the various proposed changes to increase the difficulty of the Ballot Initiative serve only to restrict the people's right to this democratic process. The proposed bills can only be coming from a desire to limit the people's ability to address issues they see as the priorities but which, unfortunately, are not being addressed by their elected representatives. The collection of signatures is simply a screening process so that frivolous petitions do not make it to the ballot. It is not necessary to collect signatures from all Congressional Districts just to get something on the ballot which ALL voters subsequently have an equal opportunity to vote for or against, as they choose. Currently, the vast majority of ballot initiatives do not make it to the ballot, which shows the current procedures effectively eliminate most initiatives, primarily those without broad support. The number of signatures now required is sufficiently large to keep unpopular initiatives off the ballot. Increasing the required percentage of votes cast for an initiative to "pass" is another way to block what voters want. Amendment 3 in 2020, which undid many of the reforms in the previous ballot initiative sometimes called "Clean MO", only received 51% of the vote. That was passed by a majority as small as can be, yet there was no uproar from the legislature about enacting that initiative into law. Requiring passage by a majority (or more) of registered voters for an initiative to pass is just a blatant attempt to effectively eliminate the Ballot Initiative. What is the logic to such a requirement? As we all know, total voter turnout over 50 percent is an extremely rare event, and to have anywhere near 50 of registered voters all vote the same way is not going to ever happen in the real world. Nothing would ever pass via the Ballot Initiative, which of course is why these types of requirements are being proposed. The truth is that if legislators are responding to what their constituents want, Ballot Initiatives would disappear. No one would spend the vast amount of time and money to complete the arduous process of getting something on the ballot, especially with a requirement that a majority of voters must be in favor of it for a Ballot Initiative to finally pass into law. I do not see a need to make the current Initiative Petition process any more exclusionary. The people have been using the Ballot Initiative for over one hundred years. Legislators do not have all the answers. Let the voice of the people be upheld. Thank you for listening.

Former U.S. Attorney General, Senator, and Missouri Governor John Ashcroft said in 1992, “It is through the initiative petition process that those who have no influence with elective representatives may take their cause directly to the people. The General Assembly should be reluctant, therefore, to enact legislation which places any impediments on the initiative power which are inconsistent with the reservation found in the Constitution.” Missouri Health Care for All’s supporters have used the initiative petition process to pass meaningful change for Missourians. The passage of HJR 18 would create significant roadblocks and hamper Missourians’ ability to exercise their right to contribute directly to democracy and address important issues as voters. These proposed reforms undermine democracy and the ability of the voter to use their vote as their voice. First, HJR 18 proposes an increase in the number of petition signatures required to place constitutional amendments on the ballot. The existing signature requirement is already a considerable challenge, and this increase will make it more difficult for voters to place their proposals on the ballot. Our team’s organizers and our volunteers will be the first to tell you that gathering signatures for a petition is no small job. It is a hard, time-consuming effort that often requires a full day’s work to collect a few dozen signatures. And that is on a good day. Additionally, HJR 18 would increase the vote threshold beyond a simple majority to 2/3rds in order to pass a constitutional amendment. This creates an unfair standard to which no other elections are held. Each and every legislator is elected by a simple majority, and this has historically been true of ballot initiatives as well. Ballot measures passed by the majority already represent the will of the people, and by increasing the threshold, legislators are undermining the voters’ will. These proposed changes will make it harder for Missourians to stay engaged in the legislative process. It will effectively silence the voice of the people and render law-making in Missouri a practice for only those elite enough to be elected to the General Assembly. The principle laid out by John Ashcroft stands true to this day. The initiative petition process is a right reserved by the people, and it’s one we must maintain. As representatives of people across the state of Missouri, it is your duty to empower the people and our voices. Supporting this legislation would do the exact opposite, undermining the power of all Missourians. Missouri Health Care for All is opposed to the proposed changes put forth in HJR 18 and strongly recommends that committee members vote ‘no’ on this proposal and any others that would obstruct the ability of Missourians to use the initiative petition process, to protect the right of all Missourians to exercise their voice and participate in the legislative process.

We don't talk about party affiliation when gathering signatures. Republicans, Libertarians, Democrats, and people with other party affiliations have used the citizen ballot initiative process to engage in direct democracy. Signature gatherers must inform the voters signing a petition what it is they are signing and I encourage them to read the ballot language—which accompanies the petition forms. **WE MUST MAKE IT EASIER, NOT HARDER, TO ENGAGE VOTERS IN THE PROCESS OF CONTINUOUSLY MAKING THIS A BETTER STATE. My name is Steve Reed. I am opposed to this bill because it would injure the initiative petition process and obstruct citizens existing rights to direct democracy. I have worked as an unpaid volunteer to gain signatures to pass ballot measures here in Missouri. For example, I gained signatures for Medicaid expansion and talked to many people who volunteered their personal medical issues and explained how Medicaid expansion would greatly help them. Acquiring signatures takes significant time and effort on my part. I am opposed to every one of these extreme bills under consideration. They would create new signature or petition passage requirements, or both, and create large obstacles to the constitutional right to direct democracy that Missouri citizens have had for some 120 years. Missouri's constitution has long guaranteed, "The people reserve power to propose and enact or reject laws and amendments to the constitution by the initiative, independent of the general assembly." And this power, this people power, has required only a simple majority of votes cast statewide. It's clear the will of the people would be thwarted by raising the signature requirement threshold, and particularly by schemes on initiative passage that require more than a simple majority of votes cast statewide. This power is also "independent of the General Assembly". Therefore, schemes hatched by the General Assembly by any Party that would attempt to wrest from or diminish this power of the people clearly violate the intent of the constitution. Such schemes are beneath the dignity of this legislature and violate the trust voters have given to it. To each of you. What is the need for such proposed bills? Missouri current signature requirements to get on the ballot are comparable to many states with an initiative process. Existing signature and other requirements already weed out vast majority of initiatives from appearing on the ballot. It's not as if Missouri's citizens have abused the petition process. The number of citizen-initiated petitions that appear on the ballot is much in line with other states. Our petition process works. These bills' increased requirements on the front end (getting on the ballot) or back end (ballot approval) place an unacceptable burden on citizens' rights to directly petition the state. Enactment of new requirements and passage as a ballot measure would reduce the future number of ballot measures which pass, possibly to zero. Does this legislature really intend to consider bills this session to strengthen civics education in our schools, at the same time it maneuvers to effectively deprive Missouri citizens of one of their basic constitutional rights? Passage of this bill or any of these bills for placement on a future ballot would send a message to the public that the Missouri legislature doesn't want their voices heard. That Missouri legislators distrust them. As a voting Missouri citizen I ask that these bills not be supported. Thank you.

My name is Susan Turk. I am co-chair of Missouri Progressive Action Group and have been authorized to express MOPAG's opposition to this bill to HJR's 43, 30, 18, 24 and 25 because they would injure the initiative petition process and obstruct citizens existing rights to direct democracy. MOPAG is opposed to every one of these resolutions under consideration. They would create new signature or petition passage requirements, or both, and create large obstacles to the constitutional right to direct democracy that Missouri citizens have had for some 120 years. Missouri's constitution has long guaranteed, "The people reserve power to propose and enact or reject laws and amendments to the constitution by the initiative, independent of the general assembly." And this power, this people power, has required only a simple majority of votes cast statewide. It's clear the will of the people would be thwarted by raising the signature requirement threshold, and particularly by schemes on initiative passage that require more than a simple majority of votes cast statewide. This power is also "independent of the General Assembly". Therefore, schemes hatched by the General Assembly by any Party that would attempt to wrest from or diminish this power of the people clearly violate the intent of the constitution. Such schemes are beneath the dignity of this legislature and violate the trust voters have given to it. To each of you. What is the need for such proposed bills? Missouri current signature requirements to get on the ballot are comparable to many states with an initiative process. Existing signature and other requirements already weed out vast majority of initiatives from appearing on the ballot. It's not as if Missouri's citizens have abused the petition process. The number of citizen-initiated petitions that appear on the ballot is much in line with other states. Our petition process works. These bills' increased requirements on the front end (getting on the ballot) or back end (ballot approval) place an unacceptable burden on citizens' rights to directly petition the state. Enactment of new requirements and passage as a ballot measure would reduce the future number of ballot measures which pass. Does this legislature really intend to consider bills this session to strengthen civics education in our schools, at the same time it maneuvers to effectively deprive Missouri citizens of one of their basic constitutional rights? The ballot initiative process allows citizens to fill in the blanks regarding public policy that is not prioritized by the legislature. The ballot initiative process is not broken. The ballot initiative process does not need to be fixed or reformed. Passage of any of these bills for placement on a future ballot would send a message to the public that the Missouri legislature doesn't want their voices heard. That Missouri legislators distrust them. As a voting Missouri citizen, I ask that these bills not be supported. Thank you.

A majority is 50% plus 1. A majority does not mean 60%. The process is already challenging, as you have to obtain hundreds of thousands of voter signatures before a measure even gets considered for the ballot. Adding additional barriers does nothing more than prevent the voice of the people being heard. The ballot initiative process is the only opportunity voters have when politicians ignore their will. This tool has been used by conservatives, progressives, moderates, and independents.
