New businesses create almost all net new jobs in the United States, Entrepreneurs create stronger communities, grow GDP, create homegrown jobs, increase community wealth, diversity goods and services, increase lifetime incomes, and fight inequality and poverty. Yet government processes and the system overall make it harder on them to start and grow with many barriers. This has contributed to a startup slump for decades in America. Young businesses create jobs, while older businesses shed jobs. This bill sets the path to remove obstacles that hinder entrepreneurship. This legislation expands entrepreneurial opportunity for all while level leveling the playing field for people to pursue their dreams. The Office of Entrepreneurship will concentrate on strengthening policies that lower barriers to entrepreneurs in the state across demographic segments and geographic areas. Additionally, it will be tasked with the important work of tracking data, metrics, and impact in the state for businesses under three years of age in the areas of government contracts, workforce development, and economic development. Government contracts favor incumbent, established big businesses. They know how the process works and can weave through a complicated system. This hinders new businesses and job creation. One government contract can make a major difference on the trajectory of a young company's growth and offer real legitimacy for a newer business. In many cases they can and will do a better job than a larger, older business.92% of voters across all three partisan groups believe it is currently difficult to start and grow a new business. 83% of voters across all three partisan groups want to see an office and/or website that serves as a one-stop-shop to assist any entrepreneur looking to start and grow a business. The Right to Start Act and Office of Entrepreneurship are pro-growth measures, which will remove barriers to starting, advance homegrown job creation, and build a stronger connection between entrepreneurs and state government. These measures show that Missouri is an innovative place that values entrepreneurship, new, young company growth and small businesses.

We understand the barriers entrepreneurs face when trying to start or grow their business and are encouraged by the General Assembly's recognition of these barriers and their efforts to address them. Enacting the Right to Start Act will be a win for Missouri's young businesses. Increasing data collection regarding Missouri businesses in their early stages of development will help to understand the different challenges they face and develop new ways to address them, particularly for minority-owned, womenowned, and veteran-owned small businesses. The Right to Start Act and the Office of Entrepreneurship expand entrepreneurial opportunity for everyone. The bill is pro-job, pro-growth legislation that will drive economic growth in Missouri. Entrepreneurs are the heart of the American economy. They create almost all net job growth. They raise incomes and community wealth. They help fight inequality and poverty. All of us benefit when more people are job makers, not just job takers. But the system is unfavorable towards entrepreneurs. New businesses struggle harder. Survey data from the Kauffman Foundation shows that entrepreneurs are left out. 81% of entrepreneurs says that government favors big businesses over them. 69% say government doesn't care about them at all. Rural America has seen a 44% decline in entrepreneurship since 1995. Nonetheless, the entrepreneurial spirit is deep in our DNA, 94% of voters - nearly unanimously across party lines - say "it's important to America's future" that citizens have a fair opportunity to start and grow their own businesses. However, 92% of voters say that starting a new business today is difficult or very difficult. Research shows the system is inherently tilted against entrepreneurs who struggle to compete for government contracts. You can have better products and services, but still struggle to navigate procurement processes. Tracking specific data regarding government contracts for young and small businesses is a big first step for Missouri. Who are these entrepreneurs? Some are tech startups. But they're also businesses started on kitchen tables, in garages, and in basements throughout Missouri. They're corner stores and businesses on Main Streets. They come from all walks of life. Designating an Office of Entrepreneurship will ensure that entrepreneurs have a point of contact in Missouri government, as well as a someone who will work to lessen barriers to starting. Entrepreneurs have too little time and money to speak for themselves. This office will connect with entrepreneurs and serve as a one-stop shop for entrepreneurs navigating Missouri. The Right to Start Act and Office of Entrepreneurship will make Missouri a national leader in supporting new, young companies and those who create the jobs in our economy. It's time we unleash the entrepreneurial power of our citizens. Thank you.
