13	physician-patient relationship as described in section 191.1146. This relationship shall include:
14	(1) Obtaining a reliable medical history and, if required to meet the standard of care,
15	performing a physical examination of the patient, adequate to establish the diagnosis for which the

- he drug is being prescribed and to identify underlying conditions or contraindications to the treatment recommended or provided;
- (2) Having sufficient [dialogue] exchange with the patient regarding treatment options and the risks and benefits of treatment or treatments;
 - (3) If appropriate, following up with the patient to assess the therapeutic outcome;
- (4) Maintaining a contemporaneous medical record that is readily available to the patient and, subject to the patient's consent, to the patient's other health care professionals; and
- (5) Maintaining the electronic prescription information as part of the patient's medical record.
- 2. The requirements of subsection 1 of this section may be satisfied by the prescribing physician's designee when treatment is provided in:
 - (1) A hospital as defined in section 197.020;

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- (2) A hospice program as defined in section 197.250;
- (3) Home health services provided by a home health agency as defined in section 197.400;
- (4) Accordance with a collaborative practice agreement as [defined] described in section 334.104;
 - (5) Conjunction with a physician assistant licensed pursuant to section 334.738;
 - (6) Conjunction with an assistant physician licensed under section 334.036;
 - (7) Consultation with another physician who has an ongoing physician-patient relationship with the patient, and who has agreed to supervise the patient's treatment, including use of any prescribed medications; or
 - (8) On-call or cross-coverage situations.
 - 3. No health care provider, as defined in section 376.1350, shall prescribe any drug, controlled substance, or other treatment to a patient based solely on an evaluation over the

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- telephone; except that, a physician or such physician's on-call designee, or an advanced practice registered nurse, a physician assistant, or an assistant physician in a collaborative practice arrangement with such physician, may prescribe any drug, controlled substance, or other treatment that is within his or her scope of practice to a patient based solely on a telephone evaluation if a previously established and ongoing physician-patient relationship exists between such physician and the patient being treated.
 - 4. No health care provider shall prescribe any drug, controlled substance, or other treatment to a patient [based solely on an internet request or an internet questionnaire] in the absence of an established physician-patient relationship as described in section 191.1146.
 - 5. No health care provider shall prescribe any controlled substance to a patient whose physician-patient relationship with such provider was established through telemedicine."; and
