#### **ASSUMPTION**

### §214.020 – Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance** and the **City of Kansas City** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

**Oversight** notes the municipality which has oversight over this fund may use the principal of the fund to maintain and control the growth of grass and weeds as it deems necessary. Oversight assumes this language in the proposal allows the governing body of the municipality to utilize principal funds for the purpose of the basic maintenance to control the growth of grass and weeds. Oversight sees this as a potential change in policy for the governing body of municipalities and will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

#### FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

Small businesses who maintain public or private cemeteries may benefit from the provisions of this proposal.

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#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that if the net income from a trust fund or funds created to maintain and beautify a cemetery is not sufficient to support the preservation, care, upkeep, or adornment of a cemetery, the city, town, or village governing body may only use as much of the principal as the governing body deems necessary for the purpose of basic maintenance to control the growth of grass and weeds.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
