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## FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume the following regarding this proposal:

#### Administrative Impact

To implement the proposed legislation the Department will be required to:

- Update procedures, correspondence letters, forms and the Department website;
- Update the Missouri Titling Manual;
- Send Communications to License offices and other Contracted stakeholders; and
- Train Staff

<u>FY 2025 - Motor Vehicle Bureau</u> Associate Research/Data Analyst 40 Hrs @ \$25.22 = \$1,009 Lead Admin Assistant 20 Hrs @ \$18.54 = \$371 Administrative manager 5 Hrs @ \$29.31= \$146 Research/Data Analyst 10 Hrs @ \$27.00 = \$270

<u>FY 2026 - Strategy and Communications Office</u> Associate Research/Data Analyst 10 Hrs @ \$21.64 = \$216

## Total Cost =\$2,012

The Department anticipates that they <u>will be able to absorb these costs</u>. If multiple bills are passed that require department resources, FTE may be requested through the appropriations process.

**Oversight** assumes DOR is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. Oversight assumes DOR could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, DOR could request funding through the appropriation process.

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Officials from the **Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP)** assume the following regarding this proposal:

The fiscal impact to the state of Missouri on vehicle inspections equates to \$1.50 per each additional used vehicle safety inspected prior to sale, with \$1.00 deposited into the Highway Fund (0644) and \$0.50 deposited into Highway Patrol's Inspection Fund (0297). It is unknown how many additional inspections, per year, would be conducted with this proposed legislation.

**Oversight** notes, this proposal requires a motor vehicle safety inspection be provided to the purchaser, unless the vehicle has less than 40,000 miles within three years of its model year. Oversight is unable to determine how many more vehicles will require a safety inspection as a result of this proposal; therefore, Oversight will reflect an "Unknown, but less than \$250,000" fiscal impact to the Highway Fund and the Highway Patrol Inspection Fund.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Transportation** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for MoDOT.

# FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses that provide motor vehicle inspections or sell used motor vehicles could be impacted by this proposal.

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill requires that sellers of used motor vehicles have the vehicle inspected no more than 60 days prior to the date of sale, and the seller must provide the purchaser with a certificate of inspection and approval at the point of sale. The purchaser must submit this certificate when registering the vehicle. The inspection requirement will not apply for the sale of motor vehicles having less than 40,000 miles for the three-year period following the model year of manufacture of the vehicle.

The bill also provides that emission inspections will not be required for vehicles that are exempted from the safety inspection.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
