FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§34.630 – State Contracted Vehicles

Officials from the **Office of Administration (OA)** assume the state does not currently have any electric vehicles in the state fleet. Therefore, there would not be immediate fiscal impact. If that changes, limited availability of electric vehicles could have fiscal impact, cost unknown at this time.

Officials from **Kansas City** state there is a possible fiscal impact as the City does not purchase electric vehicles from Manufacturers and the Manufacturer may not agree to jurisdiction in Missouri. This may reduce competition and raise prices. Additionally, the potential of imposed new-EV deficit would cause delay in replacement of currently over-lifecycle equipment, driving maintenance, repair and fuel costs higher. City has no knowledge of the labor used to assemble the electric vehicles.

Oversight assumes the Office of Administration and Kansas City will not incur significant cost related to this proposal.

Oversight assumes this legislation is subject to the following civil penalty/fine revenue:

\$34.630.3(1) - \$10,000 civil penaly

§34.630.3(2) - \$10,000 payable to the General Revenue Fund

§34.630.3(3) - \$5,000 payable to the Missouri Veterans Commission

§34.630.3(4) - \$5,000 payable to school districts in the county which the violation occurred

§34.630.3(5) - \$5,000 payable to the Missouri Veterans Commission

§34.630.3(6) - \$5,000 payable to school districts in the county which the violation occurred

Since it is unknown if there will be any violations, and if there are, how many violations will occur, **Oversight** will reflect a revenue of \$0 (no fine revenue collected) or Unknown revenue to the General Revenue Fund, the Missouri Veterans Commission Fund (Federal, 0184), and Local School Districts. Oversight assumes the potential fine revenue will be less than \$250,000.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources**, the **Department of Revenue**, the **Missouri Department of Conservation**, the **Missouri Department of Transportation**, the **Missouri National Guard**, the **City of Osceola**, the **Northwest Missouri State University** and the **University of Central Missouri** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

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Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, counties, schools and colleges were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that no governmental entity can enter into a contract for electric vehicles or components unless the manufacturer provides as worn certification consenting to personal jurisdiction by the State over the manufacturer and confirming the absence of forced labor or oppressive child labor in the production process. This bill defines the terms "electric vehicle", "forced labor", "government entity", "oppressive child labor", and "protected characteristic".

This bill also provides for the following penalty provisions:

- (1) Manufacturers or sellers providing false information may be liable for a civil penalty of \$10,000 per false statement or one half the total price paid by the government entity, whichever is greater.
- (2) Governmental entities knowingly violating the information provision may face a fine of \$10,000 per false statement or the total price paid for the vehicles/components, payable to the General Revenue Fund.
- (3) State employees violating the provision may personally pay a \$5,000 fine to the Missouri Veterans Commission.
- (4) Employees of local government or political subdivisions violating the provision may personally pay a\$5,000 fine to the school districts in the county of the violation, allocated based on average daily attendance.
- (5) Members of statewide or local boards approving purchases violating the provision may personally pay a\$5,000 fine to the Missouri Veterans Commission or school districts, respectively. Any citizen in Missouri has standing to enforce this section.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
