#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), Missouri Highway Patrol, Department of Corrections, Office of the State Public Defender and Missouri Office of Prosecution Services each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume the following regarding this proposal:

# Administrative Impact

To implement the proposed legislation, the Department would be required to:

## FY 2025 – Driver License Bureau

The Department will be able to absorb these costs. If multiple bills are passed that require resources, the Department may request funding/FTE through the appropriations process.

**Oversight** assumes DOR will use existing staff and will not hire additional FTE to conduct these activities; therefore, Oversight will not reflect the administrative costs DOR has indicated on the fiscal note.

Oversight notes, according to an article published by KY3 (Springfield, MO) on April 16, 2023, MoDOT stated there were 36 work zone protective vehicle crashes in 2022 and 15 work zone crash fatalities (down from 17 in 2021). Oversight notes the proposal sets the fine for an infraction at \$1,000. Oversight assumes any increase in fine revenue and any related increase in license reinstatement fees as a result of the changes in the bill will be minimal; therefore, Oversight will not reflect a fiscal impact.

### FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill adds striking a vehicle, trailer, or other equipment owned or operated by the Missouri Department of Transportation, a contractor, or a subcontractor, including a truck or trailer-mounted crash attenuator to what occurrences constitute "endangerment of a highway worker", and sets the fines for various versions of these crimes to exactly what was the highest discretionary fine in each.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
