FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§198.023 – Inspections of long-term care facilities

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** state §198.023.2 of the proposed legislation allows residential care facilities (RCFs) or assisted living facilities (ALFs) to be accredited by a department recognized accrediting entity. RCFs or ALFs that provide the DHSS documentation from a recognized accrediting entity affirming that the facility is accredited and in good standing, shall not be subject to an annual on-site inspection as described in sections 198.022, 198.525, and 198.526 for that year.

The DHSS anticipates few RCF and ALF operators will choose accreditation in lieu of licensing due to the accreditation onsite survey and associated annual Assisted Living Community (ALC) Accreditation Program fee costs. Most accreditation requires licensure prior to application for accreditation; therefore, Department inspectors will still be required to conduct both initial licensure inspections and complaint investigations. The Department will also have to promulgate rules regarding RCF and ALF accreditation in lieu of licensure and develop a system to monitor ongoing compliance with facility accreditation status.

It is assumed the Department can absorb the costs of this bill with current resources. However, if the workload significantly increased or other legislation was enacted, additional resources would be requested through the appropriation process.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Oversight assumes the DHSS has sufficient staff and resources available to absorb the minimal additional duties this proposal will require within current funding levels and will reflect no fiscal impact for this agency.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other nursing homes were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.
