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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DOLIR)** assume the proposal creates a hearing process which the Labor and Industrial Relations Commission (LIRC) would need to conduct. Assuming the removal of administrative law judges would be exceedingly rare, there is no immediate fiscal impact to the Department. The workload involved in conducting the hearing would be absorbable by the LIRC.

Oversight notes that DOLIR assumes the removal of administrative law judge would be rare and have no immediate impact to the DOLIR. Additionally, DOLIR assume the hearing costs would be absorbable. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.
