FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Agriculture (MDA)** assume 1 FTE Consumer Protection Specialist (at \$45,330) will be required to license currently exempt dealers. MDA estimates the number of inspections to increase by at least 160. In addition, \$60,000 will be needed to cover the costs of the additional inspections.

Oversight does not have information to the contrary and therefore, Oversight will reflect the estimates as provided by MDA.

Officials from the Missouri Highway Patrol, Office of the State Public Defender, Missouri Office of Prosecution Services and Office of the State Courts Administrator each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Officials from the **City of Kansas City** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Oversight only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local political subdivisions were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

Small animal dealers and pet shops could be impacted as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The bill prohibits a dealer or pet shop from purchasing animals from any entity who is not licensed to sell and handle animals, or has multiple or repeat critical violations of state or federal law within the last three years. A pet shop must disclose to the purchaser of a dog the breeder's and dealer's name and address. Any pet shop that knowingly violates the requirements is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.

The bill also prohibits a political subdivision from adopting or enforcing a regulation that prohibits the operation of a pet shop that is licensed in this state.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
