FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Sections 380.621 - Insurance company reinsurance coverage and standards

Officials from the **Department of Commerce and Insurance (DCI)** assumes the costs of this bill can be absorbed within their current appropriations. However, should the cost be more than anticipated, the department would request an increase to our FTE and/or appropriations as appropriate through the budget process.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume this proposal exempts Missouri mutual insurance companies from rules and regulations other than those in Section 380.621. Currently insurance companies are required to pay premium tax under Chapter 148. This proposal appears to exempt these companies from the premium tax. Each year DCI calculates the amount of premium tax owed by the companies. DOR defers to DCI for the estimate of the loss to state revenue.

Oversight assumes the house committee substitute’s version of section 380.621 changes this provision and will not eliminate premium tax collection as mentioned in previous fiscal notes.

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning** defer to the Department of Commerce and Insurance for the potential fiscal impact of this proposal.

A direct fiscal impact to mutual insurance companies could be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal establishes standards in regards to insurance company reinsurance coverage and company examination standards.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
