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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume this legislation would create an Educational Technology Impact Advisory Council as outlined in Section 186.095 to include up to twenty-five members. This council would review areas related to the use and impact of technology in instruction. The items below are beyond the skill set, knowledge, and expertise of the potential members and would require the use of consultants and surveys of students, parents, teachers, and other school personnel:

- 1. Section 186.095.3(1)(e) inclusion of artificial intelligence,
- 2. Section 186.095.3(1)(g) dehumanization of education and distortion of relationship between teachers and students,
- 3. Section 186.095.3(1)(h) isolation of students in a digital/virtual world that distances students from any form of social interaction, and

DESE estimates the use of three unique consultants with expertise in the above areas to address these issues at a cost of \$50,000 each (\$150,000 total) to cover consultant time, research, travel, presentation, and reporting. DESE estimates the need to complete a survey of parents, students, teachers, and other school personnel for each area at a cost of \$15,000 each (\$45,000 total).

DESE requires one director at \$74,808 and related E&E of \$17,695 to organize meetings, track progress, coordinate activities, prepare consultant contracts, handle additional communication with council members, prepare meeting documentation, respond to council member inquiries/requests, prepare council's report to the state board of education, Senate, and House, etc. The council is required to meet four times per year, however, DESE estimates the significant scope of the council will necessitate between four and six meetings per year at a cost of \$85,103. Section 186.095.3(3) requires updates at least every two years making the above cost an ongoing cost.

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Oversight notes the proposal states the council shall meet at least four times per year for a minimum of one hundred twenty minutes per meeting without cancellations to review best practices in the use of technology in instruction and related policy provisions. DESE assumes the council will necessitate between four and six meetings. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a cost that could be less than (council does not meet six times) the estimate provided by DESE (\$85,103 for 6 meetings) in in the fiscal note.

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Oversight is uncertain if DESE has included the full impact in the estimated response for consultants. Upon further inquiry in the previous version, DESE was unable to provide the source of data (google search) for the cost of consultants and related expenses. For purposes of this fiscal note, Oversight will reflect DESE's assumption as more or less. The consultants' expense varies depending on area of expertise and agency used. However, should this assumption be incorrect, this would change the impact presented in this fiscal note.
